REGULAR MEETING - CLUB ASSEMBLY - 4 JUL 2023



The President, Rtn Harinder Arora, called the 384 meeting to order at 7:30 PM on Tuesday 4 July at the Friends Club. This meeting was declared by the President as the Club Assembly. The National Anthem was sung by all members led by Rtn Secy Rajni Bagla. The 4-Wat Test was read out by Rtn Shashi Sharma.

During the Club Assembly the Directors, Rtn PP Sunil Bandula, Rtn Subodh Raheja, Rtn PP Dr Amita Rani Gupta and Rtn PP Narender Bhasin shared the plans of their respective Avenue of Service with the club members. Members were requested to note these and make further proposals to make our programmes more purposeful.



Rtn PP Dr Amita Rani Gupta, Director Community Service, made her presentation. At the very outset she stated that she found the task very formidable considering that she has to step into the shoes of Lord Dr Neeraj Bhalla, who had done yeoman service in the last year. The plans for his Avenue of Service include inviting Ambassadors of different countries to share their country's vision, program and social obligations commitments. Inviting UN delegates to address us on their social activities and any association with us. Participate in the Students Exchange program of Rotary. Plans members visit to other countries and their clubs and thus create a sister club association.

Rtn PP Sunil Bandula, Director Vocational Service, made his presentation. Plans for Vocational Service include making contact with corporates and seeing their financial assistance for Rotary projects. Propagation of ethics in business by lectures and Group Discussions. Promotion of our 4-Way Test amongst the non Rotary world for business ethics.

After the Directors had made their presentations, Rtn PP Sukh Mohinder Singh was requested to make a brief presentation on "Know Your Rotary". He made the following points:

- 1. The need and importance of observing meeting times. By starting the meeting at 7.00 PM it has to be ended by 8.30 PM
- 2. Participation in the Club Community Service/Health Check Up Camps has to be better. Reminded the members about this and urged them to do better on this. More members participating gives Rotary better image.



3. Introducing prospective members should be done with seriousness and after having found the prospect meeting the criteria and showing good commitment to give both his finance and his/her time at least 2 hours for meetings and 2 hours for participation in community projects

The President, in his presentation, identified that Membership Development is going to be a key focus area for the coming year. Current year statistics have seen the Club shrink in size to just 23 members. He stated that Membership Development is the responsibility of every member and there will be several opportunities for all members to participate in activities that will identify potential members for the club in Rotary year 2023-24.

He asked each one to think about an activity in which they would like to participate and share any thoughts or ideas they have about the future of the club. Members gave their suggestions which were accepted and are as follows:

- 1) Rtn Shashi Sharma to arrange for a picnic in December.
- 2) Rtn PP Gagandeep Singh Sapra suggested that we keep an attendance register during meetings as that would improve attendance.
- 3) The members approved the project at Jamia Millia where tables and chairs would be given

to the school for the children. A date would be fixed for this shortly.

The Secretary, Rtn Rajni Bagla, conveyed Birthday Greetings to Rtn PP Gagandeep Singh Sapra (7 Jul), R'Ann Suman Harjit Singh (13 Jul), Rtn Bela Verma (21 Jul), Rtn Brig Davinder Singh (22 Jul) and R'Ann Dr Anita Singh (23 Jul). 
