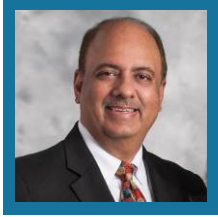

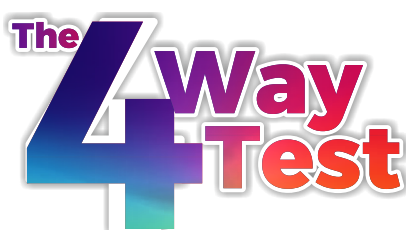

RCBS BYTES

The war in Ukraine is having devastating consequences on civilians as families flee their homes. According to the United Nations, more than 3.5 million people, most of them women and children, have sought refuge in neighboring countries and across Europe, while about 7 million more people have been displaced within Ukraine.

Rotary and Rotaract clubs in Europe and around the world have taken swift action and are working with members nearby to provide food, water, medical equipment, and shelter for refugees.

Ukraine has 62 Rotary clubs and six satellite clubs with about 1,100 members, and 24 Rotaract clubs with more than 300 members.

District 2232 (Ukraine and Belarus) formed a committee to help people affected by the crisis. It has launched an appeal to Rotary members worldwide for funds to provide basic necessities.

The city of Lviv has had an influx of people displaced from other cities around Ukraine. The Rotary Club of Lviv International, working with local authorities and major hospitals, created an online spreadsheet of relief items that can be accessed by people who want to help. Members arrange for the donated items to be delivered to hospitals and coordinate storage with local warehouses.

The Rotary Clubs of Europe is coordinating contributions and mobilizing members to donate necessities and deliver the items to where they're needed.

Hello, my name is Isha Amin and I am the elder daughter of Rtn Dharmendra Amin and Sonal Amin. I am a Physician Assistant (PA), currently working in the Cardiology Department of the Duke University Medical Center, North Carolina, USA. You're thinking, "What is a Physician Assistant?"

In the 1960s, physicians and educators recognized the shortage of primary care physicians. To address this gap, the first class of Physician Assistants was put together at the Duke University, which remains the #1 University for PA education. Basically, it is a fast-track program to train PAs, who provide medical care with indirect supervision of a physician. Initially created to fill primary care positions, now Physician Assistants are found in every specialty around the world.

Every day, I treat seriously ill cardiac patients, and there is nothing more rewarding to me than when a patient gets better and goes home to his/her family. My passion to become a PA actually came from my passion for patient education. As a PA, I spend a significant amount of time educating patients, so that they have a better understanding of their disease processes and treatment plan. I believe that a person's health is in the hands of 3 people: their provider, their caretaker and they, THEMSELVES. I am honored to work alongside and learn from brilliant PAs and MDs who are involved in cutting-edge research. Did you read about the world's first heart/thymus transplant in a 7-month-old infant in the *** newspaper? This was Duke's most recent success. We have many ongoing clinical trials that will provide better treatment options for various heart diseases. My role is also to identify patients who are good candidates for these ongoing trials.

When I'm not in the hospital, I spend time indulging in hobbies such as hiking, cooking new recipes, reading self-help books and dog-walking. I love plants, and I'm working on building an herb garden for my kitchen. Every once in a while, I will pick up shifts to provide covid education and free vaccinations to the underserved communities in my area.
