Masti ki Patshala, an event supported by NGO – Education on Wheels (Hope Foundation), is an initiative undertaken every year by the Interact Club (Horizon) of Mahadevi Birla World Academy. It is an inclusive event aiming to bring underprivileged children and our school students on a collaborative platform.

This year students conducted a Cyber Security Awareness Campaign for NGO children belonging to Hope Foundation. It was held on 25th June, Saturday and was conducted offline.

The event was initiated by a heartfelt welcome address given by Ms. D. Roy Ma'am. After an ice-breaking session, a presentation was shown highlighting the essence of cyber security in this digital world.
