## MINUTES OF THE 2057th CLUB MEETING OF RC CALCUTTA JADAVPUR HELD ONLINE, WEDNESDAY, 28th JULY 2021 AT 7 PM

- Past President Rtn. (Dr) Aditi Nag Chaudhuri called the 2057<sup>th</sup> meeting of RC Calcutta Jadavpur to order and mentioned that the regular club meeting will be followed by Club Officers' Training Seminar (COTs).
- > The National Anthem was led by Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta.
- PP (Dr.) Aditi conducted COTs starting at 6:00 pm.
  - District representatives, senior club officers and new club officers were present to have ideas to plan for upcoming Rotary year and their potential roles to execute the responsibilities appropriately. Senior Officials and Past Presidents led the discussion to enlighten the new club officers about Rotary Learning Centre, attendance, public image, new plans and thrust areas of the district, emphasis on recruitment of new members, retention of existing members and the value and importance of contribution to TRF.
  - In the context of discussion on service projects, PP (Dr.) Chitra Mandal mentioned that she is preparing a few projects for submission to National Academy of Science, India (NASI) for funding under the Prime Minister's Atmonirvar scheme. The projects would be strengthened by inclusion of information and data gathered by the club in recent awareness programs on cancer.

- On successful completion of COTs, PP (Dr) Aditi conducted the regular club meeting at 7:00 pm and announced:
  - That Cervical Cancer Awareness and Pediatric Cancer Awareness programs were held successfully on 25<sup>th</sup>July at Sirisinni Village, Amdanga Block, 24 Parganas. Fifty six women participated.
  - Members of MPATHY (an NGO) checked height, weight, blood pressure and blood sugar of the participants of the program. Rtn. Paromita Das Dutta talked about easy and nutritious dietary plan and Dr. Aditi spoke about awareness on Cervical cancer and symptoms of pediatric cancer which should be attended to without delay. The ladies and the children were given food packets. During discussion, Rtn. Paromita suggested that she would make a presentation on the basis of the data received from the medical check-up. Dr. Aditi said that those data would be filled in KNOW YOUR NUMBER.
  - That a special online meeting was held on 21st July. Fifty saplings were donated to the school in Belpahari, Jhargram through Sri Patranga Basu and it was arranged by Rtn. Dr. Krishnendu Das. Sri Basu was present in the online meeting and narrated about the need of a pre-primary teacher and an escort who would bring the children from home and take them back from school. Dr. Aditi told him to inform the club about the cost required for the need. Members of a Social enterprise named SCRATCH, were present in the meeting and discussed about their work plan and how they wanted to be a part of this project.
  - That a lecture would be delivered by Rtn. Prof. Indrajit Ray on 11<sup>th</sup>August regarding possibilities of economic development in the cyclone hit areas of South 24 Parganas. The webinar would be held on the club's ZOOM platform.
  - That a program would be undertaken on Self Defence for the women under the project of Women Empowerment. The Officer-in-Charge of Barrackpore Women Police Station, Smt. Anasuya Chakraborty, would make a presentation on Government's Tejoswini and Sukanya schemes. This program is planned to be held in physical mode based on permissible condition under the current pandemic situation.
  - Rtn. Dr. Chitra Mandal suggested publishing a booklet containing the contact details of club members and share it with all the members of RCCJ for use on any emergency situation. She mentioned this was done before when Dr. Chhabinath Mandal was the Club President
- Secretary, Rtn. Pausali Paul conducted the club business. She announced and greeted Sougata Guin (H/O Rtn. Joyeta Ghosh) for his birthday on 29th July, Rtn. Bhaskar Chanda for his birthday on 2nd August, Rtn. Madhumita Mitra for her birthday on 4th August, Hemendra Lakhani (H/O Rtn. Krishna Lakhani) for his birthday on 8th August. She also wished Hony. Awareness Programme on Paediatric Cancer, Cervical Cancer and Menstrual Hygiene

Following the path paved by Past President Dr. Aditi Nag Chaudhuri, to start holding Awareness programmes on Paediatric Cancer, Cervical Cancer and Menstrual Hygiene once at least every month, we reached Sirasinni village, Amdanga Block, 24 Pgs(N) about 50 kms from Kolkata on 25.07.21 to conduct the first of such camps. PP Dr. Aditi Nag Chaudhuri, Rtn. Shikha di, Rtn. Joyeta and myself attended the event. 57 village women were screened. Their Height, Weight, BMI, Blood pressure and Blood sugar was tested. NGO Mpathy helped in this endeavor. Past President Aditi di and myself briefed the gathering about symptoms of Cervical and Pediatric Cancer and importance af early detection. I also addressed the gathering regarding healthy food habits, cheap sources of locally available protein and physical exercise and counseled all the ladies individually about their health problems. Protein supplement pouches and food packets were distributed to all ladies and children present. This health camp was welcomed by the villagers.

We promised to hold a Cervical Cancer Screening Camp for them in future. Holding such camps regularly in certain designated areas will help inculcate healthy habits in the local population and also help in the early detection of health problems, which will eventually bring down health care costs. I shall prepare a detailed report on the data collected at the camp and present in the club so that the way forward may be decided. It was a wonderful occasion in tune with the 'SERVICE BEYOND SELF' motto of Rotary. I thank RCCJ for giving me the opportunity to serve. Looking forward to many more.....

We went to a tribal area in Patharpratima in Kakdwip subdivision of South 24 Parganas, where not much of relief reached at the time. We went to support with community kitchen and distribution of essential food items for some temporary relief, where mostly people were affected due to flood and damage of their daily livelihoods. We assisted them with the raw food items for few days of meals to be served to approximately 400-500 people that locality. in

2nd location we went to a remote island, Rangabelia in the Gosaba Block in South 24 Parganas, where situation is more worse interns of damage caused by Yaas ... even basic rice and cereals were a challenge ... live stocks too were out of reach due to cut off from main land .. our support was just a drop in the ocean ... still with the relief materials like food grains and daily essentials we could assist with running of community kitchen for few days meals for about 500 people on that area With heavy heart for not being able to help hundreds of starve stomachs to be filled, we returned to our comfort zone


