

THE LIMITLESS GAME

I was reading about Serena Williams, 23 time Grand Slam champion, who recently lost US Open in round 3. It was not her best game. Perhaps the most glittering career might come to an end as she is planning to retire shortly. However, more heart winning was Sachin Tendulkar's tweet to the tennis star, a slice of which I should put here in precise words.

"Age is not what body tells you, but what mind tells the body. Teenagers can solve world's biggest problems, adults can pick up something new and excel".

However, the thought that came to my mind was that all legendary careers, whether they were that of Serena or Sachin, would eventually come to an end and new stars will emerge. Let the stars come and go; the ball must be kept rolling. If you observe careers of these sports legends, you will realise, the game need not be about winning or losing a match; but rather about just staying in the game. This thought applies to nations and humanity too. Who won the Afghan war: the one who wanted to defeat the opponent with power or the one who vigorously sustained the will to stay in the game? It also holds true to organizations like Rotary. I must confess here that, I never believed that Project Planet Savior would survive for long. May be I over-analyzed the hurdles in the project, thinking of myself as some wise man. I was unable to identify with the vigour of the teenager-*ish* rebelliousness against the use of plastic our Rotarians contained. Then again, who would have thought we would once see a daughter and a father, a mother and a son gather in a room to address concerns about menstruation and puberty in our society? Is it believable? Red Revolution proved us wrong.

There is tonne more to be done in Rotary. The key is to avoid falling into the trap of playing to win; it is a limitless game.
