## Smt. Shashi Panja

Minister-in-Charge, Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare, Govt. of W. Bengal

**Shashi Panja** is an medical practitioner and politician who currently serves as Cabinet Minister for the Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare of the Government of West Bengal.

P.V. Krishnaih (Pillalamarri Tenali), father of Panja, was Chief Industrial Engineer in Hindustan Motors. He lived his entire working life in the Hindmotor colony. Panja was brought up there and did her MBBS from R. G. Kar Medical College and Hospital at Kolkata, with specialisation in ultrasound and infertility practice. She married Dr. Prasun Kumar Panja, son of the veteran politician Ajit Kumar Panja. She is daughter-in-law of Ajit Kumar Panja.

Panja was elected a councillor of Kolkata Municipal



Corporation in 2010 and was appointed mayoral council member in charge of education.

She was elected to the West Bengal State Assembly from Shyampukur (Vidhan Sabha constituency) in 2011 and re-elected in 2016 and 2021 from same constituency

She was inducted into the Council of Ministers of West Bengal as a minister of state and given independent charge of the Women & Child Welfare Department in December 2013.[5] In May 2014, she was given additional charge of the Social Welfare Department.

In 2021 she was sworn in as the cabinet minister as a part of the 21st Council of Ministers for the state of West Bengal under the leadership of Mamata Banerjee with the portfolios of Department of Women and Child Development and Social Welfare.



## PUBLIC IMAGE COMMITTEE NEWS

### PUBLIC IMAGE COMMITTEE CONNECTS WITH HERITAGE

The 'Public Image' committee has launched a landmark project to recognize and partner with heritage properties in Kolkata in order to enhance the image of our Club and create awareness of our service and activities. We believe, this would greatly help in bringing in new members, expand community partnerships and improve fundraising opportunities for Rotary Club of Calcutta.

In the first phase, the committee is in active discussion with about half a dozen properties for installing plaques to bring forward the visibility of the Rotary Club of Calcutta. During the months of August and September 2021, the committee members visited properties mentioned below.

### The Oberoi Grand

The Oberoi Grand fondly referred to as the Grand Dame of Chowringhee, has been an icon on the landscape of Kolkata for over a century.

In June 1951, Rotary Club of Calcutta decided to make 'The Oberoi Grand Hotel', the venue for its meetings. In 1951 with the help of Rotarian M. S. Oberoi, the Club was able to establish an office in the Grand Hotel building. The official venue of the Club's weekly meetings was shifted to Rotary Sadan in the 2003-2004.

Our full day Plenary Session of the Centenary Year was held at The Oberoi Grand Hotel on January 01, 2020. The session was attended by about 250 Rotarians and guests, including visitors from Egypt, Bangladesh, Europe and USA.



### The Lalit Great Eastern Hotel

The Great Eastern Hotel is a colonial era hotel, established in 1841, at a time when Calcutta, the seat of the East India Company, was the most important city in India.

Referred to as "the Jewel of the East" in its heyday, Great Eastern Hotel hosted several notable persons visiting the city. After 1947, the hotel continued its business till the state government took over its Management. In 2005 it was sold to a private company and it reopened in November 2013 after an extensive renovation as The LaLiT Great Eastern Kolkata.

Our club's first meeting was held on September 26th, 1919 which took place in the Peliti's Restaurant at Government Place, Dalhousie, Calcutta. After a few years, the Club moved to the Great Eastern Hotel for meetings and the first Middle Asia convention of Rotary was held at the Great Eastern Hotel, Calcutta on 29th August 1932.

Flurys over the decades has become an intrinsic part of Kolkata's culture. This legendary eatery continues to evoke strong emotions among generations. Memories mingle with meals as members of the Flurys 'family' keep dropping in for years. Visitors from around the world come back for a taste of Flurys whenever they are passing through.

## "World Suicide Prevention Day, 2021" on 10th September 2021




Chief Guest for the event was Ms. Madhurima Das, Psychologist, Medica Super speciality Hospital who answered all questions by the students.



### SAFETY IN DIGITAL FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS

With digital financial transactions becoming more and more extensive thanks to the ease that it offers, it may be appropriate to list some safeguards to protect against identity theft and financial loss as a result of it:

- 1. Check for "https" on the link that is being used for making any transactions. The "s" stands for secured and offers higher safety of usage
- 2. Keep passwords easy to remember but difficult to guess. Change regularly
- 3. While using ATM, ensure that no gadgets attached to the card slot. Also if people are standing close by in a queue, request them to stand back
- 4. Opt for 2 factor authentication wherever available (this is the case where apart from passwords and other static c o d e s, a One Time Password OTP is sent to the mobile to complete the transaction
- 5. Be wary that your mobile has not been active or does not have connectivity for long periods of time. Contact your operator to ensure that no duplicate SIM is being issued against your number
- 6. Consider buying insurance against cybercrime / frauds
- 7. Log off from banking portal and delete history after completing transactions. Close App if on Mobile
- 8. Don't click on links links coming on email and SMS coming from unknown / suspicious sources
- 9. Do not activate screen share software with unknown persons
- 10. No financial transactions to be done ever on public computers
- 11. Don't accept Credit / Debit card if the envelope is torn.

Fraudsters out there are ready to pounce. The tactic is to induce a fear factor (e.g. your account will be deactivated) or greed (e.g. reward awaits you if you do xyz). Don't take such calls. Eternal vigilance is the price for convenience.


