#### Know Your RI President Rtn. Shekhar Mehta



Rtn. Shekhar Mehta Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar West Bengal, India

Mehta, who is Chartered Accountant, Cost Accountant and Chartered Secretary and is Chairman of the Skyline Group, a real estate development company he founded. He is also a director of Operation Eyesight Universal (India), a Canada-based organization.

Mehta has been actively involved in disaster response and is a trustee of ShelterBox, UK. After the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, he helped build nearly 500 homes for families affected by the disaster.

He pioneered a program that has performed more than 1,500 life-changing heart surgeries in South Asia. He is also the architect of the TEACH Program, which promotes literacy throughout India and has reached thousands of schools.

A Rotary member since 1984, Mehta has served Rotary as director, member or chair of several committees, zone coordinator, training leader, member of The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, and district governor. He is also the chair of Rotary Foundation (India).

Mehta has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Awards.

He and his wife, Rashi, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society.

#### **Presidential Initiatives**

Equality is a fundamental human right, and it's necessary for a peaceful, prosperous, and sustainable world. Still, girls and women worldwide face inequities in areas including health and education and experience significant violence and disproportionate poverty. Rotary encourages clubs and districts to prioritize projects that improve the health, well-being, education, and economic security of girls in their communities and around the world. Take on a club-based initiative, a district grant, or a global grant that engages members of your community in a project that will protect and empower girls and increase equity by ensuring their access to resources that will improve their lives.

Mehta acknowledges that current membership trends are a challenge and says that membership development should be Rotary's highest priority. He believes that focusing on regional plans, successfully transitioning Rotaractors into Rotary clubs, and increasing diversity and female members could yield a 5 percent net growth in membership each year.

"A major brainstorming is needed to find effective solutions suited to different areas of the world," says Mehta. He adds that regional ethos and culture have to be taken into account to find localized solutions, as "one size does not fit all." He believes Rotary can extend to new geographical areas and countries.

As a strong proponent of Rotary's strategic plan, Mehta says he will encourage clubs to use action plans and reinforce the core values of Rotary.

Mehta says Rotary needs to become more contemporary and adaptable by focusing on partnerships with governments and corporations, expanding partnerships with organizations that specialize in Rotary's areas of focus, and investing in technology.

Samit Ghosh Founder, Ujjivan Small Finance Bank & Ujjivan Financial Services Ltd.

Samit Ghosh is the Founder of **Ujjivan Small Finance Bank (UFSB)**. He served as the Bank's Managing Director and CEO till his retirement in November 30th 2019. Currently he is the Chairman of the Board of Ujjivan Financial Services Ltd. The holding company of UFSB.

He founded **Ujjivan Financial Services Ltd.** as a pioneering NBFC microfinance institution in 2005. In 2015 Ujjivan Financial Services received an in-principal approval, followed by a licence from Reserve Bank of India on November 11, 2016 to set up the Small Finance Bank. The bank successfully launched its operations in February 1st, 2017. Ujjivan Bank serves over 5 million customers across 24 states & union territories through 570+ banking outlets with staff strength of over 18,000 employees.

Prior to Ujjivan, he was a career banker for over 30 years. He started his career with **Citibank** in 1975 and was part of the management team to set up retail banking in India in 1985. He worked for **Arab Bank** plc in Bahrain from 1980-85 in investment banking. He also led the launch of retail banking for **Standard Chartered Bank** in Middle East & South Asia and **HDFC Bank**. His last commercial banking assignment was as the Chief Executive of **Bank Muscat** in India.

He completed his BA from **Jadavpur University**, Kolkata in 1970. He graduated with an MBA in Finance from The **Wharton School** of Business at the University of Pennsylvania in 1974.

In 2009, he was one of the founders & also served as the President of Microfinance Institutions Network (MFIN) in 2013-15. In 2007, he was also one of the founders & served as the Chairman of Association of Karnataka Microfinance Institutions (AKMI). He has played a very active role in the evolution of microfinance, development of Small Finance Banks and overall financial inclusion in India. Samit was on the board for eight years of Women's World Banking (WWB) headquartered in New York since 2011-19. Established in the 70s by outstanding women leaders like Ela Bhatt, the organization was built for promoting women empowerment & financial inclusion across the world. His association with WWB continues.

He is an active board member of **Parinaam Foundation**. He is currently a Partner of **Nudge Foundation** and mentors to a number of high potential start-up NGOs in diverse fields of education, social emotional enterprise & leadership development. 






#### Salute To Our Honorary Members For Their Achievements

#### Report on District Training Assembly "Abhigyata" for RY-2021-2022



#### Distribution of Dry Ration on 07.06.2021


