Rotary Milestones

1905 : First Rotary Club formed in Chicago, Illinois, USA on 23rd February.

1910 : First Rotary convention held in Chicago.
 1912 : The Rotary Club of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, becomes the first club outside the United States to be officially chartered. (The club was formed in

1910).

1917 : Endowment fund, forerunner of The Rotary Foundation, established.

1920: January 1st 1920 The Rotary Club of Calcutta became the 1st Rotary Club chartered in India.

1932 : 4-Way Test formulated by Chicago Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor.

1945 : Forty-nine Rotarians help draft United Nations Charter in San Francisco.

1947 : Rotary founder Paul Harris dies; first 18 Rotary Foundation scholarships granted.

1962 : First Interact club formed in Melbourne, Florida, USA.

 1985 : Rotary announces PolioPlus program to immunize all the children of the world against polio.

1990-91: Preserve Planet Earth program inspires some 2,000 Rotary-sponsored environmental projects.

2000 : Western Pacific declared polio-free. 2001 : 30,000th Rotary club chartered.

2002 : Europe declared polio-free; first class of



ALL THE CONTRIBUTING GOVERNMENTS OF THE WORLD.

- Polio was eradicated in the USA in 1989 and Americas in 1994. Europe in 2002 and India declared Polio free in 2014.
- We started in India the NIDs in 1997.
- We have spent \$ 17 billion for Polio eradication.
- Rotary has contributed \$ 2 billion.
- 20 million voluntary workers
- 2.5 billion children vaccinated.
- Last case of Polio in Nigeria was in 2016.
- African continent and Nigeria declared Polio free in 2020.
- Last year in 2021, we had just 6 cases of Poliomyelitis.
- This year there has been a small spurt and we have had 29 cases thus far.
- We also have had an isolated case in an adult in the U.S.A. which is in a small community which says "No vaccine." There is nothing to be alarmed about.
- The detection of the virus in the drainage in London has also been effectively tackled.
- This year we have had 20 cases in Pakistan, 7 cases in Mozambique and 2 Afghanistan.
- The increase in Pakistan is particularly in one province and has again been cordoned off with good support of the government.
- The 7 cases in Mozambique are Vaccine Derived Polio Virus cases and will be tackled with the new vaccine nOPV2.
- There is a reduction of cases in Afghanistan (which is one of the 2 endemic countries) is a huge plus point and we can still be highly optimistic about eradicating Poliomyelitis in a year or two.








































S/o Pankaj & Bhawana 29th October

Starting from the 27th Sept, Tuesday at 12 noon, West Bengal Tourism Development Corporation will be running two Double Decker buses in Kolkata along a strategically planned route originating at Cathedral Road (opposite Rabindra Sadan) and passing Victoria Memorial- Prinsep Ghat- St. Johns' Church- Dacres lane- Jorasanko, ending at the Thakurbari gate at C.R Avenue. The 2 buses will start from Cathedral Road from 11.00 am & 12.00 noon respectively & run continuously to & fro till 6.00 pm each day (except on Monday).

The fare is a fixed Rs. 50/- per person & it shall be valid for one complete itinerary/journey, one way. The tourists may Hop In Hop Out at any above designated point/location in the above mentioned route. There are 12 seats on the roofless upper deck (Umbrellas shall be provided to each onboard passenger) & 14 seats at the lower deck. Standing on the bus is strictly prohibited.



For ₹500/Night, Uttarakhand offer real 'Jail experience'



Dehradun: If your astrologer predicts that planetary positions in your horoscope are such that you may go to jail, do not lose sleep. "Remedy" is at hand. The jail administration in Uttakhand's Haldwani has come up with a unique idea to help people ward off "bad karma" for a nominal fee of Rs. 500 per night in prison. Astrologers say this may neutralise the prophecy. The Haldwani prison was built in 1903 and a portion of it comprising the old armouny with six staff quarters, which has remained abandoned, is currently being readied to receive "jail quests", Satish Sukhiya, the prison's deputy jail supreitendent told TOL. He said the jail frequencly received "orders" from senior official to allow "recommended person" to spend a few hours in the jail barracks. These "Tourist prisoners" are also given prison uniforms and food prepared in the jail kitchen. They are also locked up on request. "These are mainly people whose astrologers predict that a jain term is

inevitable as per the plentary positions in their horoscope. We have an abandoned portion inside the prison that can be developed as a dummy jail to accommodate such "immates" for a night for a nominal fee, "the jail official said. "I had moved a proposal regarding the matter earlier too, to the inspector general of prisons. He (Pushpak Jyoti) not only appreciated) it but asked me to send him detailed project report," Sukhija added.
