
Eye Donation is an important part of our commitment to uplift the owntrodden, the physically disabled and also those who need an organ or an eye to be able to survive and see this beautiful world in all its vibrant colours. The meeting in Sir Ganga Ram Hospital was a reminder of that commitment and to encourage more people to pledge their eyes so that someone is able to see through them. The enthusiasm in the Members was evidenced in their presence and the fact that they had battled rain, traffic and imminent possibility of getting stuck on the road for hours and still managed to make it for the meeting. All the Senior Administrators were present at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital along with Dr. Ajay Swaroop Chairman of The Board, Dr. A K Grover (HOD Heart & Rotary Eye Bank) and Staff of the Ophthalmology Department.

President Rtn Sanjay Aggarwal started the meeting an spoke about Rotary's commitment and the work they had done in setting up the blood bank and about the tremendous efforts, of Rotary as an organisation, in eradicating Polio and other meaningful projects that lead to the upliftment of communities. This was followed by a speech by the Hospital's Consultant Dr.Prashant Grover about the need for more



























work to be done in the area of Eye Donation. There is a huge gap between the number of people who need their vision restored and the number of Eye Donors and this gap needs to be filled he said. An Associate of the Eye Bank spoke about how to store the eye; how long it can be stored and the kind of chemical solution that is selected depending upon the time for which the storage is needed.

Dr. Ravinder Kakkar spoke about the partnership between the Ophthalmology Department and Rotary Club that started in the year 1979. The project is still running and is managed by the Eye department of SGRH with some financial as distance from Rotary.

The staff presented a skit on awareness about eye donation. It was eye opener (pun intended) to see how the eye can be removed and replaced with artificial eyes to avoid disfigurement of the body.

The exhibition on eye donation was inaugurated by President Rtn Sanjay Aggarwal, Club Secretary Rtn Dr Neelam Sethi and Club Trainer PDG Rtn N. Subramaniam. The poster competition was equally informative and beautifully presented. We present some glimpses of this very productive day.

They released 75 balloons symbolic of the 75th year of Independence.One of the highlights of the events was the formation of a heart by Members of Staff and Rotaractors which looked splendid in a terrace-view photograph. The Cardio and Pulmonary camp was inaugurated thereafter. Team DHLI got down to work on testing BP, Weight, BMR, Blood Sugar, HB etc.

He stressed upon

- How to keep the level of HDL high & LDL low and danger from trans fats & Triglycerides.

After Dr. KK Sethi's lecture there was a talk by Ayruveda Doctor from AIIMS. All in all a very relevant and appropriate celebration of the "World Heart Day".
