HISTORY OF ROTARY

Paul Harris, who was raised by his New England grandparents with values of tolerance toward all, gained his law degree in 1891 and then decided to hit the road for the entire world. He tried out various professions and in 1896, he went to Chicago to practice law.

One evening, in 1900, as Paul and one of his friends strolled through the neighborhood, Paul's friend introduced him to tradesmen in their stores. "Why not have a fellowship composed of businessmen from different occupations, without restrictions of politics or religion?" he thought.

On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris had dinner with his closest friend, Chicago coal dealer Sivester Schiele. Afterwards they walked over the river to Room 711 of the Unity Building, where they met their host, Gustavus Loehr, a mining engineer and another friend, Hiram Shorey, a merchant tailor. Harris proposed that they form a club and three other men, Harry Ruggles, William Jenson, and A. L. White joined them in their second meeting on March 9th. Ruggles was a printer, and created the "name badge" version of the Rotary "wheel" and also started singing in Rotary. Two weeks later, at the meeting, where a President was chosen, Silvester Schiele became the first President in Rotary.

During the course of one of the early meetings, Paul suggested several possible names for the new club. Among others - ROTARY. It met with general favor and was adopted forthwith. The significance of the name becomes apparent on examination of the original plan of the club, which provided for rotation in the place of meeting, in the chairmanship, and even in membership which was to be continued for one year only. Rotary's early emblem of a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust) was designed in 1905 by Montague M Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago, who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1923. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.

As the club met, Paul was very interested in starting Rotary in other cities and the second Rotary club was founded by Homer Wood in San Francisco in 1908. Wood then quickly organized clubs in Oakland (where weekly meetings began in 1909), Seattle and Los Angeles. In fact, before the end of 1909, there were seven clubs, including New-York City and Boston.





Paul Harris had a vision of "Around the World Rotary" which was also opposed by many of his fellow Rotarians. It was not until he won the loyalty of the man who was to be Rotary's secretary from 1910 -1942 that Rotary became organized and International. That man was Chesley Perry, whom Paul called the "Builder of Rotary."

By August 1910 there were sixteen clubs and the National Association of Rotary Clubs was organized and held its first convention that year, in Chicago. At the 1911 Portland Convention, "Service, Not Self" was introduced by Frank Collins of Minneapolis. It later became "Service Above Self". The slogan "He profits most who serves best," was also read there. It had been written by Arthur Sheldon and delivered by him at the first convention the previous year in Chicago. Both were approved by RI in 1950.

When clubs were formed in Canada and Great Britain in 1912, the name was changed to the International Association of Rotary Clubs, and was later shortened to Rotary International in 1922. Paul Harris was the first president of the National Association of Rotary Clubs, serving two terms. He was named President Emeritus of the International Association in 1912 and served until his death in 1947. Till his death, Paul and his wife Jean Thomson Harris made numerous exhausting trips to nearly every continent, visiting hundreds of cities, planting friendship trees and attending Rotary conferences.

As Rotary spanned the globe, branch offices were opened in Europe, South America, South Asia and Southwest Pacific. In the UK, British Rotary had its own office. When Rotary International President Emeritus, world traveler, author and prominent Chicago attorney Paul Harris passed away on January 27,1947, his dream had grown from one group of four to 6,000 clubs in 75 countries with 300,000 members brought together through the service and fellowship of Rotary.

The two world wars changed the face of Rotary - parts of the Far East and Eastern Europe were closed to Rotary. Eventually, clubs were re-established in Japan, Germany, Poland and Hungary. In 1990 the first club was opened in the former Soviet Union and China. In 1987, Rotary membership was opened to women (Sylvia Whitlock of RC Duarta, California was the first Lady admitted to membership of Rotary in RY 1987-88), and in 1989 the RI Council on Legislation standardized all Rotary documents and rules. Between 1989-2005, Rotary came close to removing polio from the face of the earth and, in 2005, returned, again, to Chicago to celebrate the first 100 years.







ROTARY'S GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Four basic principles guide Rotarians in achieving the ideal of service and high ethical standards.

★ First Guiding Principle

Object of Rotary: First formulated in 1910, the Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and in particular, to encourage and foster!

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

★ Second Guiding Principle

Classification: Classification is based on the founder's paradigm of choosing cross-representation of each business, profession, and institution within a community.

* Third Guiding Principle

Avenue of Service: The Avenues of Service, based on the Object of Rotary, are Rotary's philosophical cornerstone and the foundation on which club activity based. There are five Avenues of Service:

First Avenue of Service : Club Service

Second Avenue of Service : Vocational Service

Third Avenue of Service: Community Service

Fourth Avenue of Service : International Service

Fifth Avenue of Service : Youth Service


THE FOUR-WAY TEST

Created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI President) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The 4-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways.

The 4-Way Test of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

He is a member of many professional, social, cultural and charitable organizations. He is a Trustee of Operation Eyesight Universal India a Canada based organization, Shelter Box UK.

He joined Rotary in 1985.

He is a member of Rotary Calcutta Mahanagar and was District Governor in 1999-2000. He was the director on the board of Rotary International for the years 2011-13.





He has held many positions at the international level. Prominent amongst them are he was chairman of Strategic Planning Committee of Rotary International. He was chair of the Joint Committee on Partnership of Rotary International and the Rotary Foundation. He was the chairman of Rotary India Literacy Mission and chairman of Rotary Foundation India. He has initiated construction of 7000 plus toilets in rural West Bengal benefiting 35000 villagers. He has been instrumental in setting up 15 eye hospitals all over India.

He is recipient of all the highest awards of Rotary International. Service Above Self Award, the Meritorious Service Award and the Distinguished Service Award. Shekhar is married to Rashi. Rashi is a stage actor and has performed in many places across India. She is a Past President of Inner Wheel.

They have 2 children son Chiraag married to Geeta settled in Delhi and daughter Chandni pursuing PhD in Delhi. They have one grandson Veer.

During his year as President of Rotary International Shekhar asks Rotarians to Grow More and Do More. His mission for the year is a leap in membership to a never before 1.3 million.

He wants Rotarians to focus on Empowering Girls - be it in Education, Health, Skilling or WASH. He urges all Rotarians to Serve to Change Lives.

His own guiding mantra is Service is the rent that we pay for the space we occupy on this earth.
