


Rtn Bela Verma introduced the speaker and captured the interest of the audience.

### RTN PP PRAMILLA CHHABRA SPEAKS ON SUFISM AT OUR CLUB MEETING HELD ON 13 SEPTEMBER 2022

The Club held its Regular Meeting on 13 September 2022 at the Friends Club, New Delhi.

The President, Rtn Vandana Bhalla, called the 369<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Rotary Club of Indraprastha-Okhla to Order at 7-30 PM on Tuesday 13 Sep 2022 at the Friends Club.

The National Anthem was sung lead by Rtn Rajni Bagla. Rtn PP Harjit Singh read out the Four Way Test.

The President welcomed the Guest Speaker Team of our own Members, Rtn PP Pramilla Chhabra and Rtn PP Kanav Gupta. The President welcomed the Guests – Ms Kiran & Mr Jagdeep Chokia,

Ms Tripta & Mr Anil Garg and Ms Richa Sahay.

The President mentioned that since the two Guest Speakers had made a specific request not to be introduced formally as they are well known to members, she would not be doing so. However, on the request of new Members a brief introduction was given for both particularly their Rotary experience and background. The President stated that the Duo would make their joint presentation on **Sufism**.

The Guest Speaker, Rtn PP Pramilla Chhabra explained how Sufism started. She narrated the story of how in the 9<sup>th</sup> Century a young girl, Badr-al-Nasibi, ran through the streets of Basra in Iraq with a flaming torch in one hand and a bowl of water in the other hand. She explained that water was to extinguish the fires of hell forever, so no one worships God. The torch is to set fire to paradise so that none could worship God for greed. The first Sufis were these that roamed round the world during the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11 Century preaching Sufism, which can best be



described as a gentle form of Islam. It is worthy of note that there was complete equality of sexes.

Sufism is the intangible, esoteric, exoteric, the metaphysical nature of religion. There is a mass of literature on Sufism in Arabic which has been well translated into English and other languages.

In undivided Punjab, India, Sufism had taken deep root. Even today some of our Punjabi phrases, used regularly, have a touch of Sufi in them.



Some famous Sufi saints of India, particularly in undivided Punjab, were:

- Khawja Moin-ud-Din Chisti He settled in Ajmer.
- Baba Farid-ud-Din Ganj-i-Shakar His tomb is located at Faridkot.
- Nizam-ud-Din Aulia His tomb is located in Delhi

Friends would be well advised to read some of this literature to enlighten themselves on this very beautiful offshoot of a rigid religion.

After the talk by the Guest Speaker, we had a beautiful rendering of some Sufi numbers by our own Rtn PP Kanav Gupta. These were thoroughly enjoyed by all those present.

Birthday Greetings were conveyed to Rtn PP Kanav Gupta (20 Sep).


Vote of Thanks was proposed by Rtn PP Commodore Pami Bawa.

### MR MURAD ALI BAIG SPEAKS AT CLUB MEETING HELD ON 27 SEPTEMBER 2022

The President, Rtn Vandana Bhalla, called the 370<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Rotary Club of Indraprastha-Okhla to order at 8 PM on Tuesday 27 Sep 2022 and welcomed all the Members present.

The National Anthem was sung by the Members lead by Rtn Rajni Bagla. Rtn Surila Bandula read out the 4 Way Test.

The President then welcomed the Guest Speaker, Mr Murad Ali Baig, and Ms Jagriti. Mr Baig had very kindly agreed to talk about the lesser known aspects of what he called the **Epic Battle for the Soul of India between Dara Shikoh and Aurangzeb** during the Mughal rule in India during the 17<sup>th</sup> Century, about which he had written in his book – Ocean of Cobras. The President also welcomed guest Mr Keerti Prasad.

The Guest Speaker was formally introduced by Rtn Dr Neeraj Bhalla.

Mr Murad Ali Baig, the Guest Speaker, in his own inimitable style narrated anecdotes from the period to indicate the intense rivalry that existed between the siblings. At the very outset he explained that the rivalry was created by their father Emperor Shah Jehan and was further fanned by him during his lifetime which almost lead Aurangzeb to hate his father and eventually even imprison him in the Agra Fort.



Mr Baig very briefly narrated stories to indicate reckless courage, ruthless cunning, tender romance, treacherous betrayal and heart wrenching tragedy

in a world of incredible luxury and decadence which was once the richest empire in the world.

One such story is of contemporary interest. Even though the seat of power of the Mughul Emperors was in Delhi of Agra they travelled regularly throughout their empire covering a distance of about 8 kos a day before setting up camp. During one such visit they camped at Benaras. Once there the Hindu Officers requested the Emperor to allow them a day extra at Benaras to have a bath in the Ganges. The Emperor granted them this wish. On the second day when they returned to the base camp, they discovered that one of the guests of the Emperor – the Maharani of Kutch – was missing. They searched the entire town and finally discovered her in the basement of the Kashi Vishwanath Temple completely ravished and in a bad state. When brought before the Emperor she was in tears and complained that this temple was not a House of GOD but a place which needs to be destroyed. Based on her testimony the Emperor ordered the destruction of the entire temple. The point that Mr Baig made was that this and many other structures were demolished by the Moghuls not for any religious reasons but as punishments for any misdeed.



After a very interesting talk the Vote of Thanks was proposed by Rtn Subodh Raheja. A memento was presented to the Guest Speaker by Rtn Surila Bandula, on behalf of the Club.

## 'Time is crucial for surviving cardiac arrest'

udden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is an abrupt loss of heart function in a person who may or may not have been diagnosed with heart disease. It nappens suddenly and usually without any warning," says Dr Neeraj Bhalla, adding, "It is triggered by an electrical malfunction in the heart that causes an arrhythmia (irregular heartbeat)."

The doctor explains, "In sudden cardiac arrest, the heart typically races away in a confused, disorganised manner. Circulation halts and blood doesn't reach the lungs or brain. People abruptly pass out, don't respond, stop breathing and have no pulse."

The doctor warns, "Following a cardiac arrest, each minute without treatment decreases the likelihood of survival without disability. Without treatment within 10 minutes, the survival rate is close to zero. However, with timely medical intervention, the patient can be saved."

Listingt the factors that increase the risk for SCA, the doctor says, "Rhythm problems can often be traced to a scarred heart muscle. Scarring causes the heart's

electrical signals to become confused and fragmented. The most common causes are coronary artery disease and cardiomyopathy. Heart attacks starve the heart muscle, causing tissue death and scarring. Viral infections, hereditary or autoimmune conditions and chemical toxicity can also damage and scar the heart muscle."

He adds, "For patients with a low ejection fraction, putting an implantable cardiac defibrillator (ICD) will rescue the patient from rapid and irregular heart rhythm episodes and thus extend the life and allow the person to return to normal living. It has been observed that ICDs increase survival from sudden cardiac arrest because they respond within seconds."
