## HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF NASHIK

Rotary club of Nasik was sponsored by Rotary club of Bombay. Late Rao Bahadur A. G. Gokhale organised the first meeting of the club on 20-12-1944. The first President of club was Sardar N.G. Vinchurkar, Charter Secretary was Rao Bahadur A.G. Gokhale, Charter members were 21. Charter was granted on 23-3-1945. (Charter No. 5935). Club celebrated its silver jubilee in the year 1969-70. In the silver jubilee year President was Isaq-Rangwala, Secretary was Dr. M.D. Rajpathak and membership was 44. Club celebrated its golden jubilee in 1994-95, Club - President was Rtn. Dr. Rohit Shah, Secretary was Rtn. Vivek Athawale and membership was 88. This year our club is celebrating Platinum Jubilee 2019-20, Club President Adv Manish Chindhade, Secretary Dr Mrs Shreeya Kulkarni with membership 172. Initial meetings of the club were held at Santosh garage. Thereafter meetings were held at Red Cross Hall, Sarvajanik Vachanalaya, I.M.A. Hall. Club acquired its own land from Nashik Municipal Corporation in year 1981-82 by active efforts of Rtn. Khushal Poddar and Datta Nathe, Dr. V. P. Gupte and Administrator Talreja. Rotary charitable trust of Rotary Club of Nasik was formed in year 1983-84, charter trustees being Dr. Appa Pawar, Bachubhai Joshi and P.G. Mehta and R.K. Gupta. Aim of the trust was to properly develop Rotary hall and Community hall and to take care of assets of Rotary Club of Nasik. From 1985 onwards meetings were held at basement hall of Rotary hall

### Rotarynama

Our bulletin named 'Rotarinama' obtained 1st Trophy for best bulletin during a tenure of PP Balasaheb Joshi as a President. Since then the, tradition of printing out good bulletins is maintained.

### Major Notable Projects by RCN:

- Almost 50,000 family planning operations were done by Rtn. PDG. Dr. Appa Pawar & Dr. V. N. Pawar which is a record Laparoscopes were donated by Rtn.RK.Gupta to Rotary Club of Nasik.
- 1971-72 An Ambulance was donated to Indian Medical Association Nasik.
- 1975-76 Massive eye Camp-358 patients were operated at Ayurved Hospital.
- 1980-81 Massive diagnostic and surgery camp for physically handicapped was organised.
- 1982-83 Water Tank with a tap at Khatvad village.
- 1984-85 350 Adivasi group marriages provided a distinguished service award to R.C. of Nasik under the leadership of Dr V. N. Pawar.
- 1991- 92 10000 copies of Khumbmela Margadarshika booklets were printed and distributed to Yatries of Simhastha.
- 1994-95 President was Dr Rohit Shah. Golden Jubilee Year. Rotary Health Society founded to provide health awarness programme by organising lectures in regional languages. Rs 250001- were donated by PP Shantilal Lodha for this cause from Deepchand F a k i r c h a n d L o d d h a T r u s t . Physiotherapy centre started through donation of Rs. 1.25 lacs by a Panchavati Panjarapole Trust to take care of physically handicapped.

### Nashik Bhooshan Awards

During 1996- 97, under the presidency of Vijay Kothari. Nashik Bhooshan Awards were instituted to recognise people who have contributed to uplift the image of Nasik in the Map of Maharashtra. Till date the awardees include Kusumagraj allies Tatyasaheb Shirwadkar, Vasant Kanetkar, Vasantrao Gupte, Vinayakdada Patil, Shantabai Dani, Dr. Vasant Pawar, Bapu Nadkarni, Babubhai Rathi, Kusumtai Patvardhan, Balasaheb Datar, Sudhakar Bhalerao,



Benjan Desai, Dr. Narendra Jadhav, Uttam Kamble, Vijay Kakatkar, Devendra Bapat, Rajendra Bagve, Amol Chitnis, Vinayak Govilkar. Ar Sanjay Patil to name a few.

In 1997-98, under the Presidential leadership of Ganesh Lad, a permanent vocational training centre started at Harsul in adiwasi Area.- from a donation from Mr. Patil of U.S.A. through Maharashtra Sanskrutik Mandal functioning at U.S.A.

Subsequent presidents implemented and executed a number of projects like Bal Sahitya Jatra Cataract Camps, Yoga Classes, RYLA Niramaya Nasik, a project for comprehensive development of Nasik City, Uniform distribution for Tribal students, water management projects-rain water harvesting projects, Dishavedh-counselling centre, Arthritis knee braces camps, Rural library, Rotary Gram Sanivani- Rural Development project, RFE visit to Pakistan, Membership reached all time high figure of 104, Matching Grant Project for toilets in villages like Manur and Nave Nirpur, donations of Benches, Solar Equipments and water coolers to schools in Tribal area.

#### Service Partners:

Club has various partners in service such as Innerwheel Club, Rotaract Club, Interact Club, Rotary Community Corps, Senior Citizens Club etc. All these are actively organising their own projects. The interact movement received a great boost and now number stands at more than 50 clubs.

Club completed several matching grant and global grant projects such as Borewell with a storage tank at village Talegaon (Dindori), provision of Nutritive food at Ashramshala at village Ambe of Taluka Surgana, happy schools, equipment at neonatal ICCU at Nelson hospital and cardiac cath-lab at Magnum Hospital etc.

Club has sponsored students for IYE and members for GSE programmes.

#### Donation for TRF/ Foundation Giving

As of now, a total of 136 Paul Harris fellows (\$1000 donations) and 29 major donors (\$10000

donations) and 7 Benefactors are there in the club, with an all time giving by club of \$426283. Club has won recognition at district level and RI level on several occasions. Club got 11 trophies for outstanding work done in all 4 avenues of Rotary service in year 1994-95 a golden jubilee year of the club. PDG Dr Appasaheb Pawar, PDG Balasaheb Joshi and PP Dr, Ramesh Karkare have also been awarded Service Above Self Award.

Till date, the club has med its presence felt in the society and has a number of service projects to its credit. During the last few years, the club reached phenomenal heights under the dynamic and visionary leadership of various Presidents. A record number of Community Service projects including clean hands and cut nails, bench distribution and bunk bed distribution, cataract surgeries were completed successfully and a mammoth turnover of funds was handled efficiently. Microcredit Projects in collaboration with Magasaysay Awardee Smt Neelima Mishra was another highlight of the year. During 2013-14, E-Bulletin was started. Anti tobacco campaign was launched in schools. Public Awareness programme for detection of breast cancer was commendable.

Some of the recent permanent projects include check dams at Shivshet near Peth, school class rooms construction and renovation at Ganeshgaon, hostel buildings for boys and girls at Igatpuri, skin bank and mortuary box at Vedant Hospital. These projects have been funded by various CSR initiatives of corporates.

The membership reached a record high of 217 members in 2016-17. The club enjoys excellent fellowship and family events full of entertainment, quality time.

The club has a constitution and a leadership development plan in place. Club president and secretary are selected posts and are groomed for 3-4 years before assuming the position. Rest of the board is elected through an unbiased open election process, overseen by an election committee.

# STORY OF DAREWADI.....

## DISPLACED VILLAGE TO SELF SUSTAINED VILLAGE

Darewadi was a tribal village displaced due to proposed dam site in a region surrounded by mountains in Igatpuri taluka of Nashik district. Three years back the situation was like a nightmare for villagers because they have to forcefully leave their homes and shift to temporarily build tin shades. Proposed rehabilitation village site was 3km away on the top of hill ! It was like a plain table top and everything needed to be built.....at that time our Nation builder award winner teacher was posted in the primary school of this village. For him it was like a punishment because he was landed on highly troubled ground. He has to take classes in extremely adverse conditions, and none of student was willing to join school.

Team of Rotary club of Nasik visited the village site and assured him for every possible help. This assurance gave him a big relief and he dropped idea of getting transferred to some other school.

And the journey began

Our team visit the village and distributed educational material, old clothes , toys, shoes, cupboard and what not....help started pouring. This visit and help was like a surprise for them because they were not expecting any outsider in such remote area.

The challenge was to bring students to the school, we revisited at the time of Diwali and distributed sweets, toys, good clothes and sports material to the kids. We started periodical visits to this village and every time with some or other help. During our visit entire village used to gather and they feel very happy and never allowed us to leave without breakfast . It was so satisfying that we started feeling like we are taking happiness and learning a lesson how to be a happy inspite of all adversities.

Slowly and steadily 100% attendance was achieved. In monsoon we distributed raincoats and sandals, in summer we realised

that tin shades heat up , we arranged pedestal fans.

Within a years time new school building was ready. It was merely a structure, to turn it to a smart school, interacters got involved in decorating walls with theme painting.

In front of school corridor flower bed was planted.

Useful trees were planted all along school wall. Many villagers got involved in making school more beautiful. Students accepted the challenge of watering plants in summer and that too in pandemic. Within six months time handsome growth of plants was visible and colorful flowers on many plants made little school students very happy. Pandemic situation could not stop these students to come to school for watering plants even in peak summer. Water was not available nearby, they used to fill plastic bottles from some natural pond for watering these plants. This resulted in 100% survival of plants.

Water scarcity

It was hard to believe that villagers who sacrificed their homes for a dam, faced scarcity of water in summer. Submersible pumps fitted to lift water to a village water tank were not working since long. We immediately got this pump repaired and again it helped bring smile on the innocent faces.

Play Ground

Playground was not ok for any kind of sports activities. This play ground was levelled by adding one foot layer of good sand. All plumbing and repair work was done to bring water to washrooms.

Van Aushadhi Udyan (Medicinal plants garden)

Back side area of the school was utilised for



planting medicinal plants, which are useful for curing many diseases. Natural contour was utilised and step garden was developed

Future plans

Nursery vegetable saplings and fruit plants were distributed to individuals for their kitchen garden to make them self sufficient for their daily nutritious vegetable requirements.

1. To make village 100% literate
2. Start a library in the village
3. Make village smoke and tobacco free
4. Career counseling for students
5. Build skill development training center

Cycles for girls

For all of above, road map for three years is ready and future leadership is involved in each of the project with long term goals

It was observed that many girls drop the education due to lack of conveyance to reach higher secondary schools. In remote areas high schools are 3 to 4 kilometres away from the village. Cycle distribution helped girls to continue their education.

RCC Clubs

Two RCC clubs were formed to get involvement of local youth to help implement various ongoing projects in the village . This will also help in getting clear idea of exact necessities. Training was imparted to members of RCC club.

Impact and Results

1. After passing through all adversities, things have become normal and villagers are now optimistic for better living conditions and prosperity.
2. No drop outs and more than 90% attendance in school achieved.
3. Plantation around school premises and along pathways help generate involvement of village youth and students
4. Implementation of projects will accelerate after formation of RCC clubs
5. Rotary reached to every house of the village and even small students know about Rotary
6. Timely assistance at the time of water scarcity could generate very good image about Rotary
7. Each of the project is supported with involvement and contribution of

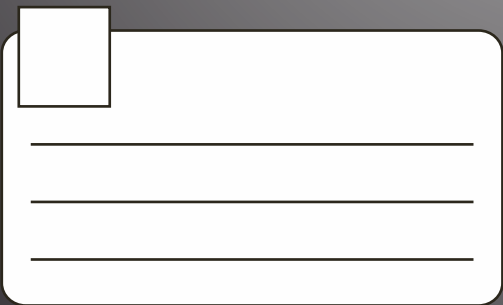
