Rotary International Theme for 2022-23



As you all know, during the start of 2023, Rotary International President Jennifer E. Jones (who is also our first female president) had selected the theme for the year 2022-23 as Imagine Rotary. The theme has been selected to "Imagine, a world that deserves our best, where we get up each day knowing that we can make a difference."

The theme graphic is designed by an Australian artist Riki Salem to link with the Melbourne Convention in 2023. There is a deeper meaning behind each element of the design. Some of the symbolism includes:

- Circle signifies connections to one another
- Dots around it signifies our people
- There are 7 Dots for Rotary's 7 areas of focus
- Circle + dots around it in totality describes a navigation star, our guiding light
- Green solid line symbolises a digging stick (used when doing hard work); for us it's People of Action, represents the tools for getting things done
- The colours purple, green & white celebrate diversity, equity and inclusion Freedom to express ourselves differently but still with a special connection
- Purple is also the colour of Rotary's Polio campaign
- Green represents the Environment
- White stands for peace; it also represents Empowerment and Newness and also the colours were utilised for the women's movement, highlighting the opportunity to grow our female membership.

The new eight-part Amazon Prime series "Farzi" is being discussed everywhere. It is developed and directed by the dynamic Indian filmmaking duo Raj Nidimoru and Krishna D.K. (famous for their spy thriller show The Family Man). The series which revolves around Counterfeiting of Currency, comes up with a ready reckoner on things most of us didn't know much about—the kind of paper a genuine note uses, the artistry involved in the design, the printing and distribution, and the deadly danger involved in the whole operation. Shahid Kapoor plays Sunny, a gifted sketch artist, who faces constant humiliations of having too little. He starts seeing a humble currency note as a challenging work of art. As his ego and ambition get the better of him, Sunny gets sucked into a black hole as we get an insight into how a man gets consumed by circumstances. The other main character is the hotheaded yet committed Michael Vednayagam (South Indian Actor Vijay Sethupathi) who heads the law enforcement unit which is busy tracking the dastards responsible for this 'financial terrorism'. Kay Kay Menon chews up the scenery with his trademark flourish playing Mansoor, a reptilian figure who gives wings to Sunny's imagination and ambition for his own purpose. In Farzi, the creators have pulled off a terrific supporting cast consisting of Amol Palekar, Raashi Khanna, Kubra Sait, who
