Congratulations Vinita for generously contributing to The Rotary Foundation. A proud moment for the club.

Vinita Dutt graduated from Miranda House College, Delhi University in 1962 with Botany, Zoology and Chemistry with a first class first, breaking all records of 10 years in Delhi University. Soon after she got married to Padam and moved to Germany. She speaks German fluently. On their return they started steel plant equipment and spares manufacturing company in Kolkata – 'Pavi Electrical Industries Pvt Ltd'. Vinita, a women entrepreneur, very rare in those days is Director of the company which is now over 50 years old.

Daughter of a Rotarian, she joined Rotary

Club of Calcutta Victoria in 1993 as a charter member and has since been actively involved in all club activities. She held several posts in the club and became President in 2015-16. Highlight of her presidential year was construction of 20 toilets in Joynagar

(South 24 Parganas) and installing eco friendly solar lights there. She has donated a total of 3 lakhs to the investment account of the Rotary Calcutta Victoria Trust for heart surgery of needy people. A contributor to TRF for a number of years, she has now decided to become a Major Donor Level 1.

Prof Dr Krishnendu Gupta (Arch **Klumph Society)** after finishing his schooling from St Xavier's School, Kolkata and Mayo College, Ajmer, joined Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore where he completed his MBBS in 1986. Thereafter, he received his **DGO** in 1989, followed by **MD** (Obstetrics & Gynaecology) in 1990, both from Kasturba Medical College, Manipal, bagging the **Univer**sity Gold Medal. Since then, he has received numerous academic fellowships, to name a few: **FICMCH**, Indian College of Maternal and Child Health: 1995; **FICOG**, Indian College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists: 2002; FRCPI, Royal College of Physicians, Dublin, Ireland: 2018; **FRCOG** (Hon), Royal College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists, London, UK: 2019. In addition, he also received **Diploma** in Surgical Pelviscopy, Hysteroscopy & Reproductive Medicine from Kiel, Germany, 2000. Currently he is a **Professor**, Dept of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Vivekananda Institute of Medial Sciences (VIMS), Kolkata from 1 January 2002 and **Unit Head** since 16 January 2017. He is also an Adjunct Professor, Dept of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Kasturba Medical College, Manipal from 2017. Examiner & Paper-setter of MBBS, DGO, MD / MS and DNB (Obstetrics & Gynaecology) in various Indian Universities since December 1993 till date and Foreign Universities since 2017. Krishnendu holds many academic administrative responsibilities currently: **FOGSI** Representative to AOFOG, 2020–22; Chair - Sexual & Reproductive Health Committee, AOFOG, 2019–22; National Corresponding Editor, Journal of Obst & Gynae of India, 2021–23; Member – Editorial Board, Journal of South Asian Federation of Obst & Gynae,

2021–22. He was the **Chairperson – Indian**

College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists

in 2016, President – The Bengal Obstetric & Gynaecological Society in 2013 and Vice President – FOGSI in 2011. At present, he is Head and Member of several committees related to various health related issues in India and abroad; has published numerous research

papers, chapters and articles in leading journals and textbooks in India and abroad. He is a regular invited Speaker in International Seminars, and has visited numerous countries for professional commitments.

Krishnendu joined Rotary in January 1992 as member of **Rotary Club of Jadavpur** and was there for one year. He became a member of **Rotary Club of Calcutta Victoria** (RCCV) in August 1997. He has served RCCV in various capacities and became President in 2017–18, the club's silver jubilee year. In his year, he laid a lot of stress on women's health and empowerment especially prevention of cervical cancer through awareness and vaccination. He first became a Major Donor in Rotary Year 2011–12. He and his family have been whole-heartedly supporting TRF and today he is an **AKS member**, the first and only one till date in RID–3291.

Krishnendu has held several **District positions** in RID–3291, namely, District Fund Raising Subcommittee Chair, 2021–22; District Annual Fund Subcommittee Chair, 2021–22; District Secretary, Projects – Medical, 2020–21; District Chair – Annual Giving, 2019–20; District Coordinator – TRF, 2018–19.

He is a Member, Cadre of Technical Advisers, 2018–24, TRF; Graduate from Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI); Member, Arch Klumph Society (AKS) – Trustees Circle, The Rotary Foundation (TRF) since 2018 (Contribution: US\$

2,50,000); Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) in 1999, Benefactor and Major Donor (MD) Level 1 in 2012, MD Level 2 and MD Level 3 in 2017, MD Level 4 in 2018. He has attended RI Convention 2019 (Hamburg, Germany), 2021 (Online) and registered for 2022 (Houston, USA).

Krishnendu has received numerous Rotary Awards and Felicitations in RID–3291: Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service in 2020–21; Best Rotarian of the Year 2017–18; Rotary Vocational Service Excellence Award: "Rotary Ratna" in 2017–18; Highest Contribution to TRF Award in 2017–18, 2018–19, 2020–21; Second Highest Contribution to TRF Award in 2019–20; Outstanding President Award in 2017–18.

He has received meritorious recognitions on numerous occasions from RC Calcutta Victoria for his continued and sustained efforts for the upliftment of women's health (Mother & Child, Women's Empowerment: Save the Girl Child, Violence against Women and Prevention of Cervical Cancer) by organising health checkup camps and awareness programmes since 1997, and for providing free HPV vaccination

to over 5000 adolescent girls from underprivileged parts of society, including vaccination of daughters of sex workers in the red-light district of Kolkata from 2009 till date.

In the memory of his parents, Krishnendu created the "Krishna & Purnendu Gupta Memorial Endowment Fund" in TRF for the upliftment of Women's Health and Empowerment by contributing US\$ 2,00,000 to TRF. In addition, he has contributed US\$ 30,100 to the PolioPlus Fund. Krishnendu has been directly involved and helped manage three Global Grants valued \$58,000, \$80,000 and \$55,000 respectively at the Club and District levels in the last three years by associating with Saroj Gupta Cancer Centre & Research Institute (SGCCRI) and Chittaranjan National Cancer Institute (CNCI), Kolkata.

Krishnendu is actively associated with "Sri Sathya Sai Bal Vihar", a charitable school for underprivileged children from 1997 where he has sponsored the education of over 1000 students till date and installed four e-learning projectors with the generous benevolence of the Eastern India Rotary Welfare Trust (EIRWT).

Ms Aparajita Gupta (Major Donor) completed her schooling from Kolkata with Distinction in the A Level examinations from Calcutta International School. Subsequently, she completed her Bachelors of Arts (BA) with Honours in Economics with Distinction from University of Exeter, UK, and thereafter successfully completed a double Masters (MSc) in Management from The London School of Economics and Political Science, UK and Masters in International Management (MIM) from CEMS, both

In this year Sunita and her family donated considerable amount for infrastructure development in Sree Satyanand Vidya Niket - a school in Baruipur for disadvantaged children. A large hall and five classrooms were built as also two toilets. Thus the school which was till class VII only could be extended till class X. 220 children received scholarships. 2 Matching Grants received. An ambulance donated. Rotary Calcutta Victoria received "Best Club" award (for the 5th time). Always supportive of TRF she became a Major Donor in June 2009.

Santosh Arora (Major Do**nor)** had done her postgraduation English. She taught English at Sri Sikshayatan College, Kolkata for some years. She joined Rotary Club of Calcutta Victoria in 1993 and was a charter member. Her knowl-

In 1998-99, she donned the mantle of president a second time – this time for a full year. The year witnessed the launch of 3 matching grants. Big projects of varied nature on leprosy for which the club was well known, education and nutrition for street children, awareness and detection programmes on a big scale for tuberculosis, cancer, malaria,

hepatitis and other diseases, imparting of income generating skills etc were done. RCCV hosted major district event, the District Assembly. An International Evening with representation from 38 countries and 'We are The World', a fun fair with cuisine from around the world and a fashion show received accolades and generated funds.

Known as the Queen of Matching Grants she regularly procured them through her contacts of International partners not only for her club but for other clubs in the District as well. Her expertise was unmatched. She also took upon herself to teach many club presidents how to apply for MGs and correctly fill up the forms. Over the years she procured lots of Matching Grants for eye screening camps and IOL surgeries. Thousands of IOLs were done in Dakshin Barasat and eye hospital in Canning. In gratitude the Eye Hospital at Dakshin Barasat named the hospital after her. An honour indeed! Santosh Arora became Major Donor Level 1 along with spouse Ratan Lal Arora in 2007 - FIRST for **RCCV.** Today she is no more but her legacy remains and fond memories.
