In a bid to further improve traffic management and safety in Kolkata, a 30-hour long special computer training session is to be held from 29 August for sergeants and constables of Kolkata Police (Traffic). Kolkata Police has been using smarter and modern infrastructure equipment which has been playing a crucial role in helping road safety.

This computer training programme has been designed to give traffic management a thorough education in the fundamentals of computer science, with an emphasis on the skills required to keep the roads safe and regulate the flow of traffic in good time. The initiative, held in association with the India Autism Centre and Rotary Club of Calcutta, hopes that with the growth in information technology, the sergeants and constables of Kolkata Police (Traffic) will be able to enrich their learning experience. It will help to document the record of traffic offences using computers, comprehensively.

The announcement of the event was made today in the presence of Pandey Santosh, IPS, Jt-CP (Traffic), Kolkata Police, Atul V, IPS, deputy commissioner of police (South), traffic department, Kolkata and other dignitaries.

Raj Kumar Agrawal, President, Rotary Club of Calcutta, said, "We are proud to offer the same high-quality curriculum and teaching of our computer science programmes to Kolkata Traffic Police personnel. We will provide plenty of optional modules to allow them to protect the community on the road. Barun Chanda is unique. And extraordinarily engaging in discussions. He sought an interactive session and Rotarians did not disappoint. His anecdotes were most interesting. Asked how he had first met Satyajit Ray, he said he had to 'engineer' an interview which he did through Desmond Doig of Junior Statesman! He carried a spool recorder to record the interview and in adherence to Murphy's Law, the machine decided to pack up. As his head blanked out

he recovered to remember the set of questions and they went through with the interview. Later Ray asked him to show the interview before it went to print, but young Barun would have none of it — his journalistic pride was hurt. Later he left a copy of JS for Ray to peruse and was complimented that the writing was accurate. The story does not end there. In Barun's words, Ray got it in his mind that Barun had a photographic memory. Hence when shooting for Seemabaddha, Ray did not give him a script sensing that Barun would memorise the script and lose spontaneity during the shoot. Other anecdotes followed, including one that involved co-actors Sharmila and Paromita. Barun was driving them someplace when they squabbled — and Barun had to threaten to stop the car if they did not stop their quarrel. Barun was diplomatic enough not to answer a question if the threat worked. On another occasion, a theatre person acting in one of Ray's films was having difficulty with his lines and started stammering the next day. Ray realized that taking time out of his theatre work — his bread and butter — the actor was nervous that he might be delayed for his theatre performance. Ray intuitively understood and released the actor for his theatre with another very human gesture "kheye jeyo." From the next take onwards, his performance was immaculate.

Barun then took time off to sign copies of his book "Satyajit Ray – The man who knew too much."
