Susobhan Sinha

Regional Director, Reserve Bank of India, Kolkata

Born in Kolkata in November 1961, Susobhan Sinha studied in St. Xavier's Collegiate School, Kolkata and graduated from St. Xavier's College, Kolkata with honours in Economics in 1984. He obtained his Masters Degree in Economics from the University of Calcutta in 1986. He achieved a first class degree in both graduation and post-graduation. He attended the Advanced Management Programme in Wharton School of Business, University of Pennsylvania in 2019.

Currently, Mr. Sinha is posted as Regional Director, Reserve Bank of India, Kolkata from March 2020 onwards.

Prior to this, some of his recent positions were as under:

- Chief General Manager and Secretary to the RBI Central Board (2017 – 2020)
- General Manager in Department of Non-Banking



- General Manager in Internal Debt Management Department (2013-2014)
- Chief of Staff in RBI Governor's Office. (2010-2012)
- Mr. Sinha considers the following as his career highlights:
 - Being instrumental in activating market intelligence (MI) activities in Department of Non-Banking Supervision (DNBS), RBI, Bengaluru. DNBS was able to identify the fraudulent activities in IMA Ponzi scheme as early as 2015 through its effective MI efforts which was then highlighted to the Government of Karnataka for taking action.
 - Taking the help of Yakshagana (a local art form) and skits to alert the public in far flung districts of Karnataka on the perils of falling prey to unauthorised deposit schemes.
 - Being the Indian representative in a group under the aegis of Bank for International Settlements (BIS), Basel, Switzerland on Central Bank Operating Frameworks and Collateral Markets. This group was headed by the Deputy Governor, Bank of Canada.
 - Being the first In-Charge of the Financial Stability Unit of the Reserve Bank of India in 2009. Had set up the unit and was instrumental in preparing the first Financial Stability Report of the Reserve Bank of India - the focus areas in which were financial institutions, markets, infrastructure and stress testing.
- Being a member of the Committee on Financial Sector Assessment which was a joint initiative of the Government of India and the Reserve Bank of India. The Committee produced a comprehensive assessment report of the Indian financial sector in March 2009.
- Being the Indian representative and country co-ordinator for the co-ordinated compilation exercise of FSIs – an IMF initiative where 62 countries participated.
- Being the first domestic market securities dealer when the Reserve Bank started conducting active open market operations and repo auctions in government securities in 1992-93. Had set up the government securities dealing room in the Reserve Bank of India.

An avid reader, his non-academic interests lie in short stories of the classic genre and is especially interested in Bengali literature both fiction and non-fiction. Other than reading Mr. Sinha also has keen interest in sports, music and movies.

THE CLUB HAS A NEW RCC

Venue: JSWS site in Hasnabad

Date: 22nd Aug, 2021

Time: 12.30 PM



A team from R C Calcutta led by Sujata Pyne, President, representing the Community Services Committee, and comprising of Rtn.s Arindam Roy Choudhury, Chair Person, Partha Pratim Mukherjee and Amit Ghosh, travelled to Joygram in Hasnabad, South 24 Parganas district, to hand over the Charter to the newly formed RCC - Joygram Social Welfare Society. On arrival the team was graciously welcomed by the society officials and a large gathering of Society beneficiaries and village folk. The welcome team led by President Niresh Kumar Baidya and Arikul Islam Mondal, Founder & Secretary (who performed the dual role of chief co-ordinator and manning the public address system), and the guests were showered with traditional flower petals. After a brief address to the gathering by President Sujata, she formally installed the RCC and handed over the Charter. Rtn Arindam stepped in and advised that the Charter needs to be properly displayed at all times in a central location of the society office and that it's a mandatory requirement.

Joygram Social Welfare Society was formed in 2012 by a group of teacher social worker, with a 'Vision' to enable equal opportunity to everybody – physically handicapped, specially gifted, orphaned from surrounding village community, and a 'Mission' to enhance the life standard of marginalised & vulnerable. Their 'Objectives' include empowerment of the marginalised, and promote development through education, healthcare, agriculture and 'self-help' group formation. On their own they do receive guidance & support from various organisations, e.g. distribution of sewing machines and formation of 'Selai' school by Usha Sewing Machines Co, mushroom farming by Cognizant Technologies, monthly health check-up by Aarogya Vahini, Govt of WB, etc. The Society caters to many disabled and handicapped children, 'specially gifted' (cerebral palsy). 120 children are enlisted with the society from the nearby villages. Special education classes take place 3 days a week where communication skills, colour identifications, and special courses are being followed. Mrs. Papiya Sulltana wife of the secretary has been trained from Bon Hooghly, Kolkata to take care of the treatment part of the special children. There are 8 teachers who are taking care of the children. They visit the children at home 3 days a week. The society also works in the nearby villages holding health camps, distribution of relief items during floods, cyclones and other natural calamities.

Immediately after installation of Joygram as an RCC, President Sujata distributed 120 'Wellness Kits' to the children – kits supplied by RILM and containing vitamins, Horliks, Biscuits, Detol Soap, Sanitizer, juice cartons, etc.

There after a full 'sit-down', lunch funded by RC Calcutta, was extended to all the 120 gifted children and their attendants, as well as the society members present. President Sujata and Rtn Arindam personally supervised the lunch, and the president took pleasure in serving the food items herself.

Once the lunch had commenced the RC Calcutta team humbly took permission from the Society president and the Secretary to leave. Before leaving the Secretary presented a memento to each RC Calcutta team member, and after taking a group photo, started the return journey and departed.
