## Words of Wisdom



Artificial Intelligence is a very IN topic today- 'A new kid on the block', said Mr. Abhishek Kar deputy headtechnology at Injunction Services

Ltd. who was the guest speaker at the club's regular meeting on 9th November 2024. He spoke about various aspects of Al, how it is created, its pros and cons. In creating a 3D model everything is digitally defined. Texts were being converted into speech with sync.lips and animate face and then broadcasted. Human clones were being made. He said humans were in control but Al was an extremely efficient assistant. It can be used to reduce routine workload like data collection, converting text into script, reviewing, printing. Al had the ability to perform tasks like planning, reasoning, creativity etc. It is more efficient than google search matter. It selects the best suited algorithm out of a set of algorithms. ML (machine learning) was a branch of AI that focuses on the creation of intelligent machines that learn from data. If Cleopatra lived today how would she look like? Her face would be created by studying the facial structure of people of that era and area. John McCarthy is considered father of AI who proposed and modified the concept of Al. How can it help? It can execute orders, provide multiple pointed answers, provide more sophisticated design and ease of use, generate better summaries, give in time feedback due to sync. with several apps/sites etc. Very useful in healthcare, manufacturing, HR (saving time and making operation smoother). Useful in retail, customer assistance, good teachers (education), fraud detection and so on. and on. However there are negative aspects too. There will be loss of jobs, generating emotions, in areas of creativity like sports and entertainment, greenhouse effect due to generation & storage, driverless autos on busy streets can spell disaster AND it is an unknown territory. There was a lot of interaction at the end of the talk. Abhishek was introduced by Shampa Chakraborty and thanked by Seema Danda. A memento was presented to him by Vibha Mehta.

- ◆ Keep the momentum to spread the importance to keep India polio-free by enhancing/increasing visibility about the disease by public rallies, social media, visual aids etc.

### **Enigma of Fireflies**

In many forests in South India and elsewhere on a clear star lit evenings, the night comes alive with thousands of fireflies twinkling away - a wonder to watch. Fireflies communicate through their glow, lighting up vast forest areas. There are over 2000 firefly species worldwide and they have their own typical light pattern, rhythms of light which they repeat through the night particularly to find a mate. They show diverse lighting formation. Bright light hamper their mating process and they perish. They are not affected by red light but cannot function in white light(LED light). Rains are important in the lifecycle of fireflies and to their bioluminescence. They are farmers friends for their larvae eat agricultural pests. However pesticides, insecticides decimate them. A beautiful gift of nature they should be appreciated and their nocturnal habitats protected.


#### BABAR AL



- Social Entrepreneur Public Speaker & Educationist.
- Founder & Headmaster, Ananda Siksha Niketan, West Bengal, India
- Babar Ali started a school named "Ananda Siksha Niketan" (Home of Joyful Learning) in the backyard of his family's home when he

was nine years old, bringing affordable education to an impoverished area of West Bengal, India. At the age of 16, he was named as "Youngest Headmaster in the World" by the BBC. As a TED fellow and public speaker, Babar Ali inspired many individuals and organizations with his mission "Education for All". For the last 20 years since its inception, more than 7000 students benefited from complete free education from this institution. His biography is a part of the syllabus in different curricula across the globe. Hon'ble President of India, His Excellency, Shri Ramnath Kovind mentioned him and his work in his speech towards the nation on 25 January 2020.
