The GOV was conducted in the Conference Room of Friends Club and the Installation Ceremony in the Banquet Hall of Friends Club.



The GOV commenced at 6:30 PM sharp with President Rtn Harinder Arora and the entire Club Board present. The DG took stock of the club activities during the past year and the forecasts for the current year, which had been pre-loaded on the Rotary website. A very fine departure from printed Brochures in the past! During the GOV the DG made the following points:

the year with 22 members. Since we had come down from 28 members during the year, our


target should be 30 members during the year.

- e) He advised the club to look at the contributions to the Rotary Foundation. He wanted each Rotarian to contribute US \$ 100 per year (Each Rotarian Each Year EREY). To start with he advised the President to commence collection with US \$ 25 per Rotarian in the month of Aug itself.

On completion of the GOV, the DG and the Board migrated to the Banquet Hall for the Installation Ceremony. The Banquet Hall was very tastefully decorated and prepared for the function by the personal efforts of R'Ann Dr Anita Singh and Rtn PP Sukh Mohinder Singh, who had spent the entire day doing it up.

IPP Rtn Vandana Bhalla, not yet having been relieved of her charge, called the 386th meeting of the Rotary Club of Indraprastha-Okhla to Order at 7:30 PM. The National Anthem was sung led by Rtn Secy Rajni Bagla. The 4-Way Test was read out by Rtn PP Dr Amita Rani Gupta.

horticulturist provided expert guidance to the programme, the blanket presentation to the slum dwellers during the winter and the start of the Cervical Cancer Project in association with BLK Hospital and Rotary Cancer Foundation.



Above Self and work hard to achieve the set goals. She introduced the new board. Guests and our members pin the Interactors Team for 2023-24.





REGULAR MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 22 AUGUST 2023

The President, Rtn Harinder Singh Arora, called the 387th Meeting of Rotary Club of Indraprastha-Okhla to Order at 7:30 PM on Tuesday 22 Aug 2023 at Friends Club, New Delhi.



The National Anthem was sung led by Rtn PP Dr Amita Rani Gupta. The 4-Way Test was read out by Rtn PP Sunil Bandula. The President then welcomed the team that had come to make their presentation on the problem of Illegal Migration in the context of the present World Order - Mr Sanjay Awasthi, India Head International Organisation for Ms Migration (IOM) and Suraksha Chandershekhar, Senior Project Assistant IOM. Rtn PP Sukh Mohinder Singh introduced

the Guest Speakers.

Mr Sanjay Awasthi introduced International Organisation for Migration (IOM) as an intergovernmental organization that works closely with governmental, non-governmental, and intergovernmental partners in the field of migration to aid orderly and humane migration for the benefit of the human race. It has been recognised by the United Nations. It is the officially recognised body as an intergovernmental organisation in the field of migration dedicated to ensuring the orderly and humane management of migration, to promote international cooperation on migration issues, to assist in the search for practical solutions to migration problems and to provide humanitarian assistance to migration international cooperation on migration issues, to assist in the search for practical solutions to migration problems and to provide humanitarian assistance to migration problems and to provide humanitarian assistance to migration in the four practical solutions to migration problems and to provide humanitarian assistance to migrants in need, be they refugees, displaced persons or other uprooted people. The IOM works in the four broad areas of migration management: migration and development, facilitating migration, regulating migration, and addressing forced migration. Cross-cutting activities include the promotion of international migration law, policy debate and guidance, protection of migrants' rights, migration health and the gender dimension of migration.



He explained that IOM is a a United Nations agency that provides services and advice concerning migration to governments and migrants, including internally displaced and migrant persons, refugees, workers. IOM was established in 1951 as the Intergovernmental Committee for European Migration (ICEM) to help resettle people displaced by World War II. It became

a United Nations agency in 2016. The IOM is the principal UN agency working in the field of migration. The IOM promotes humane and orderly migration by providing services and advice to

governments and migrants. The IOM works in the four broad areas of migration management: migration and development, facilitating migration, regulating migration, and addressing forced migration. India became an IOM Member State on 18 June 2008. Carrying forward the presentation Ms Suraksha Chandershekhar, Senior Project Assistant, explained that from its roots as an operational logistics agency, the IOM has



broadened its scope to become the leading international agency working with governments and civil societies to advance the understanding of migration issues, encourage social and economic development through migration, and uphold the human dignity and well-being of migrants. The broader scope of activities has been matched by rapid expansion from a relatively small agency into one with an annual operating budget of US\$1.8 billion and some 11,500 staff working in over 150 countries worldwide.

As the "UN migration agency", the IOM has become a main point of reference in the heated global debate on the social, economic and political implications of migration in the 21st century.



After a very detailed presentation with the help of a power point presentation, there were numerous questions from the audience. The President requested Rtn PP Dr Amita Rani Gupta to propose the Vote of Thanks.


The Secretary, Rtn Rajni Bagla, made her announcements. Birthday Greetings were conveyed to Rtn PP

The students did not have chair and table to sit on and were sitting floor. They were very happy receive the furniture refreshments. The staff and the students very happy to receive them.






