RI President, 2021-22 Shekhar Mehta

hekhar Mehta, has been a member of Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar, since 1985 and is the 4th Indian and the 2nd from Kolkata to be the President of Rotary International. His theme for the year 2021-22 is "**Serve to change lives**".

He was the District Governor of 3291 in the year 2019-2000 and part of the Rotary Board as a Director in the period 2011-2013. Has held many positions in the International level, prominent among them being Chairmanship of Strategic Planning committee of Rotary

International, Joint Committee of Partnerships of Rotary International and Rotary Foundation, Literacy India mission, Rotary Foundation India and Rotary India centennial celebrations. He is a Trustee of Operation Eyesight Universal, a Canada based organization.

He has helped Rotary to unfold in Bhutan and Maldives.

Keenly dedicated to service, Shekharji has initiated several projects for social development. Some of these are as follows:

He constructed 500 homes during the tsunami at Andaman & Nicobar Inslands. Started the Shelter Kit programme in India for disaster relief and has distributed more than 10000 shelter kits, helping about 50000 disaster victims.

'Healing Little Hearts' has done more than 1500 heart surgeries for children all over India.

- He has conceived, designed and scaled up the Rotary India Literacy mission by starting the TEACH program. More than 3000 Rotary clubs participate in this program making it one of the largest program of literacy and education by Rotary in the world.
 - Responding to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's national call, he has helped to set up nearly 5000 toilets in rural Bengal, benefitting 30,000 people.

He has been Instrumental in setting up 15 Eye Hospitals across India serving nearly 50,000 eye operations each year.

He started a scholarship program called UDAAN for marginalized children over last 10 years. More than 1000 scholarships have been given so far.

Shekhar Mehta is spearheading a National Program under Rotary India Humanity Foundation, to do Indiawide projects in collaboration with the Government of India, in the areas of Water, Sanitation, Literacy, Healthcare, Environment and Disaster Management. The result of these programs will be "Rotary's Role in Nation Building in India".

He is the recipient of Rotary International's Service Above Self and The Rotary Foundation's Distinguished Service and Meritorious Service Awards.

Shekharji's guiding mantra is "Service is the rent we pay for the space we occupy on this earth".

He is a Rotary Leadership Institute faculty member since 2015 and a recipient of the Vocational Service Leadership Award from Rotary International in 2014. Amid all this, Prabir still makes time for his passion as a travel photographer and avid thrill seeker. In 2016 he drove from Kolkata to Jaisalmer and covered a total distance of 5,219 kms.

For us at Chowrenghee the year 2021-22 has an emotional connect as well. Our Club was chartered by RI President Shekhar Mehta in the year 2000 who was then the DG of 3291. We all from Chowrenghee congratulate Shekharji, to take up the highest post in Rotary and wish him a very successful year.

I don't know, if God has a role to play but someone would be very happy to see me here today. My late Mother spent more than 40 years of her life serving society. For her, service became a religion in life which she pursued with full dedication and passion. As a youngster, I never liked to share my mother with her NGO. Today I realise the great work, she has done. What I saw as a youngster is now becoming my life. Rotary changed me as a person. It has given me a new dimension.

During a recent visit to a village in Uluberia, it was very disturbing to see the lives of people in rural Bengal. We are very fortunate at our end. Let us share some of this with those who really need our help. Very correctly said 'Service to others is the rent you pay for your room here on earth.'

Following is the vision and goal for the year 2021-22. This year we focus



on Medical projects, Upliftment of a village, environment development and women empowerment.

During the PRE PETS at Kolaghat, DG Pabirda asked all President Elects, to do one project in the coming year which was close to their heart and he coined the term "Dil Se".

Prabirda, this would be my 'Dil se'

Project "Utthan" would develop and uplift the lives of people living in a village called Shivtala Purbopara in Uluberia having 150 homes and 700 beneficiaries. There would be installation of Tubewells, Private Toilets and Solar Lights. Training camps would be arranged to educate residents on garbage disposal, clean enviorment, hygiene and nutrition. In order to increase source of income, women self help groups would be formed. There are plans to set up puffed rice units, develop fishery and poultry and organic farming. Primary education for the children at Rotary Chowrenghee Vidyalaya which is close by. Some internal road repairs with the assistance of the local Panchayat and Corporation. This village would be developed in two years as a model village.

Project 'Jeevan Jyoti', Under this project, medical check ups would be done in the three RCC areas, Uluberia, Amtala and Sunderbans. Total number of beneficiaries would be around 2000. Basic parameters would be checked, along with children vaccination and women's medical issues. There will be periodic visit of Doctors and all medical records shall be maintained of the beneficiaries. Critical or serious cases would be referred to Government Hospitals and assistance provided as possible.

Project 'Van Vaibhav', An afforestation drive is planned in sizeable tracts of vacant land in rural Bengal.

The club would open their third

Interact Club at BDM International, Kolkata. Our recently chartered second Interact Club at Indus Valley World School, would have their first year of running in the year 2021-22

Our club would be supporting Rotary Club of Mahanagar in project Urja and have confirmed the dialysis treatment of four patients to be carried out at Sankarnath Dialysis Center, Kolkata. We hope to treat further more patients, through this project.

A project on artificial mobility aids is under the planning stage and we hope to have it finalised.

Expanding the Rotary Family, is a key goal for all Clubs. We have committed to add at least five new members. Today four new members would be joining the Chowrenghee Family.

The Club would continue on its focus in Literacy and Water-Sanitation programs

Project: 'Gift of Water', This Global Grant Project, was approved by the Foundation in February 2021. The project size is over US\$ 200,000. The work on the project started in April 2021. Through this project, 28 tubewells, 450 private toilets and 16 community baths will be installed in 17 villages, covering 8 areas/districts of West Bengal for nearly 20000 beneficiaries. This project would be completed by March 2023.

Rotary Chowrenghee Vidyalaya, at Uluberia, We continue to impart primary education to nearly 300 children till Grade Four. Further computer coaching and online digital classes would be expanded. We plan to increase the classes to Grade 5 and beyond, depending on the pandemic situation.

Covid has shaken the world. Many have lost their dear ones and many are still suffering. We as Rotarians have a responsibility and a role to play. Some good work was done last year. We shall continue our services in this fight over covid.

Our list of service should not end here. We have a lot more to do.

My request to all my friends in Chowrenghee, that let us set high goals and serve together to those who need us. God has been kind to us. Let us share some part of that kindness with others. Requesting members to please come forward and participate in club projects. Donate for a good cause. We assure you that your contributions would be well spent and you would feel proud to be associated with the projects. Covid has affected our regular mode of fund raising through Parampara. Let this situation, not affect our good work and new ideas. The club needs your support and contribution to keep all its projects on. Friends, let us create a meaning to our lives and jointly serve together.

- Medical projects
- Women empowerment

- Development of a model village

Utthan

We develop a village called Shivtala Purbopara in Uluberia. This village has 150 homes and total beneficiaries are around 600.

• Tubewells will be installed to provide clean drinking water.

• There will be solar energy lights, to meet the electricity requirements.

 Private toilets will be installed in those houses not having any such facility.

 Training camps would be arranged to educate residents on garbage disposal, clean environmment, hygiene and nutrition.

◆ In order to increase source of income, women self-help groups would be formed. There are plans to set up sanitary pad and puffed rice units, along with organic farming and mosquito net stitching.

 Primary education for the children shall be arranged in Chowrenghee Vidyalaya in Uluberia which is close by.

◆ Internal road repairs would be done along with the assistance of the local Panchayat and Corporation.

Jeevan Jyoti

Medical check ups would be done in the three RCCs at Uluberia, Amtala and Sunderbans. Total beneficiaries would be around 2000. Basic parameters would be checked along with children vaccination and women's medical issues. There will be periodic visit of doctors and all medical records would be maintained of the beneficiaries. Critical cases would be referred to government hospitals and assistance would be provided as possible.

Van Vaibhav

An afforestation drive is planned in sizeable tracts of vacant land in rural Bengal.

New Interact Club

The club would launch its third Interact Club at BDM International, Kolkata. Our recently chartered second Interact Club at Indus Valley World School, would have their first year of running in the year 2021-22.

Dialysis Treatment

Our club would be supporting this project of Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar and have confirmed the dialysis treatment of four patients to be carried out at Sankarnath Dialysis Center, Kolkata. We hope to serve more patients, through this project.

Artificial mobility aids

This project is under planning stage and we hope to have it finalized shortly.

Existing Projects

Rotary Chowrenghee Vidyalaya, Uluberia

We continue to impart primary education to nearly 300 children till Grade 4. Further, computer coaching and online digital classes would be expanded. We plan to increase the classes to Grade 5 and beyond, depending on the pandemic situation.

Gift of Water

This is a Global Grant Project, approved by The Rotary Foundation in February 2021 with an outlay of over US\$ 200,000. Work began in April 2021. 28 tubewells, 450 private toilets and 16 community baths will be installed in 17 villages covering 8 areas/districts of West Bengal for nearly 20000 beneficiaries. Target time of completion would be March 2023.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Chowrenghee Vidyalaya: The school was closed till January 2021 due to the pandemic. Very few children managed to somehow come in January. The School resumed normal classes in February. The school celebrated Saraswati Puja, organized a Sit & Draw competition and Sports Day.

During the pandemic, some of the members and their spouses gave online classes to some students in handicraft, painting, music, etc.

Water & Sanitation: Four tubewells were constructed, mainly in Sunderbans area. This was in collaboration with Bees Trees & Water. Good cleaning water was provided to nearly 5000 beneficiaries.



Gift of Water: This is the club's first Global Grant project as the Host Club. Also it was the largest Global Grant project sanctioned by District 3291 in 2019-20. This project was initiated in 2019-20 but was finally approved in February. 2021, the delay occurring due to the lockdown. Through this project, 28 tubewells, 16 community baths and 450 private toilets are to be installed in 17 villages of rural West Bengal, aiding 15000 beneficiaries. This project commenced in April 2021 and would be completed by March 2023.

WINS: This is an ongoing Global Grant project where the Host Club is RC Calcutta Belur and Chowrenghee is one of the partners. Through this project, Chowrenghee

would make hand washing, drinking and sanitation facilities, in six schools. Work has been done in 2 of the schools in Uluberia. Work is in progress in 2 schools in Kalighat and 2 schools in Murshidabad.

Blanket Distribution: Nearly 600 blankets were distributed, during the winter months of December & January to beneficiaries living in Uluberia, Amtalla, Suderbans



COVID: Medicines and medical equipment donated to Ishwara Sankalpa (NGO).

2000 masks, 450 washing soaps distributed in Sunderbans through Missing Link (NGO). 100 Covid relief homecare kits distributed in Medica Super Speciality Hospital, 100 kits through CREDO (NGO). 20 kits distributed in Uluberia. A Ventilator costing 10 lakhs has been donated to Bharat Sewashram, Joka. (a hospital serving the less privileged who are COVID afflicted)


