

Learn more about building stronger social systems through Rotary's work in Positive Peace.


Complete the Rotary Positive Peace Academy, a free online course on the positive peace framework.

Rotary International President Jennifer Jones announced at #GlobalCitizenFestival that #Rotary will commit an additional \$150 million to end polio for good. endpolio.org


This virus is preventable through vaccines and remains endemic in two countries worldwide.

In 2021 alone, 25 million children went without vital immunizations that protect against diseases like polio. The world has beaten back this disease significantly, but we must redouble our efforts.


Global Citizens, help us call on governments, businesses, and other leaders to join us in pledging ambitiously at the World Health Summit in October to #EndPolio for good.





Every Rotary year, the Rotary International Board of Directors makes minor changes to the list of zones based on decisions to merge or create new districts, or grant district requests to change zones. In addition, the Board conducts a comprehensive review at least every eight years to comply with RI Bylaws that districts and clubs be divided into 34 zones of approximately equal number of Rotarians. The next comprehensive review by the RI Board may start in June 2023.
