28TH INSTALLATION MEETING



The 28th Installation meeting was held on Monday 12th July 2021 on zoom. Master of Ceremonies Alka Jayaswal welcomed all Rotary dignitaries, members and guests punctually at 6 pm. The programme started with rendition of Ganesh Vandana beautifully sung by Sunita Agarwala followed by the National Anthem. Thereafter Victorians and all present observed one minute silence in memory of Past Presidents Deepak Atal and Amiya Chakraborty who sadly left us a few months back.

President (2020-21) Gayatree Dhar in her address said that the wheel of Rotary had taken a full turn and now it was time for a new President to take over. Last year was unlike any other year and with the pandemic resulting in restriction of movement it was a wonder that more than 60 projects including 3 major projects were completed. Some daring members held her hand enabling her to do them physically,

not only in Kolkata but also in rural areas of W. Bengal. Some special projects were highlighted especially the DREAM project of converting the iconic Metropolitan Institute Main for Girls into a "HAPPY SCHOOL" with generous donations from members and benevolent donors. An ongoing mega project of renovation of 2 operation theatres (OT) into much needed covid OTs at Matri Bhavan was nearing completion thanks to a generous CSR grant from Lindae India. With 3 new members inducted and a decent amount contributed to The Rotary Foundation, work was done in all 5 avenues of service. A power point presentation of the activities of the year gone by was shared on screen.

Alka Jayaswal invited Rakesh Macwan to introduce Kaushlendra Kumar Jha, President 2021-22, which he did in his inimitable style. Following the introduction Kaushlendra Kumar Jha was installed as the 29th President of Rotary Calcutta Victoria. A video recording of handing over of collar, gavel and hammer and the charter was played and all clapped. President K.K.Jha then took the oath from District Governor Prabir Chatterjee.

President KK Jha in his address shared his vision through a power point presentation. He said that he had taken Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta's mantra "Each one bring one" seriously and Rotary Calcutta Victoria had already taken in 5 new members in the past one month. More would be inducted in this Rotary year. Projects started last year would be continued. Training in rain water harvesting, restoration of water bodies and organic farming were close to his heart. Dr Vrinda Bhattacharya residing in UK and Mr. Pratyush Das residing in Canada were formally inducted as e-members. They were introduced by Kashmiri Marwah. It was now time to listen to Chief guest of the evening District Governor Prabir Chatterjee. After his introduction by Dr. Krishnendu Gupta , Prabir Chatterjee addressed the Rotarians and guests.

At the outset District Governor complemented RCCV for the great bonding and especially Gayatree Dhar, President 2020-21 for executing so many projects so well. He praised K.K. Jha, this year's president for all his plans and vision and was sure he would take the club to greater heights. He noted that there were many ladies in team 2021-22, - women's empowerment indeed. He advised that projects on menstrual hygiene, awareness on cervical cancer, thallaesemia, covid etc. be taken up as also mother and child care. Women's education and their empowerment was the thrust area this year. Adult literacy was equally important. He spoke about the soon to be launched 'Rotary Birangana Project' (scheduled for 24th July 2021), aimed at improving girl child's nutrition, counseling for tackling harassment and training in self defense somewhat similar to Kolkata Police's Tejashwini programme. District Governor thought the membership figure of 45 of the club was rather low and members should strive to increase it to 55-60. Social media was an ideal platform to enhance public image of Rotary. He has thus formed "Rotary Promotion Committee" where Rotaractors have been taken on board to help as the young generation were good at all this. This forum could be used by any club to highlight their activities. He wanted clubs to join hands with the youth for they were our future. Another idea of the RI President was to celebrate "Rotary Day of Service" where on certain designated days all clubs would be doing similar projects. Similar banner would be everywhere - this would bring visibility to Rotary. First such day is 15th August. He dwelt on the District 3291 website, Rotary India website and Rotary India App. Clubs must upload projects regularly in these and all clubs should have their own website. From next year RI District 3291 would become paperless. Prabir Chatterjee stressed on the necessity of giving to TRF which he calls 'Trust Foundation'. He mentioned about a District grant of US\$70,000 from where any club can access a sum of US\$1000 depending on the project. He was thanked by President K.K.Jha. After Club Secretary's announcement President Elect Sachiv Nijhawan gave the vote of thanks. After the meeting was terminated, members had a fellowship on zoom chitchatting for some time.

At one point in his speech District Governor Prabir Chatterjee mentioned that he was asking for US\$10 per member everywhere, but here he was getting US\$ 10,000. Members were flummoxed for the club had given him only US\$1010 as a token as of now. But President KK Jha has risen to the occasion and promised to give **US\$ 11,111 to TRF**.

The Year Gone by...

Numerous projects and programmes were done in all avenues of service under the leadership of Gayatree Dhar, President 2020-21, in the Rotary year gone by. Glimpses of some of them:

 Planted 600 mangrove saplings in Sunderbans, which were damaged by cyclone Amphan
