Rtn. Deepak Agarwal, Secretary readout the minutes of last Club Assembly held on 4 Aug 2022. He informed the house that suggestions given by the members were



incorporated by PP Aalok Mehrotra, Director, Club Service. The minutes of the last Club Assembly were approved by the house.

#### Plans & Projects - VOCATIONAL SERVICE for 2022-23

As part of Rotary's guiding principles and the Avenues of Service, Vocational Service calls on Rotarians to empower others by using their unique skills and expertise to address community needs and help others discover new professional opportunities and interests.

On this premises Rotarian Rajat Aggarwal, Director Vocational Service, began his report on three committees. Each committee is entrusted with the responsibility of carrying out its duties under the supervision of a Chairman under the guidance of the Director and of the Club Leadership.

#### Vocational Awards - PP Sharad Gupta

This year we shall be identifying and honoring works and efforts of individuals who's service to the community is unparalleled and those who go beyond their capacity to help, guide and serve to the fullest. We shall also like to appreciate and honor the efforts of Asha workers and Aanganwadi workers who have been instrumental in bridging the gap between the Government welfare schemes and the community in general.

We shall also try to identify various self help groups (SHG's) mainly run



by women in Mussoorie in helping the local community at large. The Committee also suggests that the awards event / events be a little different this time by adding cultural activities by school students and the talented youth of the town which shall also expand periphera of Rotary image.

#### • Rotary Community Corps - PP Suresh Aggarwal

The Committee this year proposes to reach out to a few villages in the vicinity like Suakholi, Bataghat, etc and open up Usha Silai Schools at a residents home. This would help the local people there to connect with Rotary and know more about Rotary. Another way of getting connected to local

Another way of getting connected to local community is to help them with their basic needs of

documents. This includes helping the people with their Adhaar cards, Ayushaman Health Cards, other basic documents etc. A lot of people find it difficult to get the same registered in their name and sometime it becomes really challenging for making alteration. We propose to team with a CSC center and do monthly visits at the proposed Community Corps and through the same, help the local identified community.

By this we would be able to reach out to the people who have not been able to come in touch with service projects of Rotary.

#### ◆Rotary Vocational Training Centre (RVTC) - PP Deepak Gupta

The committee proposes weekly visit by a Doctor whose services are not available in Mussoorie like ENT, Eye Specialist etc.

The committee also proposes a weekly visit by a CSC center representative to help the community in their required documentation.

The Committee has spoken to Tally Authorized Training Centre, the representatives of which are keen to open center at RVTC, which would help youths of the town in learning the updated ways of computerized accounting and then get recruitment in and around Mussoorie and so uplift their living and support their families.

We also propose to run professional diploma courses in sewing, stitching, beautician, hospitality, nursing and electrician. This would help the local community to raise their income levels and help overcome unemployment. We need to nurture and take precise care of all our students in seeing to it that each one as per their caliber gets a recruitment in and around Mussoorie. This will create a confidence amongst the community for Rotary. We are in touch with Usha Silai School, Singer Sewing and Creative Design Courses, Vedanta Foundation Rojgaar, Skill

India and Saathiya Foundation for the same. Hope this year we are able to widely Imagine Rotary and so help the community in imagining and fulfilling their dreams with us.

#### Plans & Projects - INTERNATIONAL SERVICE for 2022–23

While presenting his report Director International Service, PP Kuldip Mathur informed that International service exemplifies our Global reach in promoting Peace & Understanding. We support by sponsoring or volunteering on International Projects, seeking Partners abroad.

International Service encompasses efforts to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the World. Rotary International encourages Rotary Clubs to develop projects that address priority needs of the Society. The members of Rotary Mussoorie have been generously donating to the Ro-

tary Foundation.

The total contribution of Rotary Mussoorie, till date has been 1,09,796 US\$ to The Rotary Foundation. We have 58 Donors who are friends of Rotary, 38 Rtn Donors, 3 Major Donors and 123 PHFs. We are proud to be a Hundred percent Paul Harris Club.

There are three committees which come under the International Service:

#### ◆ Rotary Foundation - PP Pankaj Jain

The process of requesting the members to donate for the Rotary Foundation should be initiated at the beginning of the rotary year, with regular reminders, rather than in the second half of the Rotary year. This will

simplify the collection of funds for the Foundation.

The target set by the Governor for our Club is 5000 US \$. We have already made a start with Mrs. Harshada Vohra offering 200 \$ for The Foundation, but this is just the beginning.

A quiz contest on Rotary Foundation will be held, and the winners will be suitably rewarded. The Club has in it's kitty 1497/02 Foundation Recognition Points, which can be used to fund a PHF in the making.

#### • Grants - PAG Shaillender Karanwal

The Global Grants are for large projects that can span over a full Rotary Year and beyond. Whereas the Districts Grants are intended to fund short term projects which are completed within that Rotary year.

Rotary Mussoorie has, in the past, taken up some major projects with the help of International Partners.



#### ◆ The Pulse Polio - PP N K Sahni

The Club follows the NIDs and regularly sets up Polio Booth at the Tilak Library. PP Nitish Mohan Aggarwal feels that there has to be a greater participation of the members on the National Immunization days.

The Club has been a participant in the eradication of Polio with each member contributing 30 \$ in the past. The Club has organized WGM (World's Greatest Meal) with great pomp and show, and the proceeds have been sent for Polio Eradication. PP Nitish Mohan Aggarwal is quite enthusiastic about organizing the WGM this year also. He is of the opinion that a charity box be placed at every meeting and the collection should be used for polio Eradication.

Although, India is a polio free Nation, but we cannot afford to be complacent. We have to continue our fight against Polio with the same thrust & vigor as in the past. There have been reports of unconfirmed polio cases in the US, where as UK intends to earmark funds for Polio booster doses.

## 25 Aug - A Talk by Former D.G., Indian Coast Guard and presently member of National Disaster Management Authority

A feather in the cap of Rotary Mussoorie this week, was the talk on Disaster management by shri Rajendra Singh, former Director General, Indian Coast Guard and presently, Member, national Disaster Management Authority. To listen to this eminent speaker, Rotary Mussoorie had invited doctors, public servants, traders,



hoteliers, college students and teachers besides Rotarians. After a



customary welcome by the President; PP Vinesh Sanghal, Director Community Service introduced the guest speaker.

Shri Rajendra Singh, after completing his education from Mussoorie and Dehradun, joined the Indian Coast Guard in 1980. His determination to excel was recognized early in service and this enabled him to hold prestigious assignments in staff and command, both afloat and ashore. He had the distinction of commanding ships like The Interceptor Boat, Inshore and Off Shore Patrol Vessels and The Advanced Off Shore Patrol Vessel. His meticulous planning resulted in apprehension of numerous maritime economic offenders for which he was recognized with the

award of Tatrakshak Medal in 1990 and Presidents' Tatrakshak Medal in 2007. During his long service spanning almost four decades, the Flag Officer was actively involved in capacity building of the Indian Coast Guard and also attained expertise in Offshore operations and as Director General, he concurrently served as Chairman, National Maritime Search and Rescue Board and held other prestigious offshore assignments as well. It is to his credit that he steered the Coast Guard to become a very effective agency in fighting the drug menace.



His expertise in efficiently handling crisis situations like Tsunami made him an automatic choice as member National Management Authority, post retirement; an assignment he hold with aplomb.

Lauding the effort of Rotary Mussoorie in organizing this workshop; the learned speaker began with a brief outline plan of Disaster Management, prepared by the Govt. Of India. He went on to sensitize the audience about various disasters that can occur. His knowledge and statistical information kept the audience spell bound. Talking about the requirement at the local level, he stressed the need for creating a team of volunteers, who are readily available when the need arises. These volunteers should visit the town and nearby areas acquaint themselves of the localities. Even N.S.S. volunteers should be roped in.

Winding up his talk he said that preparation to meet a disaster, preventing it from happening was the first step. This would lead to capacity building within the community. Such preparations would ultimately help in mitigating the disaster.

The learned speaker handed over Literature on Disaster Management to the President, which included National Guidelines for Preparation of Actin Plan - Prevention and Management of Cold Wave and Frost,



National Policy of Disaster Management, National Disaster Management Plan, and few handbooks on Disaster Management.




