Life will be bright and beautiful when you have found your passion because it brings along the desire to excel and no matter what, you will find yourself doing things that you have always dreamt of.

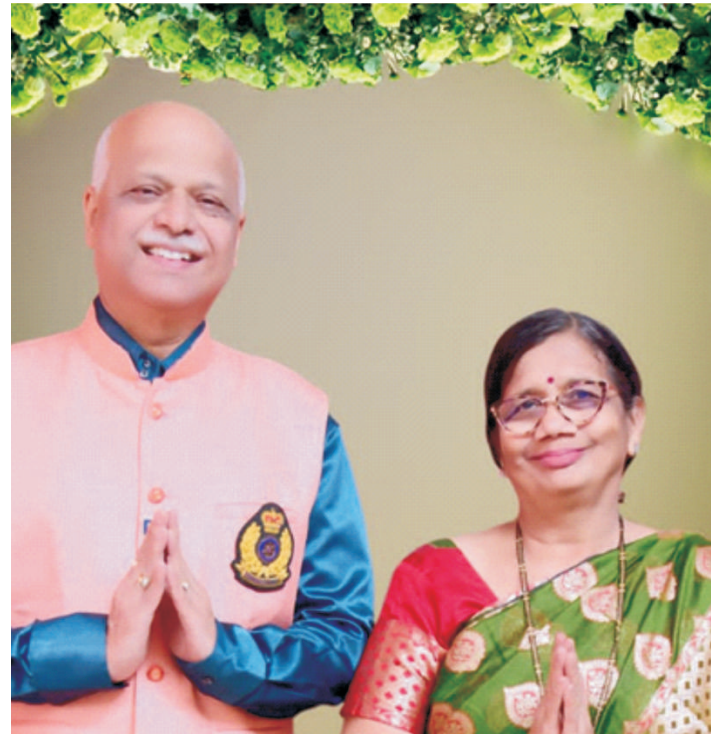

The Legacy Down Memory Lane

Rotary Club of Thane Hills. It's a name to reckon with in RI district 3142. It's fascinating to know how and when the club was formed and who were the stars in the formative years!

My tryst with RCTH started way back in 1990. To understand how I became associated with the Rotary movement, we will have to go back to over 3 decades ago.

Before 1989, I was staying in Sion. I completed my MD in Pediatrics from Seth GS Medical College in 1985 and started practicing in Sion, Koliwada, and Kurla. After about 3 years of running around, I realized that I need to have a place of my own where I can have



outpatient as well as inpatient facilities. This was financially unviable in a place like Sion where real estate prices were out of reach. So we decided to explore, and after a year of checking out both western and eastern suburbs, we zeroed in on Thane.

Way back in 1987, Thane was a small town, with a population of less than 20 lakhs. When we booked a place in Chandanwadi for our hospital, many Thaneites asked us why we were investing so far away from Thane Station!



The answer was simple. The area was developing, and we were aware that the plot diagonally opposite to our proposed hospital was going to be the location of Thane Municipal Corporation head office. This bit of information was vital as it would signal the rapid development of the area.

So, in March 1989, we shifted to Thane. As I was totally new to the area, I started the rounds of meeting nearby general practitioners and obstetricians from whom I could get referred patients. On one

such round, I met Dr Mohan Chandavarkar, who had started Apeksha Hospital just a couple of years back. Mohan was my senior in GS, and it was a pleasant surprise to know that his nursing home



was in the vicinity of my Chiranjeevi Hospital! Luckily for me, Mohan was on the lookout for a pediatrician with his own setup, with a neonatal intensive care unit. Way back, there were very few such nursing homes, and the fact that we knew each other from our undergrad days was an advantage. I started to attend newborn calls regularly at Apeksha Hospital. On one of my visits I happened to see a simple, 2 page cyclostyled, black and white paper on Mohan's table, which was titled North Star, the bulletin of Rotary Club of Thane North, I asked Mohan about it, and he told me about Rotary in general and his club in particular. Even though I was a newcomer in



Thane and struggling to settle, I found the concept of Rotary interesting. When I expressed my desire to join Rotary, his reply was a bit dampening. "You have to be invited to join. Leading professionals and successful businessmen are usually invited to join Rotary. I was invited to join Thane North Club a couple of years ago." I left it at that. Who would invite a young, fresh struggling doctor who was just a year into practice in Thane?

In just a few months, I got a call from Mohan. It was sometime in November or December 1990. "Our Club is starting a new Rotary Club. Are you interested in becoming a Charter Member?" And he went on to explain how it was advantageous to be a member of a New Rotary Club where everyone would be starting their Rotary innings at the same time, so no senior or junior Rotarians!!

That's how my Rotary story started. Soon we started meeting, about 20 of us. The initial meetings were at Past President Bhoomreddi's place at Centre Point. The meeting day was arbitrarily fixed as Thursday, and the time as 7.00pm..

Now here was a problem. Since I used to practice both in the mornings and evenings, 7pm was not convenient for me. I had to make a decision. After discussing with Anuja, I decided to keep my consulting closed on Thursday evening. So, in effect, practically almost from the first year of my practice in Thane, I started having a mid week evening off (from a not so busy practice anyways!).

I remember the first meeting at PP Bhoomreddi's house vividly. As I was walking through the gate of Centre Point, a stocky young man walked in by my side. He smiled at me and said, "Rotary?" I replied in the affirmative. "Hi, I am Rakesh Wadhawan," he said. He went on to explain how Rotary was in his blood. "My father was a member of Thane North till he passed away a couple of years ago," he went on. "My elder brother Atul is now a member of that club."

That was my first interaction with a genial giant of a man who was soon to become a close friend!

Over the next few weeks, we were introduced to many individuals from diverse backgrounds and professions, who, like me, were being introduced to the concept of Rotary. The then President of Thane North Nana Khambete and our GSR Suresh Dhawan gave us plenty of Rotary Information. We kept meeting every Thursday at different venues.

Some of the interesting charter members, apart from Rakesh, Ruby and Raju, were

1. Madhu Reddy. Works director at JK files, he gave the initial impression of being a typical pompous corporate boss. That would change over the years as we got to know each other better!
2. Late Vasant Zalani. JK files top brass, he had been Rotarian before, so was the automatic choice as charter president
3. Vilas Vaidya. An architect who was to play a significant role in planning and executing our first mega project of Shirol dam.
4. Narayan Rathi. A friendly, warm gentleman in a senior position with Kores.
5. Late Nitin Sabnis. An engineer who had his own workshop at Upwan, he was meticulous to a fault, and was the automatic choice to record minutes of board meetings.

There were many more, and if I go on, my reminiscing can easily fill this bulletin!!

Suffice to say that our family has thoroughly enjoyed being part of a wonderful Hiller family which had grown from a modest 30 charter members to about 110!!

May our tribe increase, and may we continue to give our talents, time and resources to the betterment of society!!

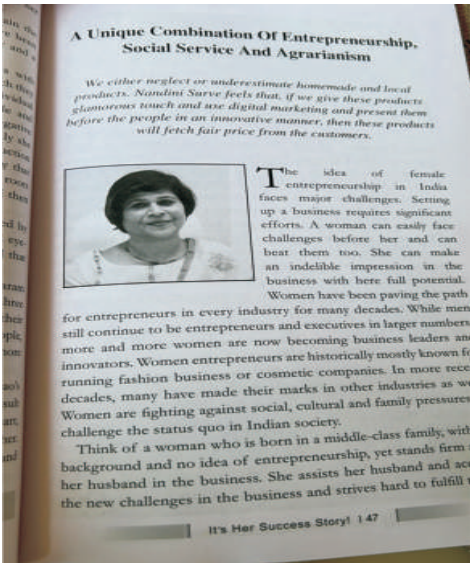

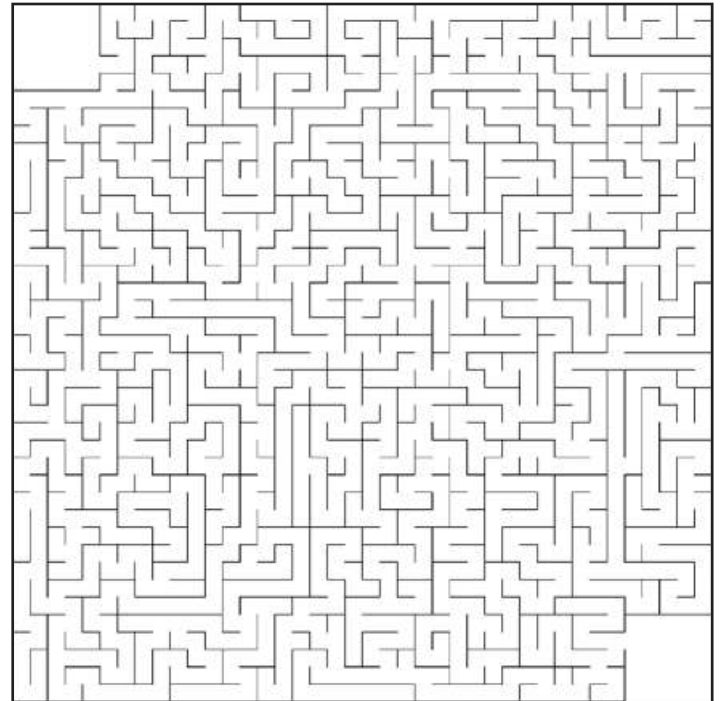
