

MINUTES OF THE 2064<sup>TH</sup> CLUB MEETING OF RC CALCUTTA JADAVPUR HELD AT CRC, WEDNESDAY,  $17^{TH}$  NOVEMBER 2021 AT 7:00 PM

Past President Rtn. (Dr.) Aditi Nag Chaudhuri called the 2064<sup>th</sup> meeting of RC Calcutta Jadavpur to order.

The National Anthem was led by Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta.

PP Rtn. (Dr.) Aditi Nag Chaudhuri welcomed guest Rtn. Raj Roy from Addiscombe & Shirley Rotary Club, Croydon, England.

Then PP Rtn. (Dr) Aditi Nag Chaudhuri announced:

- That the Bijoya Sammilani and Diwali Meet of District was held on 12th November at Eastern Metropolitan Club. Eight members from club were present. Various cultural programs were arranged followed by sumptuous dinner. Rtn. (Dr.) Mainak Sengupta received his RLI certificate at the felicitation ceremony.
- That Children's Day was celebrated through three projects during 13th, 14th and 15th November.

Detailed description was given by PP Partha S. Sarkar and Anirban Sarkar. On 13th November, our club participated at Children's Day event organised by Tata Medical Center with Rotaract Club of Sonar Gaon. Food packets, jointly sponsored by our club and Rotaract District 3291 were distributed among 70 beneficiaries. PP Rtn. Samirendu Dutt, PP Rtn. Partha Pratim Roy, PP Rtn. Partha Sakar, Rtn. Sikha Mukherji, and Rtn. Anirban Sarkar were present in the program.

On 14th November, an excellent program was arranged by Rotaract Club of Jadavpur Greens at Loreto Rainbow Homes. They performed for 120 orphan children there. Children also performed well and everyone enjoyed the program. Rotaractors gifted clothes and chocolates to the children. It was followed by lunch with rice, mutton curry and rosogolla (to observe Rosogolla Day).Rtn. Sikha Mukherji gifted a Vacuum Cleaner to the Home. PP Rtn. (Dr.) Aditi, Rtn.

Sikha Mukherji, Rtn. Anirban Sarkar and Rtn. Koyeli Dutt were present from the club.

On 15th November, another event was organised at SGCCRI with 10 children and their families. Rotractors from MSIT and Central Calcutta performed and entertained the audience. The children presented a self drawn card for the members of the club. PP Rtn. Partha Sarkar and Rtn. (Dr.) Mainak Sengupta were present there from the club.

 PP Partha Sarkar told that our club would be be the lead host for the WORLD CANCER DAY event scheduled on 12th February 2022. This time, the event would be an offline one under permissible situation. All members were requested to take the initiative to make the program successful. This event would be a Rotary District 3291 programme.

Our dream project on Paediatric Cancer Wellness program would be now in association with Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar. They had agreed to provide space for the center. It was informed that the project report was readying to be discussed in the upcoming board meeting.

Dr. Nag Chaudhuri announced that a Project Positive Health was initiated by AG Zone 20 Rtn. Rina Sinha Roy. There would be two projects on KNOW YOUR NUMBERS on 1st December and 11th December, the first one at POLICE TRAINNING SCHOOL and second one at KIDDERPORE POLICE STATION in collaboration with Peerless Hospital. Rtn. Siddhartha Chakraborty and PP Rtn. Sougata Majumder from Rotary Club of Behala were coordinating with Peerless Hospital, and Rtn. Mukherjee from Rotary Club Tollygunge was coordinating with the police. Approximate liability of each club would be Rs. 2000 to start with. Rotary Club of Behala, Tollygunge, and Belvedere Gardens Kolkata and our club had given their consent. House agreed to be a part of this project. Two members of each club would have to be present on both the days at any point of time. PP Rtn. Jaydeb Banerjee requested PP (Dr.) Aditi to consider whether event planned for 11<sup>th</sup> December could be shifted to 12<sup>th</sup> since 12<sup>th</sup> would be a ROTARY DAY OF SERVICE for District 3291.

- Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta informed that Rainbow Home, Baanshdroni requested for a camp for free Eye check up, Dental check up, General medical check-up and Thalassemia check up, if possible, for 100 of its residents between age of 6 –18. Similar service was also sought by Rainbow Homes of Loreto Bowbazar
- PP Aditi also announces that Secretary Rtn. Pausali Paul would visit Shantiniketan to distribute nutritious food packets (a pack of 500 grams of Soybean each) to the underprivileged women of neighbourhood. She would also make a start of the free coaching class for the children of Classes 1 -10.
- Jadavpur and Jadavpur Greens would visit Sandeshkali, Sundeabans for a free eye testing and distribution of free spectacles camp under ROTAVISION program of District 3291 in collaboration with the manufacturing unit of GKB Opticals- VISION RX LAB. Near about 300 beneficiaries were expected to attend the program. District Chair Rtn. AsitTalukdar was contacted and he confirmed the program.
- That RCCJ programmes were published in the last published GML.
