Professor Tapati Guha-Thakurta

Topic: Durga Pujas of Contemporary Kolkata - "The UNESCO Award"

Tapati Guha-Thakurta studied at Presidency College, Calcutta University, and the University of Oxford. She is currently an Honorary Professor of History at the Centre for Studies in Social Sciences, Calcutta (CSSSC) and was its former Director from 2012 to 2017. She has written widely on the art and cultural history of modern India and has held several visiting fellowships abroad. Her three main books are "The Making of a New 'Indian' Art: Artists, Aesthetics and Nationalism in Bengal" and "Monuments, Objects, Histories: Institutions of Art in Colonial and Postcolonial India", and "In the Name of the



Goddess: The Durga Pujas of Contemporary Kolkata". She is also the author of some exhibition monographs - among them, "Visual Worlds of Modern Bengal, The Aesthetics of the Popular Print" and "The City in the Archive: Calcutta's Visual Histories" and has co-edited two anthologies of essays - "Theorising the Present: Essays for Partha Chatterjee" and "New Cultural Histories of India: Materiality and Practices". Since 1996, she oversaw the creation of a digital visual archive at the CSSSC that worked on documenting and cataloguing paintings, popular and commercial art, and photographs from different private collections in Kolkata. Among her recent assignments have been the setting up of the Jadunath Bhavan Museum and Resource, Kolkata (a unit of the CSSSC) in 2017, and the preparation in 2019 of a dossier on the Durga Pujas of Kolkata for the Ministry of Culture, Government of India, which has brought to the festival the coveted UNESCO inscription under its Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

She is here with us today to share with us her experience in the lead up to the UNESCO inscription.

SIKSHA LABH 9 -- LITERACY & BASIC EDUCATION

Location: Jagadbandhu Institution, Ballygunje Date: 14th Sept, 2022 Time: 11.00 AM





RC Calcutta inaugurated 9th phase of the ongoing project under Literacy & Basic Education — SIKSHA LABH 9 — at Jagadbandhu Institution, led by President

Raj Agrawal and Arindam Roy Choudhury, Chairperson, Community Services, along with about a dozen Club members, and for some it was a nostalgic moment, making a visit to their 'alma-mater'. PDG Rajani Mukherjee (also an ex-student of the school) graced the occasion as Chief Guest. The RC Calcutta team was warmly received by Rajat Ghosh, Teacher-in-charge, (a one-time school mate of PDG) and escorted the team to the Computer Lab room in 3rd Floor, where the 11 nos. Computers donated by the Club (with Windows 10 installed &each with its own UPS) were already set up in 'Live' condition. Ajay Mukherjee, President of the school Managing Committee, along with Avijit Bhattacharjee, Principal, welcomed the RC Calcutta team to the Lab room.

Jagadbandhu Institution is a 118-year-old school, was established in 1914, has 2,000 students approx. on-roll, roughly split into Elementary section (Class 1 to 4, having 800 students), Middle school (Class 5 to 8, having 650

students) and high school (Class 9 to 12, having 550). M/S Arpita & Moumita confirmed that MS Paint and introductory MS Word is taught in Elementary classes, and M/S Arijit & Debasish stated that students learn MS Word & MS Excel in Middle school, the focus being that on entering High school the boys are 'computer literate'. They expressed that the 'bank' of new computers donated by RC Calcutta would greatly facilitate in broad basing computer education in the school.

During his inaugural address President Raj emphasised computer familiarity has progressively become mandatory for education, and an early start only gives an advantage. Accordingly, the Club has this year taken a commitment of extending computer education to 10,000 school children per month; today's event is the 9th in the series of this project. At the request of President to elaborate on RILM's Vision & Activities, PDG Rajani in his address explained:

- i. RILM's goal of making India free of illiteracy within this decade,
- ii. informed the **Nation Builder Award** briefly detailing the process, the bottoms-up evaluation approach of Teachers, and invited the school authorities to register & adopt the process, as a strong recognition & encouragement to teachers who constitute the backbone of the education system,
- iii. The Adult Literacy scheme "Each one Teach One"- where students commit to educate one adult illiterate (adequate up to class 3 level, to read basic instruction at Rly Stations, Ration shops, Bus No, etc), over a 60 day tenure, with books & process support from RILM post registration in website. On course completion certificates are issued by Rotary jointly with NCRT.

PDG Rajani also stressed the long relationship Rotary has established with the school, and proudly pointed at a flag-stone on the wall where the 1st computer Lab was set up with computers donated jointly by 6 Rotary Clubs in 2003, when he was President of his Club - Calcutta Mid East. M/S Mukherjee & Bhattacharjee, Managing Committee and Principal respectively, thanked RC Calcutta for the computers, expressed their need for consistent drinking water supply during school hours, and hoped for some assistance in this regard. With extension of deep thanks & gratitude from either side, the event was concluded.

With 2000 students in Siksha Labh 9, the aggregate number of students accessing computers stands at 7,700 per month, and with RCC Ranihati and Bahara Girls in the pipeline, the figure would work out to 9,900.
