SAKSHARTA - This is our education grants project. Rotary Scholars from professional colleges are recommended by their respective colleges and selected on the basis of merit by our committee and are supported upto their graduation.





SUDHARTA - This is our disability corrective surgery project where we admit patients with various forms of disability ranging from limb lengthening to congenital absence of tibia. Each patient undergoes numerous surgical operations to correct their physical defect and lead a normal life

SAHAYATA - This is our Home Care Nursing School project in association with Matruchhaya. This is a 100% charity school. At Sahayata, youth are given free education & training, gainfully employed and raised to respected level in community. Your loved one can now get trained nursing care in the comfort of your home.





SWACCHATA - This is our Wash in Schools (WInS) project where we construct health and sanitation facilities to the students in schools. Toilet blocks and Washing units are being developed in schools that don't have these facilities.

SANJEEVANI - During this pandemic, we created a bank of 26 Oxygen Concentrators that are being lent to needy patients (even non-covid) for supporting them with handy oxygen. And now, we are increasing our scope by including wheelchairs, fowler beds, and other requisites to further the project and rechristen it as Sanjeevani.

Sahayata - Home Care Nursing Training Center | 9 August 2022

The commencement of 15th batch of 20 students of Sahayata (Home Care Nursing Training Center) was held at Rugnashray in the presence of Shri Manoranjan Khuntia, GM (HR&IR) Goa Shipyard Ltd., Shri Madhukar Dixit & CDR Anup Keni among others. Sahayata has contributed 229 students in 14 batches to the service of the needy.

Matruchhaya's Sahayata Home Care Nursing Training Centre, is a community service project initiated by Rotary Club of Panaji Mid-Town in partnership with Matruchhaya Trust & corporates supporting community development. The school gives training in Home Care Nursing to eligible students free of cost. This is a 6-month residential course & includes 3 months of practical training at Goa Medical College.

Minimum eligibility to join the course is 8th Standard pass & students must be between 18-45 years of age. On completion of course, 100% placement is assured.









Reception in honour of War Veterans & Veer Naris | 14 August 2022

A reception was hosted in honour of War Veterans & Veer Naris on the occasion of Independence Day and as part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav in association with Department of Sainik Welfare, Government of Goa. On India's 75th Independence Day, 75 national flags were unfurled and hoisted simultaneously outside the Caculo Mall in Panaji by a group of very special guests – the specially abled and underprivileged citizens of the state. The event was planned to commemorate 75 years of Independence under the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' recently announced by the honorable Prime Minister. Caculo Group collaborated with Disability Rights Association of Goa (DRAG) & other NGOs along with the Rotary Club of Panaji Mid-Town in an effort to put the spotlight on and celebrate the lives of citizens who often find themselves on the fringes of society.

The event saw over 100 individuals from underprivileged sections of society including orphanages, elderly living facilities, disability groups and specially abled come together and celebrate our independence in a way like never before. 5 special citizens were felicitated:



Bashir Nawar - A cerebral palsy patient, he goes around walking with a cart, house to house collecting newspapers. He makes paper bags and earns a livelihood by selling them to various commercial establishments. In an era of curtailing plastic use, this is a contribution from Bashir for conservation of the environment.



Santan Rebello - A cerebral palsy patient uses crutches to walk but is mobile with a 3 wheeler. He earns his livelihood through a traditional skill called 'Rotesau' (weaving of chairs). This is a gradually disappearing art but Santan aspires to keep it alive.



Josephina Fernandes - A sign language instructor and member of Goa association for the deaf working for deaf accessibility & empowerment, she is a Gold Medalist at the National Institute of Speech and Hearing Disabilities Mumbai in the Indian sign language interpretation course.



Rama Parsekar - 100% visually impaired, he is a computer trainer at Enable India Bangalore. As a computer trainer, Rama is well travelled across the country. He has been deputed as a trainer for visually impaired children in several states and is presently deputed at National Association of Blind – GOA.



Akshay Atchut Fadte - Founder of Atchut Marketing, Akshay sets an inspiring example of entrepreneurship inspite of his disability. He strategizes unique social media advertising concepts and provides all digital services from graphic designing to drone shoots. His is the first Goan agency to do celebrity collaborations for business promotions.







Har Ghar Tiranga | 12 August 2022

'Har Ghar Tiranga' is a campaign under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to encourage people to bring the Tiranga home and to hoist it to mark the 75th year of India's independence. Our relationship with the flag has always been more formal and institutional than personal. We gifted 130 kg of sweets and faraal on the occasion of Ganesh Chaturthi as a part of our "Mission Shukriya", a project of thanksgiving to those who protect us.

A lunch was organised at the Officers mess where we got to interact with Rear Admiral Deepak Goswami (Admiral in charge of the Naval Ship repair yard at Karwar), Captain Susheel Menon (Commanding Officer of INS Vikramaditya), Commodore Vivek Hotti (Naval Officer in Charge of Karnataka), Commodore D Ravi Kumar (Chief Staff Officer Technical at

HQ Karnataka Naval Area), Mr Kaval Singh (General Manager of the Naval Armament Depot at Karwar), Commander Swarnava Chatterjee (officiating Commanding Officer of INS Kadamba), Lt Cdr Prateek Kurra (assistant to Rear Admiral Goswami). Our Club Flag was unveiled at the hands of Rear Admiral Deepak Goswami & Captain Susheel Menon.

We were then transported by the Navy's buses to the INS Vikramaditya. We got to see the Flight Deck, Bridge, Flying Control Post, Combat Information Centre, Bakery and lastly the ship's auditorium to watch a small movie followed by tea and refreshments at the wardroom.

INS Vikramaditya, the mammoth

44,500-tonne floating airfield, has an overall length of 284 metres and a maximum beam of 60 metres, stretching as much as three football fields put together. The warship is capable of operations up to a range of over 7,000 nautical miles (13,000 km). With her complete stock of provisions, she is capable of sustaining herself at sea for about 45 days. Standing about 20-storey tall from the keel to the highest point, INS Vikramaditya has a total of 22 decks and carries around 1,600 personnel.

We thank Rear Admiral Atul Anand (Flag Officer Karnataka Naval Area) for facilitating our visit and to Captain Susheel Menon for immaculate planning of our visit.

This is a typical Karwari recipe

Hugay

Ingredients:

2 bittergourds, 5/6 Local bhende/ladies fingers 1 bunch of vaal/string beans, 2/3 pumpkin flowers 6/7 haldi leaves, a lime sized tamarind ball, 10/12 red chilles (preferably byadhi type)

Method: cut bittergourd in 2inch pieces apply salt n keep aside. Cut bhindi and vall also in 2 inch pieces.

Grind red chillies with tamarind to a fine paste.

Squeeze the bittergourd pieces of salt. Add chilli paste to bittergourd bhindi and vaal along with salt.

Take a broad based vessel, put 5/6 tbsp coconut oil arrange the vegetables add pumpkin flowers. Cover this with haldi leaves. Put a lid on the vessel.

Cook for 30/40 minutes on medium heat till the vegetables are cooked and become quite dry

Put off the gas and add raw coconut oil over it




