I. Meetings:

1. Do I need to attend Thursday meetings?

It is strongly suggested members attend club meetings regularly, as this is the best way to know about the happenings at your club. Given we are a new club, it is also the primary way you will know your fellow members.

However, attendance is no longer a compulsory prerequisite to membership at Rotary. Attending meetings is an opportunity, not an obligation.

2. Will we continue to meet virtually?

We remain watchful of government regulations as to assembly, and the COVID situation. At the moment we expect to continue weekly meetings of our 115-member strong club virtually.

However, something exciting is brewing with respect to smaller groups meeting for Fireside Meetings and Weekly Fellowships, which members could choose to attend per their comfort levels. Stay tuned!

3. In case I miss a zoom meeting, is there a recording of the same?

Yes, all zoom meetings are recorded and are available for the benefit of members. Contact your President Rajiv or write to admin@rotarymumbaisobo.org to access these.

4. I have some Speaker suggestions / interesting ideas for activities at the meetings. How do I take it forward?

Please do come forward, we welcome all your suggestions! The coordination of Speakers and club activities all fall under the large umbrella of Club Services. 5. Can my spouse be part of Rotary events and meetings regularly?

Family participation is valued at Rotary. Your spouse is most welcome to attend speaker meets, fellowship sessions and volunteer for projects. However, Club Assemblies (these will be clearly identified as such) are restricted to members only.



We do hope in time your partner may wish to come on board as an Active Member, and we have attractive Couple Memberships many have chosen to convert to.

6. Can my children be part of Rotary events and meetings regularly?

Age-appropriate fellowship activities and volunteering are open to children of members (fondly referred to as Annets).

In addition, they may participate in projects of the Youth Service Avenues; including setting up or strengthening Interact and Rotaract Clubs (these can be community based or school based). Annets have chosen to take up fundraising activities as well.

Do contact our Youth Services Director Mahera or Chairperson Sindhu to know more ways in which your children can engage with Rotary. Contact details appended at the end of this file.

7. It is challenging for me to attend meetings. How can I contribute to Rotary with scarcity of time?

Participate in projects or events that give you joy and a sense of belonging, ideate and brainstorm with like minded members, help in fundraisers or connect us to your network for the same. Whenever you have the calling, pitch in wholeheartedly.

II. About Rotary:

1. What is the object of Rotary?

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

2. What are the 'Avenues of Service'?



Rotarians channel commitment to service at home and abroad through five Avenues of Service, which are the foundation of activity.

- <u>Club Service</u> focuses on making clubs strong. A thriving club is anchored by strong relationships, bonding and an active membership development plan.
- <u>Vocational Service</u> calls on every Rotarian to work with integrity and contribute their expertise to the problems and needs of society.
- <u>Community Service</u> encourages every Rotarian to find ways to improve the quality of life for people in their communities and to serve the public interest. This is divided in 2 avenues, Medical and Non-medical.
- International Service exemplifies our global reach in promoting peace and understanding. We support this service avenue by sponsoring or volunteering on international projects, seeking partners abroad, and more.
- Youth Service (New Generations) recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professionals through leadership development programs such as <u>Rotaract</u>, <u>Interact</u>, <u>Rotary Youth</u> <u>Leadership Awards</u>, and <u>Rotary Youth Exchange</u>.

- Peace prevention and conflict resolution
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development

III. Engaging with Fellow Members:

1. How do I get to know my fellow club members better?

Get the most out of your membership by participating in club projects and activities. Attending meetings of the club and volunteering for the projects are the best way to know your fellow members and bond with them. You can also:

- Serve on a club committee where you can use your skills.
- Identify a need in your community and suggest a hands-on project to address it in collaboration with fellow members.



- Work with a youth service program sponsored by your club, such as Rotaract or Interact.
- Go to the My Rotary section on the RI website here www.rotary.org and create an ID, to get the full benefits of your membership.

2. Is there a list of members?

But don't restrict yourself to our club members only! Rotary is an International organization with presence in over 200 countries. You can connect with members across the globe. The Rotary International website www.rotary.org is a phenomenal resource to check out.

3. How do I know what the existing Fellowship (interest-based) groups are?

4. How do I start a Fellowship (interest-based) group?

A fellowship group could be hinged around any activity you enjoy, or are passionate about, and would want to take up with your fellow Rotarians. The sky and your imagination is the limit.

Contact the Club Services Director or Co-Director to get this started (contact details appended at the end of this file).

IV. Club Projects:

1. How do I find out what the ongoing club projects are?

Our club has a variety of projects across various Avenues in the ideation, planning, and execution stages.

If you are looking at knowing more about the projects a specific Avenue is involved with, the Avenue Director or Chairperson would be best equipped to give you a snapshot (names and contact details at the end of this file). For an



overview across Avenues, your President Rajiv or Secretary Niharika could bring you up to speed.

2. What are Thrust area projects?

Thrust areas are specific areas where Rotary District 3141 - to which our club belongs - has decided to expend resources and energy to make a tangible impact.

These change year-on-year and are set by the team led by the District Governor for the respective year. Each thrust area is typically supported by contact persons with deep knowledge of the area, and well-planned projects clubs can take on and make their own and execute singly or jointly.

3. I want to volunteer for an existing project, how do I begin?

Keep an eye out for volunteer lists circulated on the club WhatsApp groups, as we try to ensure all members have an equal opportunity to volunteer.

If interested in taking on a direct role in a specific project, connect with the Avenue Director, Chairperson (names and contact details at the end of this file), President Rajiv or Secretary Niharika we will be more than happy to bring you on board.

4. Who do I contact for donating funds?

In case you are keen to donate to a particular project, or are responding to a request for funds, contact your Treasurer Sheetal. If making a transfer directly, do send Sheetal a screenshot mentioning the project the funds are intended for.

If you do not have a particular project in mind, or want to donate in kind, contact your President Rajiv or Secretary Niharika who could suggest projects that would benefit from your contribution.

5. How do I initiate and propose a project?

If you're part of any 'Avenue of Service' teams of our club, headed by a separate Director and Chairperson, you may first want to discuss your project idea with your fellow Rotarians within this separate avenue of service. If you haven't joined any such avenue of service yet, no problem! Everyone who likes to undertake a project would need to submit a project proposal form, a standard form which you will find appended to this document. It will ask you to share important information about:

- who will lead the project and possible team members;
- the project itself, including a community assessment, the expected project impact and the sustainability of the project;
- the project costs; and
- how one proposes to raise the funds.

These questions will help you in thinking the project through beyond the mere idea stage. Should you require help, do reach out to fellow Rotarians or Avenue Service directors! At the end of the day, no great idea should get lost!

Next, the Board of Directors (BOD), which as on date consists of 14 directors, including the various service avenue directors, will discuss all the project proposals received during the BOD meeting (held every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month). Within a few days after the BOD meeting, the Secretary or Joint Secretary will inform you on the decision of the BOD, any possible feedback, etc.

Once approved, the project can take off! Of course, keep in mind that every project also requires diligent follow-up, project reporting, sufficient visuals to support the activities undertaken as part of the project reporting, which needs to be uploaded on our Rotary District software, and a close coordination with the Treasurer of our club as well. This is an absolute must to ensure transparency and accountability of the project undertaken. A project report format will be shared with you once your project has been approved.

V. Club Officers, Board of Directors (BoD) and General communication:

1. Who are the Club Officers and the members of the Board of Directors?

List of Club Officers and members of the Board of Directors is appended at the end of this document.

2. How do I become part of the BoD?

Show involvement and leadership qualities, earmark time per day or week that could be utilised for the good of society through Rotary and nominate yourself. The Election process and form will be shared closer to the end of the year.

3. I want to speak to someone regarding a specific query, who do I call?

The list of Club Officers, Directors and Chairpersons with contact details is appended at the end of this file.



If unsure of who to direct your question to, or have a query not fitting clearly into roles of Club Officers, Avenue Directors and Chairpersons, contact your club President Rajiv or Secretary Niharika. We are most happy to hear from you!
