dren and vocational centres for disadvantaged women in South Kolkata and 2 centres in Birbhum District. It all started 20 years ago, after Vinita Dutt. PP Capt Arnab Sen, PE Sachiv Nijhawan, Club Secretary Lata Bhatia and District Chair Polio Plus PP Sarah Macwan met at Central Vaccine Store, KMC on Ballygunge Circular Road at 9.30 am to participate in SNID programme. District Governor Prabir Chatterjee was also present. Polio drops were given to children and food packets to all the health workers who were going door to door for administering the precious drops as well as to those in polio booths. To create awareness announcements were made over microphone and posters put behind rickshaws, on autos and buses plving on various lanes and roads in Kolkata. Banners were also put up in different places.

they could learn something that would be useful after they got married. At present about 120 young adults are taking vocational training.

Her organisation is FCRA registered which enables her to receive foreign donations.

About 6 years ago a vocational centre was opened in her house in Shantiniketan, Birbhum. Presently 24 girls are being taught tailoring. Some are learning to use computers. Another centre in the tribal area of Huchukpara (near Mallarpur station), about 90 minutes drive from Shantiniketan was set up 4 years ago when the locals expressed a keen desire to learn. Here 70 boys and girls are in general education and 135 young adults are learning different vocations like tailoring, karate, singing and dancing, panchi making (a Sanhtal dress), tribal jewellery making, cultivation of mushroom, turmeric and ginger, making of saal leaf plates(a machine has been provided). Some of them even run a small cafe that sells mushroom pakoras. Driving lessons are also given so that they can drive mini vans. Pandemic created havoc but things are slowly becoming normal said Indrani Ghosh.

Indrani Ghosh was introduced by Vinita Dutt and thanked by Sachiv Nijhawan.

MS PRIYANKA MAN-DAL an entrepreneur, is the founder of 'Clan Earth' which is a nature first sustainability focused brand that is India's first to work with

local artisans, to handcraft plastic free, cruelty free bags and plant 5 trees per product sold. In just one year clan earth has planted more than 3325 trees and diverted more than one ton plastic waste from landfills and water bodies. Priyanka and clan earth have been featured in 'Your Story' in Economic Times and many local and national papers and magazines. She has been living a zero waste life since 2018, only generating as little as 200 gm of waste per year by using various tools. An active member of Women's Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry West Bengal Sustainable Business Wing, she has conducted numerous workshops on waste management and has shared insights on sustainable living and starting up a sustainable business.
