PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE TO THE CLUB



Esteemed Members and spouses,

Rotary Year 2021-22 has been 'Above and Beyond'!

I am privileged to have the opportunity to serve as the 53rd President of this prestigious Club. This has been a unique year of learning, bonding, fellowships all devoted to a single cause 'Serve to Change Lives'. I must say it has been a very rewarding and satisfying experience.

Our Seniors always mentored the leadership team. Our BOD & Committee Chair shared their experience to execute Community Projects, arranged Fellowships, created public image if Rotary and our Club, and kept our members & spouses engaged with outstanding Speaker meetings, week after week.

We started our journey with legacy projects and added a few long-term, sustainable projects. The main highlights of this year have been: Planted 1,59,337 trees, 44125 Covid vaccinations, 32 Gift of Life surgeries, served 19 Polio Booths & administered 1931 polio drops to kids, 4 Breast Cancer awareness talks, 12 Holistic Health Camps,

300 merit-cum-means monthly scholarships to girl students, started 2 Literacy Centers for 250+ street children, enrolled 25 girls for GDA course at IGNOU, served 4500 leprosy patients with food, medicines, walking aids, distributed 3000 blankets to homeless, served hundreds of senior citizens & disabled children, organized 3 Blood Donation Camps with 533 units of Blood, set up an Oxygen Generating Plant. The final tally is 628 Projects, 9820 Hours, totaling to Rs.10.8 crores with the penultimate being the Covid vaccination Camp on 30th June at the Jamia Hamdard University.

We celebrated our Rotaractors Golden Jubilee Year along with our 53rd year gala celebrations and also added a new Interactors Club. We organized joint programmes with Rotractors and Interactors such as: National Debate, Blood Donation, Literacy & Hygiene Camps.

We retained 100% membership, added 10 new members, encouraged spouse members to become members. We also added 21 members & spouses to PHF, arranged 13 Board meetings, 4 Assembly meetings, arranged Fellowship on Diwali, Christmas, 2 Walk & Talks, visits to Vrindavan & Gurukul, and the meticulously planned GOV & Thanksgiving. We participated in the District PETS, SETS, Seminars and Thanksgiving. We published 'Ashoka' our monthly Bulletin, CSR, Gift of Life & Tree Plantation brochures and our Yearbook 'Above & Beyond'. We also have a beautiful year film that we showed at the GOV.

We have qualified for RI Citation which we should be receiving soon. We also submitted our Citations to the District and we are so proud that our Club was recognized as the 'Elite Club, Elite President, Elite Secretary' and to top it all our Hony. Secretary, Rtn. Kriti Makhija was awarded the 'Best Hony. Secretary' of the District in the District 3011. It is truly heartwarming that a

spouse member with just 18 months being in Rotary got the, 'Rotarian of the year Award' from our Club, second time in a row, and also the coveted award of being the outstanding Secretary of the District.

It is indeed very gratifying that our leadership team worked meticulously, and our Club was once again, awarded the Elite Club status and was duly specially recognized by DG, Rtn. Anup Mittal and the District leaders. Our senior members, Rtn. Hemant Ahuja, Rtn. Satish Kapur, Rtn. Amarnath Goel, Rtn. Som Dua were specially recognized for their distinguished '50 years of Service to Rotary'. Our member, Dr. H.K. Chopra was given the 'Vocational Award' for disease prevention and cure.

This spectacular achievement could not have been possible but for the support of the Seniors, BOD, Committee Chairs, members, spouses, associates, CSR partners and the involvement & participation of my family members.




















































































































































Stationary and Goodies Distribution

Meet Aashi and Sagar: Stories than make us believe in humanity

The first impression of Gift of Life program is was quite a morbid picture when one gets to know that this project is for children's heart treatment. It makes one think of unwell children and suffering, but look at these children, better yet, meet them, and your whole mindset will change and you will realize how wrong that picture is!

Little Aashi

Meeting 6-year-old Aashi from Moradabad, Uttar Pradesh. She was diagnosed with a Congenital Heart Defect called the Atrial septal defect (ASD) and needed immediate medical intervention through a ASD device procedure.

Aashi's family comes from a humble background and could not afford the astronomical cost of treatment. In the family's dilemma, all hope seemed lost. After consulting Dr. Vikas Kohli, Aashi was enrolled under CHF's Hridaan project and they reached out to RCDS for support.



Only after reading her story, I realised the impact that this defect could have had on her life and the value of timely medical intervention in bringing normalcy to her life.

When you think of Aashi, a child who could potentially lose the gift of life, you will think about an unhappy, uncomfortable child with distressed parents. However, these medical complexities did not bother little Aashi who happily played her toys and played. Just look at this pretty, smiling girl full of life and her parents, well they were despondent but never lost hope in Humanity...and look at the magic their hope manifested into reality.

With generous and kind donations from CHF and fellow Rotarians, Hony Secretary Kriti Makhija and Rtn Sumit Makhija, Aashi was operated in May and will now lead a normal life. After a very successful surgery, the doctors cleared her to receive follow-ups locally with medication for about three months. Aashi's little heart is now strong, and her priceless smile intact - such is the magic of our #GiftOfLife project!

Little Sagar

Next, met little Sagar at a hospital in New Delhi. This time, I did not know what to expect when I got his papers.

When I met spoke to CHF team, they told me how his heart defect had been and how critical his case was. He need an urgent intervention. Sagar was diagnosed with Pulmonary Atresia with



Ventricular Septal Defect, a life-threatening condition.

He needed a total repair surgery the cost of which cost was exorbitant for the family. 90% of Indian families earn less than Rs. 25,000 a month, and Sagar's family was one of them. His surgery and recovery was a distant dream for them as they could not afford the exorbitant cost of treatment. His family was desperate for help but was also more than able to seek it through the proper channels. That is where CHF stepped in and also got our attention on this case to support Sagar.

Once again, while everyone around the child spoke of serious heart disorders among children, Sagar blissfully jumped around his bed and played rested in his mothers lap.

Sagar was blessed with the kind grant from Ms. Neerja Bhargava and Child Heart Foundation, and was operated on April 21, 2022. The surgery was successful. However, he had an extended stay in the hospital May 11th as his



condition post-surgery was very critical. Sagar was in the ICU all through as he needed constant monitoring and the cost increased significantly, almost double.

We extended a little more support than original approved amount, CHF also extended more support and what is amazing is that hospital gave discount and the staff raised finds for Little Sagar too.... Now this is Humanity coming together to give a gift of life!

Sagar was discharged with a clen chit and a healthy heart to lead a normal, healthy life like any other child of his age.

These stories point out to something more profound about the perception of the state of heart defects in children in India. While knowledge and conversation around heart defects are less with over 200,000 such cases in India every year, a happier picture of children smiling after surgery and humanity coming together to support these children is also a part of this truth.


