When Ann Sanat had approached us in our initial planning days to organize an inter-school quiz competition for Goa, little did we think that we would manage to pull off such a great event. We began by getting support from Directorate of Education and SCERT, Goa. They issued circulars to all schools in Goa and we received entries from 81 schools. A team of 3 students from each school and with teacher in-charge meant that we had a good response of 324 persons in all; a huge number to deal with.

But thanks to the volunteers from our Club as well as the RC Margao, we managed to organize seamless and smooth preliminary rounds at two venues in North & South Goa. Correction round was an interesting event. Our correctors enjoyed the event, we had some interesting answers written by the students. One thing we learnt from this is that the quality of general knowledge among students needs to be enhanced. During our school days, we used to keep ourselves abreast with whats happening around us. But sadly, today it looks like the students are more glued to Netflix and Social Media.

The finals of the Final Glow Rotary Quiz Bowl Goa was held in style. A technically and structurally sound bespoke stage added to the desired atmosphere for quizzing. The setup was at par with any National TV show adding the required glamour quotient. Someone asked me, why are you glamorizing a simple quiz show? I replied, is KBC not a quiz show? The glamorizing of any show makes one inclined to such competitions, and I am sure the students will rare to be on this stage the next year with much more preparation than this year.

The lights, specially made music notes and the presentation was excellent and the show turned out to be one of the best Goa has ever seen. I am sure we have created a legacy project here and it's a subtle and humble way to promote students to learn the right things.

SAKSHARTA - This is our education grants project. Rotary Scholars from professional colleges are recommended by their respective colleges and selected on the basis of merit by our committee and are supported upto their graduation.





SUDHARTA - This is our disability corrective surgery project where we admit patients with various forms of disability ranging from limb lengthening to congenital absence of tibia. Each patient undergoes numerous surgical operations to correct their physical defect and lead a normal life.

SAHAYATA - This is our Home Care Nursing School project in association with Matruchhaya. This is a 100% charity school. At Sahayata, youth are given free education & training, gainfully employed and raised to respected level in community. Your loved one can now get trained nursing care in the comfort of your home.





SWACCHATA - This is our Wash in Schools (WInS) project where we construct health and sanitation facilities to the students in schools. Toilet blocks and Washing units are being developed in schools that don't have these facilities.

SANJEEVANI - During this pandemic, we created a bank of 26 Oxygen Concentrators that are being lent to needy patients (even non-covid) for supporting them with handy oxygen. And now, we are increasing our scope by including wheelchairs, fowler beds, and other requisites to further the project and rechristen it as Sanjeevani.

Study Mission to Mopa Airport | 11 & 14 November 2022

A tour was organised to the members and the families to have a closer look at Goa's new International airport. The airport is a Greenfield airport built to ease the load on Goa's 1st airport as well to improve trade and travel.

2 batches (11-Nov & 14-Nov) which visited the facility were given an indepth tour showing various unique features of the airport. The runway, on which the aircraft lands and barred for common man, was a delight to watch and to step on to it for photographs. The airport will feature a single runway (09/27), which will be 3,750m-long and

60m-wide. The runway is designed with the capacity to accommodate a Boeing 777-200. The runway will have two rapid exit ways interconnected with taxiways. The taxiway will be 3,750m-long and 25m-wide.

The visit to the Air traffic control tower was like icing on the cake to have a bird's eye view of the airport in total. Engineers at the ATC explained the activities at the tower. It was overall an experience to remember.

New Goa International Airport at Mopa in North Goa's Pernem taluka is being developed by GMR Airports Ltd. through its subsidiary GMR Goa International Airport Limited (GGIAL) with a four phase master plan to ultimately handle 13.1 passengers per annum (MPPA). This Airport project is based on the Public Private Partnership (PPP) model, which is based on a Design, Build, Finance, Operate and Transfer (DBFOT) basis. GGIAL will have the right to operate the airport for 40 years, extendable by another 20 years. Philippines' Megawide Construction Corporation is constructing the airport's passenger terminal, cargo facilities, ATC and associated buildings.




CPR Training

The Club has initiated to supply continuous rations to Keshav Seva Sadhana, Bethoda of a value of Rs. 10,000/- per month. Friend of Rotary- Adv Nitin Sardessai has committed to donate Rs. 5,000/- per month for a period of one year. Our Club members have committed to match the contribution so that the amount doubles up. This month, along with the contribution from Adv Nitin, Rtn Kedar Kenkre donated for the Rations.











Puranpoli

Wash 250 gm chana daal thoroughly. Empty it in cooker. Add 3 times water as it should cook really well. Take 5 to 6 whistles on medium flame

If there is excess water then remove it out and use it for making katachi aamti.

Now empty the cooked daal in a kadhai and add 250 g sugar/jaggery according to your choice to it. Keep it on low flame stirring continuously.

Once it is well cooked remove the daal and sugar mixture from flame and pour it hot in Puranpoli grinder.

Grind it well. Remove it in a bowl and to this add (cardamom+nutmeg) powder. Mix it

(cardamom+nutmeg) powder. Mix it well. Your Puranpoli base is ready.

Now knead a soft dough of wheat atta. Roll a small portion of it and fill it with the base made above and make small yummy Puranpolis on hot tava. Don't forget to serve them with pure ghee.


