Power Tiller helps in preparing the soil, , planting seeds, adding & spraying the fertilizers, herbicides & water. Additionally, it also helps in pumping water, harvesting, threshing & transporting crops. Of course, various attachments are required. We have provided them with some attachments as per their need. A power Tiller is ideal where the land size is small. There was a great demand of Power Tiller by the farmers of Kulpi, who cannot afford it, so that they can work fast in the field using this machine. The farmers were looking quite excited to see the machine and it was inaugurated by the President Rtn Rakesh Kumar Goel and PE Rtn Sashi Dhacholia in presence of Shri Himadri Sekhar Halder, who is running the Ramkrishnapur Rani Rashmani Seva Sangha and the farmers, who will use the machine in their respective fields.

COMPUTER ON 23.12.2023

We have provided one Complete set of Computer to Rotary Sarada Shishu Shiksha Niketan to help students of upto class-IV to learn about the basics of computers.



EYE SCREENING CAMP ON 24.12.2023

It was felt that there was need to have the Eye Screening camp in Ramakrishnapur, Kulpi area. The camp was held in association with Rotary Joynagar Eye Hospital. It was a day long camp. We were happy with the response when more than 200 persons turned up for the eye check-up. After screening it was found that 41 patients require Cataract surgeries. They will have to undergo ECG, Sugar and BP check-up before the surgery and more than 100 will be provided with power glasses. All the arrangements have been made for these follow up actions.





TOILETS AT KULPI ON 24.12.2023:

Our President Rtn Rakesh Kumar Goel was determined to provide the toilets to the villagers, who if agree for various conditions like (a) it should be in their own premises/ compound (b) continuous availability of water (c) there should be enough space for soak pit and toilet (d) to be used by the family members and (e) to pay initially Rs.3000/- for the soak pit. Only after the soak-pit is completed, then only after physical verification, the Club will construct the balance toilet for use. We personally visited residences of each of these villagers and some more deep inside the village to see the existing conditions and finalise the beneficiaries.

Out of 5 sites shown near Ramakrishnapur, Kulpi, we selected only 4 for the time being. If the project proves successful, we will provide more toilets to the villagers. The cost of each toilet will be Rs.14,000/- out of which the club will share Rs.11,000/-. The drawings are as approved by the Government of India for Rural area toilets, so all toilets will be constructed as per approved design.









MICRO-FINANCING AT RAMAKRISHNAPUR ON 24.12.2023:

Women empowerment is the most important subject in the Club as well as in Rotary International. Our Club is always ready to provide any help where women power can be increased or seen. Although the Club has very poor experience with previous Micro-credit projects regarding recovery of loans, however, the President wants the local women folk of Ramakrishnapur should come forward and the avail this facility to enhance their business. The project has been discussed with the ladies of Ramakrishnapur Rani Rashmani Seva Sangha and we are trying to find ways and means to make it fool proof and long term workable.

They in association with Rotary Club of Calcutta Metropolitan carried out repeated drives on teaching these farmers regarding the usage of organic fertilizers and pesticides.





UPDATE FROM NABADIGANTA DURGAPUR LEPROSY COLONY ON 20.1.2024

MUSHROOM: Last year, we supported for making infrastructure for the cultivation of Mushroom at Nabadiganta Durgapur Leprosy Colony. This project is now running very smoothly. This has benefitted the villagers of the colony. It was a great initiative for those who are not able to do something due to leprosy problems. They now produce organic mushroom to keep the society healthy and also marketing them to get some revenue for re-cycling the next cultivation.









VERMISCOMPOST: Again, last year we supported Nabadiganta Durgapur Leprosy Colony for Vermicompost infrastructure. This is important element for doing the cultivation for Organic farming. In other words, vermicompost is healthy fertilizer for any farming and others.



FISH FARMING: This was one of the projects, where farmers or villagers can expect earning regularly. This was sustainable project which ensured generation of income to the colony villagers so that they can live peacefully and with Honour. The response has been great.

ARTIFICIAL LIMBS UNDER LEG FOR LEGLESS PROJECT ON 26.1.2024

LIFE BEYOND CANCER ON 7.2.2024

We saw kids from the age group of 4 and above, diagnosed with Cancer particularly from the underprivileged community who would have otherwise gone home to suffer in silence as their parents were not able to afford the cost. An initiative of Rotary District-3291 with multiple clubs coming together for this cause under "Life beyond cancer" aimed at providing support to children for testing and treatment with dignity and comfort. The visit to the Paediatric Oncology Ward was heartbreaking to see small children undergoing treatment and most of them had their mothers by their side who had come leaving the rest of the family at home. There was a section for the kids diagnosed with Thalassemia along with their parents and some cases had their fathers by their side leaving all the work and supporting a child's treatment. The most reassuring fact was that the recovery is 90% if they can get it tested early before it reaches chronic stage. Hence the best help is providing the helping hand in getting tests done and treatment started on time. The average initial cost per child is 15,000/-. As a start RCCM is supporting 4 kids with a donation of 50,000/-.








ANNUAL ATHELTIC EVENT ON 29.1.2024






EARTH DAY CELEBRATION AT PACE LEARNING CENTRE ON 22.4.2024


