# **REGULAR MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 5 SEPTEMBER 2023**

The President, Rtn Harinder Singh Arora, called the 388<sup>th</sup> Meeting Rotary Club of Indraprastha-Okhla to order at 7:40 PM om Tuesday 5 Sep at The Friends Club.

The Members sang the National Anthem led by Rtn Secretary Rajni Bagla. Rtn PP Sunil Bandula read out the 4-Way Test.



The President welcomed the two Guest Speakers Ms Shivani and Ms Ambita Verdi of

Soch Foundation. Rtn PP Prof Arbinder Kohli introduced the two Speakers. Guest **Explaining** their background he stated that Ms Shivani has over 30 vears experience in working with children. She is a trained counsellor and worked extensively with



children with special needs. Ms Ambita Verdi has over the last 20 years worked with children in different capacities. A trained special educator, she

has used the Arts to work with differently abled students. They would be speaking on Learning Disabilities and the processes involved in their treatment.



Sep 5 also being Teachers Day, it was appropriate to hear an informative talk by Ms Shivani and Ms Ambita Verdi, Team leaders of Soch Foundation. In their joint talk both highlighted the nature and

dimensions of learning disabilities (LD) and the process of remedial actions to deal with them. They mentioned that though no exhaustive study has been done, incidence of LD is taken to be around 10% of the school going population.

Both the speakers had been associated with different reputed schools in Delhi for many years and during their long teaching careers independently observed that the dimension of learning disabilities is large and just not limited to any single strata of society. They found that such disabilities relate to difficulty in reading in general and also due to weak evesiaht. hearing impairment, disability, disability to understand number based information like maths, attention deficiency or attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), autism, mental and psychological conditions. Some of these disabilities are easily observed or diagnosed



but others need psychological and diagnostic assessment. Based on the diagnosis the customised remedial therapies are used.

Soch Foundation has thus set its approach for remedial therapies to be holistic, create contextual assessments, work out individualised or customised education plans, use of creative Teaching Learning Materials, capacity building programmes and collaborating with all stakeholders. Along

with these they conduct lectures and workshops for stakeholder on understanding disability, have regular communication with parents, referring students for formal assessment when needed and creating and distributing remedial material and creation of audio-visual teaching aids. Starting in 2019, the Foundation is associated with 55 schools.

Soch Foundation believes that to meet the challenges of LD, a holistic approach is required and more stakeholders and organisations need to get involved. To deal with this challenge they propose setting up Resource Centres offering all ancillary services like Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Psychological Assessment and Remedial Education. They shared that SOCH Foundation was already in dialogue with the Delhi Government to extend support to set up a Resource Centre.



The talk by the two Speakers was followed by a spirited Q & A session. Formal Vote of Thanks was proposed by Rtn PP Rtn Amita Rani Gupta. Rtn PP GL Moondra presented mementoes to the two speakers on behalf of the club.

The Secretary, Rtn Rajni Bagla, conveyed Birthday Greetings to Rtn PP Harjit Singh (5 Sep) and Wedding Anniversary Greetings to R'Ann Suman & Rtn PP Harjit Singh (2 Sep). Two camps planned during the month are Cervical Cancer Camp 2<sup>nd</sup> dose at Balvantray Mehta Vidya Bhawan, Greater Kailash-II (23 Sep) and Dental Inspection camp at Friends Club (25 Sep). Next meeting will be a Speaker Meeting on 19 Sep (Details follow). The meeting will be preceded by Ganesh Vandana being commencement of Ganesh Chaturthi. Sunshine Collection was Rs 1500.


