EYE SPECIALIST Dr. DEBNATH CHATTOPADHYAY CASTS MICROSCOSPIC EYES ON WASH 5 AT BIRBHUM

5-7 January 2023, Birbhum Rajnagar, WASH 5 Global Grant, GG2092824



WASH 5, a thirty-three-thousand-dollar Global Grant project with Rotary Club of Battersea Park, for 75 toilets and 8 bore wells at Dara Pragati Sangha RCC, Krishnanagar/Jangipara RCC, Bishnupur RCC, and Birbhum started rolling when President Nominee Dr Debnath Chattopadhyay and PP Saumen Ray visited Narayanpur, Kharbona, Pathargaria, Baromese and Budhpur villages in Birbhum.

We met the villagers and delivered behaviour training for WASH 5.

Two agreements, one for toilets and the other one for bore wells were signed by Project In-charge Khoirasol Project for Tagore Society for Rural Development. However, we are holding back the cheques and contracts until the current organisational issues are resolved. Once addressed and done by TSRD, the contract and the cheques will be handed over to them by Dr. Debnath Chattopadhyay, who is the current custodian of these documents.

During our visit, we took stock of our entire work to date in 17 villages including Nityanagar, Danglepara, Sudraksipur, Bagdahari, Bandarberia, Marbhanga, Bandhagal, Moulbani, Abadnagar, Naraynpur, Budhpur, Baromese, and Pathargaria comprising over 300 toilets and 50 bore wells. All the toilets and bore wells are functioning properly with maintenance undertaken by the villagers.

We were welcomed by the villagers and our interaction resulted in scope for new projects for specially disabled villagers. These projects may cover impaired hearing (hearing aids), loss of limbs (prosthetic limbs/wheelchair), prevention of blindness giving spectacles, income generation (sewing machines), shoes/sandals for villagers to prevent contamination from ground such as hook worm, and other measures for prevention of diseases.

The appeal promulgated speedily through WhatsApp and PP Nandita Sen offered to donate funds for sandals to 40 households in Nityanagar for 200 inhabitants. Thank you Nanditadi, Debnath Chattopadhyay and PP Haladhar Dey will take necessary action for distribution within the next few weeks and contact you.

Dr Debnath Chattopadhyay is keen to provide a total solution to a group of villages in Birbhum where we have already worked, subject to Board approval of course. This is his vision.

Contracts for other components of WASH 5 in our three RCCs will be developed and concluded soon, for implementation under the supervision of Community Service Committee.

Editor's Note : If I were a Green Badger reading this, I would be bewildered with some of the expressions used. WASH is a Rotary International acronym for Water, Sanitation and Hygiene. Due to their interdependent nature these 3 core intervention issues are grouped together. GG stands for Global Grant, a system under which Rotary International channelises project funds from Rotary bodies and Clubs worldwide. The Primary Contact is primarily responsible for the end use of funds mobilised. Taking a project through the entire life cycle of a Global Grant is one of the most challenging endeavours in the Rotary ecosystem. This report is for WASH 5, which means that this is the 5th GG project under WASH for our Club.

PONDING PROJECTS – AT RCC DARA - THE ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE



A dream is slowly taking shape. Last year we had, with the help of 2 external donors – since this was at concept stage as a pilot, helped 2 beneficiaries in our Dara RCC catchment with one time support to dig ponds on their land. These ponds have retained monsoon water and now the primary results are visible. In Pond No. 1, they have started growing a vegetable patch and planted Rabi season rice, which otherwise would not have been possible without the water harvesting. In Pond No. 2, a second (Rabi) cropping is seen in the distance, here the water harvested is being used in the land of an adjoining farmer. Fish is also being farmed, although not commercially at this stage.

As may be surmised, value is already being derived by additional cropping and horticulture without any pressure on available water resources. This is significant, albeit incremental, in the overall scheme of things. However, the pilot is a success and now may be replicated. Yet, the aspirational model is as seen in Pond No. 3, where the pond also supports fruiting trees along the banks of the pond – the banks have been created by the soil dug out in the process of ponding; trees as we know are critical for the existence of humanity.

A holistic development project benefiting families, communities, and the environment, with one-time support to create a virtuous cycle, hence covering 2 Rotary areas of focus viz. growing local economies and supporting the environment. What is more the beneficiaries in both cases are women – Malati Mandal of Jadukhali PO in Jaynagar and Lotika Sardar Village Bapulrichak Jayanagar.


