- Circle - connections to one another
- Dots around it - Our People
- There are 7 Dots because of our Rotary's 7 areas of focus
- Circle + dots around it - Navigation star, our guiding light
- Green solid line - digging stick (used when doing hard work); for us it's People of Action, represents the tools for getting things done
- Colors: Purple, Green & White -
- Celebrate DEI- Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.
- Freedom to express ourselves differently but still with a special connection.
- Purple- Polio
- Green- the Environment
- White - Peace

Represents Empowerment and Newness and also the colours were utilised for the women's movement giving us the opportunity to grow our female membership.

## The 4-Way Test



Created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. This 24-word code of ethics for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The 4-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways.

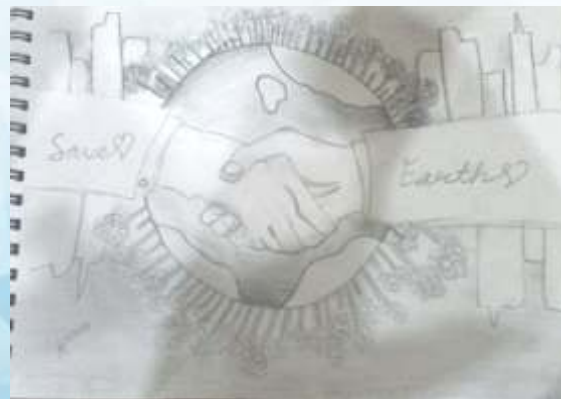

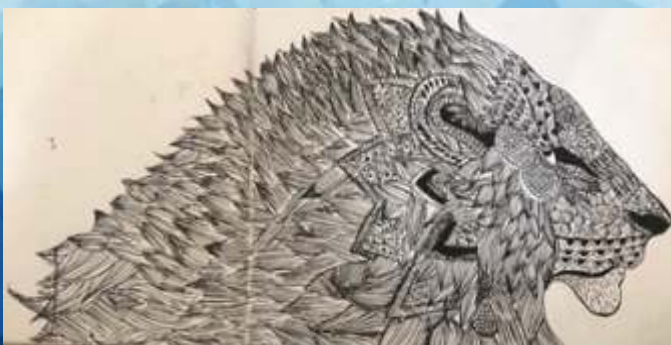

“Mummy look, we can go in this shop!” the little girl clapped her hands with joy and started pushing her mother's wheelchair towards a bright and cheerful shop which offered something the neighboring shops did not. Yes, you guessed right – a wheelchair ramp! A small wedge of concrete or rubber which makes life so much easier for wheelchair bound persons. Like the mother of this little girl, such individuals ' lives are focused on finding places where they can find this elusive structure to help them do their daily chores. Unfortunately, their search is not very fruitful.

It is a sad reality that so many 'posh' buildings fail to provide this small structure called a ramp. It makes one wonder – Can't the builders afford to build one? Or are they worried it might spoil the building's beautiful façade? Even government buildings and public transport don't provide means for wheelchair accessibility. Why have we, as a society turned a blind eye to the needs of people who have lost their ability to move about independently by a cruel twist of fate. Is it truly a JUNGLE RAAJ – Survival of the fittest? These are smart, intelligent people who are fully capable of living independent, productive lives. They just need a 'helping hand' to “stand up on their own two feet”- figuratively.
