In August, I was proud to visit Pakistan and highlight Rotary's top goal, eradicating polio. It was also a tremendous opportunity to spotlight female health workers who are playing a critical role in protecting children from this vaccine-preventable disease.

This month, as we celebrate World Polio Day, we are shining a spotlight on our more than 30-year effort to lead the first global polio eradication campaign and our success in forming partnerships capable of completing this massive goal. We all know that this is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and that we've reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent worldwide.

Pakistan is one of only two countries in the world where wild poliovirus remains endemic. (The other is neighboring Afghanistan.) I was able to witness and take part in vaccination campaigns in Pakistan, and soon after I left, a monumental nationwide immunization campaign took place, focused on 43 million children under the age of 5. I saw the incredible work of Rotary members on the ground.

More than 60 percent of vaccinators in Pakistan are women, and they are doing a remarkable job building trust and convincing mothers to vaccinate their children.

Seeing it all firsthand, I know that the will exists across the Rotary world to end polio, and I'm confident that we have the strategy. The Pakistani media has been very supportive of our efforts as well, and this is making a difference. This month, a new global pledging moment at the World Health Summit in Berlin promises to pull together more resources to fund these timesensitive eradication efforts. Now it is up to us to do our part and raise \$50 million this year to earn the full 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

There's great cause for optimism on the polio front — but also some staggering new events that have further raised the stakes. Over the past few months, new polio outbreaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and, most recently, in the New York City area. These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear — vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most atrisk people have kept their vaccinations up to date.

Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. What I saw in Pakistan convinced me that we can and must finish the job, but it will only happen if we remain committed to a strategy that's working and back it with all necessary resources.

Through our commitment, generosity, and sheer determination, we will # End Polio.

ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARDS FOR TRIBAL YOUTH HELD AT NAYAGRAM, JHARGRAM, WEST MIDNAPUR ON 14TH & 15TH OCTOBER, 2022.

"SANHATI" RYLA for the Tribal Youth (Lodha and Sabar tribes) of West Midnapur (Jangal Mahal area) organized by Rotary Club of Calcutta Samaritans, Rotary International District 3291 with support of many Host and Co-Host Rotary Clubs. The event was held at P.O Kharikamathani, P. S Nayagram Village, Dist. Jhargram on 14th and 15th October, 2022. The place was very remote but still all facilities were available with help of the Block Development Officer Mrs. Rituparna Chatterjee. Total 50 participants from age group between 14 to 18 years from various far off villages of that place attended the RYLA Camp for two days. Amongst 50 tribal young participants it is heartening to mention that 35 were female and 15 were male. The program was inaugurated by lighting of lamp and with song "Aguner Parashmoni Chhoaon Prane" sung by our Club President Rtn. Gita Sarkar. The inaugural Ceremony was graced by valued presence of the District Governor Rtn. Ajoy Kumar Law, the First Lady Rtn. Mitali Law, District Secretary (OCV) Rtn. Amitava Chakraborty, District Youth Service Chair Rtn. Ranjana Mutsuddi, District RYLA Chair Rtn. Tamalesh Kumar, other distinguished district officials and fellow Rotarians from other Rotary Clubs of RID 3291. After oath taking of RYLA by the participants, the Camp Commandant Rtn. Srabonee Mitra announced the Rules, Regulations and Disciplines of the Camp. An ice breaking session was conducted by IPP Jayasree Chatterjee and later by RYLA Chair Rtn. Tamalesh Kumar. The sessions were held with various activities encircling the topics on Ethics of positive Leadership, Fundamental of Leaderships, Problem solving and Conflict Management, Communication, the role of Rotary in community development etc. The BDO Mrs. Rituparna Chatterjee, who is a role model of Leadership, also encouraged and motivated the participants in her session on Leadership. The participants also took part in various competitions (individual and group) in the RYLA. Through all the competitions it was tried to explore the hidden talents of these underprivileged participants who are totally deprived from any kind of exposures. Certificates were given to all participants who attended this event along with Kits containing a School Bag, Exercise copies, Pencil box and colour box. Five different colours of T-Shirts for demarcation of five different groups (i.e Red, Blue, Yellow, Green and Orange) were provided to the participants. Two day Workshop was very smoothly conducted through various lecture sessions, activities and competitions. Trophies were also given to the winners on basis of their performances in various competitions and also evaluating their responses and interactions in all the sessions. Awards were given under following categories:

- 1. Best Rylarian (male & female individual)
- 2. Most popular Rylarian
- 3. Extempore (individual)
- 4. Creative performance (individual) on song, dance and recitation
- 5. Creative Arts (Group)
- 6. Skit (Group)
- 7. Best Group

A very positive impact of the event was observed. Initially on the first day, it was noticed that except few, all participants were very shy, introvert and having no expression on their faces, some were very scared, but gradually with time, the ice got melted and the scenario was totally changed. We found happiness in their faces, they started mixing up with each other and became little easy, comfortable and responsive. On the second day they came out from the shell and enjoyed the activities, sessions and competitions in full spirit. The participants also relished the food in the Camp for two days. Centuryply extended their support to this RYLA by sponsoring 50 backpack with educational materials.
