Vice-Chancellor, Bankura University Topic: Self-learning Materials and New Learning **Modes: Experiments in Traditional Universities**

Deb Narayan Bandyopadhyay is the Vice Chancellor, Bankura University, West Bengal, India. He was Professor in the Dept of English, Burdwan University, India. He is also the Secretary of the Indian Association for the Study of Australia, Eastern Region and Indian Association of Scottish Studies. In 2001 he was invited to give a course of lectures on "Nineteenth-century Representations of Shakespeare in India" at the University of Vienna, Shakespeare Society of Vienna and the University of Salzburg. He also visited the University of Edinburgh and lectured at a seminar organised at Mansfield College, Oxford in 2002, with assistance from British Council. He was nominated for the Fulbright Exchange



Summer Institute Program in 2003 and he worked at Northern Illinois University, University of Chicago and the State University of New York. He was awarded fellowships by the Australia-India Council in 2005 and 2006, and was a Distinguished Visiting Scholar at Monash University (School of English, Communication and Performance Studies) in 2007. He was the Visiting Research Fellow at the University of New South Wales (School of History and Philosophy) in 2010-12. He was the Honorary Adjunct Senior Research Fellow at Monash University (School of English, Communication and Performance Studies, Australian and Indigenous Studies: 2009-2018). He has published and co-edited many scholarly books, and is the author of innumerable papers. He is also the international contributing editor of the Journal of American History (Indiana, USA). He was the Project Leader of a research project on Gerontology working in collaboration with the University of Swansea, Wales which has been funded by UKIERI (UK-India Education and Research Initiative), 2014-2016. He is also a creative writer and his poems have been published in different journals of India and abroad.






