







KNOW YOUR SPEAKER - SHRI DILIP MITRA



Dilip Mitra joined the Indian Police Service (IPS) as a direct recruit in July 1976 and was allotted the West Bengal Cadre. He did his schooling at Don Bosco Liluah and St Xavier's Hazaribagh. A graduate from St Xavier's College, Calcutta, he has an LL B degree, a SIDA sponsored Advanced

International Certificate in Traffic and Environment Management from the VTI, Linkoping, Sweden, a post graduate Diploma in Hospital and Health Care Management from Symbiosis, Pune and two in-Service Certificates in Management.

He held several important assignments with both the State and Central Governments over the course of an unblemished career spanning thirty-eight and a half years.

Dilip Mitra was awarded the Indian Police Medal for Meritorious Service by the President of India.

He was a Member of the Indian Delegation at several Indo-Bangladesh, Indo-Nepal and Indo-Bhutan Border talks during his tenure in Intelligence.

He was DIG, Spl IGP, IGP and Addl DGP in the State Intelligence Branch. He retired as Director General of Police, a rank he held for over four years.

Having a multi-dimensional and multi-talented personal the Director General of Police, Dilip Mitra has had an enviable reputation for integrity and for being an unshakeable stickler for the Law.

Post Retirement he has not been sitting idle. His first book, an autobiographical novel, "Waist Deep Water" sold over five thousand copies according to India Today Magazine. Another book Operation Black Stiletto chronicles of 10 years in intelligence. A world where massacres like the one in Nandigram occur.

Where a mother suckles her child, even while planning and facilitating mass murder of Innocents. The terrifying nightmare of a world of terror. This is a serious work which will make the reader think and contemplate deeply for quite some time.

Yes, indeed multi-talented and multi-faceted.





100% ATTENDANCE OF METROPOLITANS FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTMBER & OCTOBER-2022






















STEWARDSHIP

What is Stewardship?

- Using Rotary Foundation funds in a responsible and transparent manner.
- Implementing grant projects according to Rotary Foundation policy.
- Proper grant management and financial compliance.

What Are the Consequences of Poor Stewardship?

- Loss of Rotary funds
- Damages Rotary□'s reputation
- · Weakens project
- Limits impact
- · Negatively Impacts beneficiaries
- · Risks sanctions
- · Fails four-way test

Good Stewardship

General Practices

- · Involvement of full club
- Communication between host and international partners
- Communication with beneficiary community
- Control of project funds remains with Rotarians until grant purchases are made

Before Project Begins:

- · Perform community assessment
- · Develop financial management plan
- Solicit competitive bids for large project expenses
- Disclose any potential conflicts of interest involving any sponsor club members
- Open a bank account to be used exclusively for the grant project
- The bank account should require two signatories for all withdrawals

During Project Implementation:

- Regularly visit beneficiaries to monitor project progress
- Adhere to project plan and financial plan
- · Use checks or bank transfer whenever possible
- Request invoices and receipts for all grant expenses
- · Maintain a project ledger
- Keep backup copies of all financial documentation.

After Project Implementation:

- · Measure the results of your project
- · Maintain relationship with beneficiaries
- · Keep all financial records for at least 5 years

Reporting:

- Submit a report on the project □'s progress every year via the Online Grants Center
- Include all retained financial documentation with each report
- Transparency
- Proactively and openly share information between sponsors and TRF
- Accountability
- · Adhere to TRF guidelines
- Collaboration
- Share knowledge, best practices, and lessons learned by reports and training

Examples of Stewardship Issues

- · No community assessment
- No competitive bids for project expenses
- · Undisclosed conflict of interest
- Advance transfers to vendors
- · Cash payments with no receipts
- · Sustainability components not completed
- · Project managed entirely by one Rotarian

Discussion questions

- How do good stewardship practices help the project participants, beneficiaries, and The Rotary Foundation?
- What steps can your club take to ensure responsible fiscal management before starting a grant?
- What stewardship practices does your club already follow that can be applied to managing grant funds?

Suggested activities

- Have participants work in small groups to discuss current measures that clubs have in place to ensure Foundation funds are managed properly.
- Ask participants working in groups of three or four to come up with a plan for handling suspected misuse of Foundation funds. Ask each group to report on its discussion.
- Ask participants working in small groups to list how good stewardship practices result in increased donations to The Rotary Foundation.


