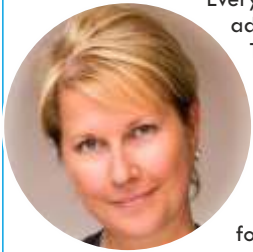

Presidential Message July 2022



Every month since I joined Rotary, I've looked forward to reading this magazine, especially the opening essay from our Rotary president. I'll admit that as much as I appreciate a digital copy, I still revel in the tactile sensation of sitting down and leafing through the glossy pages. They are a treasure trove of photos and memorable stories about our great organization — the one we all know and love. I have learned so much over the years about service projects and lives that each of you have transformed.

As a communications professional, I have longed for the day that our stories were a regular part of mainstream media and that our flagship magazine might populate doctor's offices, coffee shops, or anywhere else people sit, wait, and browse. It's great that Rotary members are better informed about all we do, and wouldn't it be that much better if more people knew our stories.

All this was top of mind as I thought about our plans for promoting Rotary worldwide in the upcoming year. Over the next 12 months, we are going to shine a light on projects that put Rotary service on display to the world, and we are going to do it strategically. Nick and I will focus on some of the highest impact, sustainable, and scalable Rotary projects from our areas of focus in what we call the Imagine Impact Tour.

We are inviting top-tier journalists, thought leaders, and influencers to use their channels to help us raise awareness by reaching people who want to serve but have not yet realized they can do it through Rotar. But there was another important issue to consider — our carbon footprint. I take seriously Rotary's emerging leadership position on environmental issues. The example set by our members during the pandemic is fundamental to how we carve out our future. That means we will harness digital technology to tell these stories — we will be tweeting, posting, and “going live” to anyone who will listen. We must consider our environment, and part of that means not always traveling but continuing to connect in meaningful ways as we have for the past two years.

Of course, we are social people, and we still need to be together. We simply need to be more mindful of our decisions and think about how we get together just a little bit differently. For example, if we travel to visit a project, we will plan successive visits in neighboring areas.

So, what are your stories and who can help tell them? I hope you might consider your own Imagine Impact efforts — your story might be something you can promote just as easily on social media or during a Zoom call. Think about ways to showcase notable projects in your clubs and districts.

We all feel the impact that Rotary service and values have on us. Now it's our opportunity to share that feeling with others.

Imm. PRIP Shekhar Mehta Farewell Message



Hello everyone. I hope you have enjoyed the 2022 Rotary International Convention. Wasn't it just great to meet, touch and hug old friends and to make new ones? We heard great speakers and we will go back home recharged, re-energised and re-focused to Serve to Change Lives. The convention in-person is a dream come true for me.

So today as I speak to most of you for the last time as the President of this great organization, let me share some of my dreams.

I have a dream of very soon seeing this great organization always mentioned among the top 10 service organisations from all across the world.

We know how great Rotary is and we are all so proud of it and for good reasons. We have a 117 years history, with a footprint in more countries than even the United Nations. And we have taken on a major task as our top corporate program, eradicating a disease, when only once in the history of mankind has a virus been wiped out. Yet despite all of our great strengths and accomplishments, when you Google the world's top service organizations, Rotary does not rise to the top. Neither do we lead when judged by membership, program outlay or impact.

With its outstanding experience in Public Health, Rotary should be regularly invited to the top development sector fora. We should be consulted by WHO, invited by UN for advice, be invited to be speakers at World Economic Forum etc. We should be in a position to advise and work with Govts of countries. My dream is to see Rotary in the top ten list of service organisations. To do this, we must evaluate our organization completely. Today, the only measure we have of our revenues, outlay, input in what is done through The Rotary Foundation.

But that is only part of a big story. India for example is the biggest recipient of grants in Rotary, to the value of \$ 20 million. But is that the full value of work done by Rotarians in India? No, not at all. The value is at least 10 times that. But because most of it happens at the club level, it is never fully accounted for.

We need to know how many hospitals and schools we have built and managed, how many heart surgeries we funded, how many people attained healthcare services because of us, how many borewells we have sunk or how much we spent on projects during covid. We have neither the numbers nor the value. The result is we do not know exactly the true value of the organization. Because of lack of data, we are underselling the true reach and impact of our organization.

My dream is for Rotary's true value -- which is in billion not millions -- be known to all. Each time a club does a project, it should get accounted for -- the value of the work, the man hours spent, everything that went into these projects. That is how we will fully measure Rotary's impact.

And I have another dream of Rotary's future -- that we adopt a federal structure, where there is a Rotary Australia, Rotary Africa, Rotary Korea -- all of them having their own ethos, culture, practices, governance etc but all owing allegiance to Rotary International. One size does not fit all -- Rotary in Japan is different from Rotary in America which is not the same as in Germany. There should be greater regionalization of Rotary. This will appeal more to locals and attract more membership.

My dream for Rotary also includes membership -- that we increase our membership by at least net 2% each year. If each of us takes up the responsibility of Each One Bring One, this is absolutely possible. Each one, Bring one should become the philosophy and not just a slogan of the organization. The impact will be far reaching.

Of course DEI will be all pervasive. Diversity is one of our non negotiable core values.

Grow More will help us Do More. Our contributions to the Foundation will grow and we will be able to do more programs of scale -- where the value is in millions of dollars and the impact is to millions of people. When this happens, we will have worthy projects for Corporations and Governments to invest and partner with Rotary. Corporations are becoming more socially responsible and Rotary can be their implementation partner. When the programs are large, we will need to work with governments, as we did in Polio eradication and in fact play a role in the nation building process.

With Polio we have proved that we are capable of doing just that; when we kept eradicating polio from country to country. Today the world knows Rotary best for Polio but soon enough we will also be known in Zambia for Malaria eradication, in Haiti for our water projects and for Literacy in India. Because in each of these cases our projects are of scale commensurate to the scale of our organisation.

One program that started this year and has caught the imagination of Rotarians worldwide is Empowering Girls. Everywhere I visited in the world, Empowering Girls projects is what they showcased. And this program can be implemented across all areas of focus and has the potential for large scale projects.

Different Presidents and Prime Ministers of countries hailed this initiative. Now is the time to take those discussions forward.

Women and girls are half of Humanity, they should have half the opportunity and that also my friends is my dream.

These dreams that I have shared with you today in my swan song of this extraordinary year in my life need to become your dreams too and they should become OUR dreams.

These are no ordinary dreams. They will shape the future of our organisation. I am so happy that the Board of Directors invested a lot of time discussing these transformative issues and we have started moving the needle. I am sure this beginning that we have made will soon blossom into major plans and activities towards realisation of the dreams.

If you believe in these dreams then let me quote to you what one of the greatest philosophers of India, Vivekananda said “Awake, Arise and stop not until the goal is reached.

For Rotary to grow even bigger, we all will need to work towards these dreams remembering what another great Indian of this century, the erstwhile President of India late Abdul Kalam said. Dreams are not what you see when you sleep. Dreams are those that will not let u sleep.

We all should dream for Rotary to Grow More and Do More. Then with your passion, your sincerity and your commitment let us make these dreams real. When people of action take up a challenge, they do not stop. Let us all work to ensure that the dream of the stature of this organisation growing happens by valuing ourselves, leading to greater partnerships, in turn leading to bigger projects, culminating into greater impact. Thus completing a virtuous circle which started with just a dream. I commit to each of you that I will keep working towards these dreams for the good of the organisation even when I step down as President.

This journey has indeed been memorable for Rashi and me. We both are beholden to each of you and the Rotarians across the globe for their tremendous love, affection, care, faith adulation that they showered on us. And we both thank all of you with folded hands.

As the convention draws to a close, let me once again also thank the chair John Smarge, HOC Chair Rhonda and their committees and the outstanding staff for putting up an extraordinary convention in most trying and uncertain times.

Thanks to my family for all their support and to my extended family Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar and of course to Rashi for her rock solid support.

Each of You have made this epoch making year of our lives an unforgettable experience. And so, let me end with a Hindi song... achha chalta hoon duaaon mein yaad rakhna mere zikr ka zubaan pe suad rakhna dil ke sandookon mein mere achhe kam rakhna Chitthi taaron mein bhi mera tu salaam rakhna its time to say goodbye, hope you keep me in your prayers hope you remember us with happiness keep our good deeds in the warmth of our heart, and know that you will be in our thoughts always.
