SIKSHA LABH 7 -- LITERACY & BASIC EDUCATION

Location : Bunarati Yousuf Ismail Memorial High School Date : 3rd Sept, 2022 Time : 12 Noon





The 7th phase of the on-going project **SIKSHA Labh**, in Literacy & Basic Education, was opened at Bunarati Yousuf Ismail Memorial High School on 03.09.2022 by a team from RC Calcutta, led by Community Service Chair Person Rtn. Arindam Roy Chowdhury, along with Rtn. Ravindra Khandelwal.

This school is a Govt. Aided Higher Secondary School, its facilities extending from Class 5 through Class 12. The school caters to children of underprivileged section of society, originating from nearby villages of Matia, in Berachampa, North 24 Parganas. The school's facilities are co-educational, and student strength of this school is around 1400. Nearly 1400 student will benefit from this SIKHSA LABH project.

With the opening of this 7th project under SIKSHA LABH, the aggregate number of benificiaries stands at 4700 students from Seven Schools.

MEGA HEALTH CHECK UP CAMP AT SISTER NIVEDITA SCHOOL, DAKSHINESWAR

Location: Sister Nivedita School, Ramakrishna Mohamondal, Dakshineswar

Date : 3rd Sept, 2022

Time: 10.30 AM









RC Calcutta in collaboration with IMA (Bengal Chapter), organised a Mega Health Camp at Sister Nivedita School, Dakshineswar, and a team from RC Calcutta led by President Raj Kumar Agrawal and Hony. Secy. Anand Sharma, along with over 40 club members, inaugurated the Camp. Special projects committee chair Partha Pratim Mukherjee and Health committee chair Dr Sukalyan Purkayastha were instrumental in structuring the event. The RC Calcutta team arrived by multiple transport (a mix of cars & Metro), but assembled in time for the scheduled inauguration, and was warmly welcomed with refreshments, by the school authorities, including Raghunath Dey & son Rajashree Dey, Managing Trustees, Tanushree Raha and Tusu Ray, Head Mistress and Asst Head Mistress, resp. of the school.

The school (initially a Children's Home but without boarding facilities) was originally 'Jadu Mallick's Bagan Bari', is situated within and adjacent to Dakshineswar temple grounds. The building was Ramakrishna Dev's residence, and Swami Vivekananda was 'ordained' here. The team assembled in the Diksha Room, and it is said he received 'Christ Darshan' here, and a portrait of Mother Mary with baby Christ hung in the room, presented by Belur Math Maharaj. The school, established in 1968, has classes Nursery to Class IV, has approx. 100 students onroll, school hours are from 10.30 to 3.30 pm, school fees ranging from Rs 200/- to 250/- per student, curriculum includes language, religious literature, computer familiarisation, GK, and elementary quizzing. Pass outs from the school gets admitted into local government schools through usual admission mechanism. During its 50 years anniversary many old students visited and joined the felicitation.

The Health Camp offered multiple check-up facilities, including Paediatric, Orthopaedic, Gynaecology, Rheumatology, Internal medicine, General Medicine & General surgery, and Eye check-up. The specialist doctors who offered their voluntary services at the Camp included Dr. Anirban Dalui, Consultant Physician, Dr. Prasanta Kumar Bhattacharyya, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, Dr. Manindranath Ray, Orthopaedic Surgeon, Dr. Abhijit Choudhuri, Consultant Surgeon, Dr. Kunal Biswas, General Physician, and our very own Dr Sukalyan Purkayastha. 182 patients availed of the Health Camp facilities, 3 identified for IOL surgery, 22 requiring spectacles. The Camp concluded at 3.00 PM.

Once the Camp was in motion, 'event manager' Partha Pratim Mukherjee organised Mandir Darshan for all club members, and distribution of 'Prashad'.

GUEST SPEAKER DR. ROMENDU HOMCHAUDHURI'S TALK ON "THALASSEMIA PREVENTION & LIFESTYLE DISORDERS"

In a captivating talk in his 'mystical' voice, justifying his geniuses as District Chair, Thalassemia, Dr Romendu Homchaudhuri explained the dreaded decease of Thalassemia, with numerous illustrations and heart wrenching pictorial presentations. He stated Thalassemia is a blood disorder, affecting haemoglobin production in the human body, is congenital and inherited from parental bloodline. It is neither infective (i.e., infected from nature e.g. malaria, typhoid, plague), nor is it neoplastic (e.g. tumour, cancer, etc) and is not contagious (cannot transform into a pandemic like coronavirus). The early signs of Thalassemia in a child are that he is

less lively, has amnesia, and will have a lifespan not exceeding 6 years. The cost of treatment is enormous, with frequent blood transfusion costing Rs 1 Lakhs per month, or bone marrow transplant costing Rs 5 Lakhs, or Genetic modification (Gene therapy) which could aggregate to Rs 60 Lakhs & above. He also cautioned that blood transfusion gives extra iron into the body, which also settles around lungs, liver, kidney; this 'extra' layer needs to be taken out; while the blood transfusion may take 8 hours, taking out this redundant iron through celetine process takes over 4 days. In 10 days' time the next transfusion falls due! In India the picture is gruesome reaching endemic proportion, with 15,000 Thalassemia child, born every year, and 1.5 lakhs patients receiving blood transfusion on daily basis.

As prevention methodology for Thalassemia, an HBLC (HB-electrophoresis) blood test identifies whether a person is Beta+ve, and is considered a **carrier**; if both parents are carrier their off spring has a 25% chance of having Thalassemia. The only way of preventing Thalassemia is to ensure that **both parents are not carriers**. One parent being Beta+ve while other neutral, their off-spring won't be Thalassaemic. A healthy & balanced diet with natural iron supplements (eggs, banana, milk, etc) helps overcome amenia in normal child patients, once cleared post HBLC blood tests. He therefore (jokingly) advised Pres. Agrawal to spread the word at all levels of RC Calcutta and its RCCs that "Microscope before Horoscope" is a must & pre-condition for all matrimonial negotiations.
