I think we were less than 30 members at the time and that too half of them were couple members and the remaining half were absconding members. So I fully understand when the president has to sit in the meeting and wait for members to arrive, at other times call and find out or even encourage members to come to the meeting to save face in front of a guest speaker.

And then I became the president only to realize that now it was my turn to worry about membership. I remember once I was asked to speak on this Quantity V/s Quality debate and being a small club I was trying to rationalize how small is intimate, small is family, small is focused and other such stories to tell my mind that a small club was a healthy club.

But as a president I knew, small meant low attendance, low funds, extreme dependence, low interest in projects so smaller projects, low clout in district because of low TRF and low Membership...so small also meant insignificant and I didn't like being insignificant.

But I also came to learn about the perils of being too big. You had to face groupies and politics. It seems members didn't even know each other well and so didn't care for each other (This is hearsay since I had never been part of a big club) intimacy was lost, all and sundry became the members in this growth orientation.

And then I heard one of the Rotary leaders talk about why does the quality have to suffer at the cost of quantity? Why couldn't we have more members that brought better quality? Why are we afraid to expand? Why not have a wide variety and representation from all vocations? Why not have, a wider age spread, gender equal growth? And then I realized that it was never really a question of quality Vs Quantity instead it really was an issue of exclusivity yet having inclusivity. It was about being open to have cosmopolitan membership and about bringing together a larger group of like minded people. It is about delegation and decentralization yet unification of various efforts under the Rotary Banner.

It was about learning to grow as people by learning to grow as community both in values and in numbers. What an insight! Music - Scientifically Delivering Eternal Joy



"A thing of beauty is a joy for ever" said the famous poet John Keates in his poem Endymion published in 1818. All humans endeavour to have a happy and joyous life. In Rotary, we believe in the Joy of Giving and Joy of Service. But there are many other ways we seek joy in our lives. And there are some universal recipes for joy – for most of us, one thing that always brings joy is Music. The kind of music we all like may differ but it is a rare human who doesn't like any music. Music can be Indian or Western, Country or Folk, Classical or Film, fast or slow, and yet it is universal in nature. A thing of beauty that gives us joy and binds the humanity that very few other things do.

Music across the world evolved from humans observing nature and imitating sounds from nature to begin with. Today, sometimes, music is synthetic and at times seems like cacophony but just like the beauty of music and the joy it gives is timeless, so is the theory of music. And the reason is music is as much science and mathematics, as it is art. And if you don't already know, Indians from centuries ago were masters of this science and mathematics. There is mathematics in the swar / sur and there is mathematics in the beats. Most know that beats are mathematical constructs but the swars are too! Swars are specific frequencies of sound and each swar is separated from the next of previous by a mathematically defined interval! While we usually know of the seven (7) swars or notes, Indian classical music recognises and practices a total of 22 Shrutis. Shruti is the smallest gradation of pitch recognisable by human ear. And can you believe it, these shrutis were noted in ancient and medieval Sanskrit texts like Natya Shastra and Sangeet Ratnakara! What's more, Chandayoga Upanishad describes dividing the Octave into 22 Shrutis. Imagine, this was done long before scientific instruments to detect and replicate minute variations of sound were available. This is a mere glimpse into the science of music, there's a lot more for those eager to learn.

The month of August, has seen two great music maestros, born in Maharashtra. We in India and especially in Maharashtra should be proud of them and their timeless contributions to Music as we experience and learn today.

First is Vishnu Narayan Bhatkhande (10-Aug-1860 to 19-Sep-1936). Mr Bhatkhande was the first person to write a modern treatise on Indian music, which was largely oral tradition till then! He created the system of notations that is used as a standard system of "writing" Indian music even today – Bhatkhande Paddhat. This was a painstakingly detailed work that involved not only an understanding of music but also the ability to codify it and standardise it, whereby it could be accepted as the standard for notation. He also composed several bandishes himself to explain the grammar of music!

Second is incidentally also another Vishnu! Vishnu Digambar Paluskar (18-Aug-1872 to 21-Aug-1931). The famous Bhajan "Raghupati Raghav Rajaram" was first sung by him. And followed by many and still continues to captivate Indian psyche. But his major contribution is establishment of the Gandharva Mahavidyala – the music university that grants degrees like Visharad to our music students! Incidentally, Mr Paluskar is also the arranger of music for India's National Anthem – Jana Gana Man! It only apt that as we enter the month of August in a new Rotary year presided by a Visharad President Ms. Neelam Kelkar, we start the year talking about music and look forward to eternal joy!



Projects completed in July 2021 Annadaan
