We shall continue our well-established events of felicitating doctors, nurses, teachers, young entrepreneurs of Goa, and recognizing the services of people from different low visibility vocations. We plan to conduct blood donation drives, health camps in schools and villages.

This year's Global Grant project shall be E-Vidya. Under this project, we plan to donate 18 smart boards to three schools of Goa. Work on this project is in the planning stage, and I hope to give you updates in the coming months.

Adrift in the Indian Ocean, lies a country we've heard mainly because of a movie and a few have travelled too.

Madagascar is truly one of the last undiscovered areas of the world where one can really escape the influences of the modern age and escape to places untouched by the outside world.

Recently, I had the privilege of embarking on an unforgettable journey to this enchanting island nation. I was invited by the Madagascar Tourism Board to discover its hidden treasures and promote it as a 'travel designer' for my travel firm PBA Holidays.

With over 30 countries under my belt, Madagascar effortlessly rose to the top of my list, intriguing me with its unparalleled natural beauty and I ventured to know more about the mysterious, untrodden island.

With landscapes "mars-like", thousands of endemic species of animals, and some of the world's most beautiful beaches, Madagascar is a dream destination.

I mainly found myself exploring the central region of Antananarivo and the southern region of the island called the Fort-Dauphin. A 2 hour flight from the capital city of Antananarivo 'Antana' I landed in a city called Tôlanaro.

Amidst landing I witnessed incredible aerial views of the coast along the Indian Ocean. From the city of Tôlanaro, a 3 hour scenic drive took me to the Berenty Reserve; a beautifully maintained natural reserve where you can witness more than 5 type of Lemurs that are endemic to the island.

These creatures are magnificent and I was in awe of their presence. This is one place where researchers, scientists and the best photographers visit to document these unique animals up very close.

My passion for photography took me to explore and spot these lemurs with a very well versed guide and an expert.

These creatures are super amusing; and each type has unique features. My 3 favourite ones being the Dancing Lemur, Ring-tailed lemur and the Mouse-Lemur.

The Dancing lemurs always look like they are on the dance floor for its unusual way of moving, Ring-tailed lemurs have elegant black and white stripes on it's tail and the mouse-lemurs are one of the smallest and cutest lemurs to find.

I was staying in a cottage centrally located within the reserve and had a great time surrounded by these very smart creatures.

Everything about this island is so special that even the vegetation like their aloe vera grows in an unusual way on a trunk called the "Aloe Vaombe" and a trip to Madagascar is unfinished business without witnessing the Baobab trees.

These are how I'd imagine trees would look like if we discovered on Mars. These trees can grow as high as 8 floors tall and can have a trunk circumference of as broad as 10 meters.









Watching the sunset behind a silhouette of baobabs is an experience that lingers in my memory long after leaving Madagascar's shores.

One of my stand-out nights here was a night trek in the dry forests in search to witness the mouse-lemurs. A pitch black starry night with professional guides and rangers we went exploring with just one flashlight.

And upon walking quite deep into the forest we spotted the Sportive lemurs. These little ones are supper shy and small and so it took me more than 20 minutes to get this shot here.

The middle part of my time here I headed to the Nahampoana Reserve where I was guided in a walking trail followed by a boat exploration between the rainforests of the south-east.

Later, I was welcomed to a exotic boutique property over a cliff overlooking the Indian Ocean called the Talinjoo Hotel. This is a prefect getaway for a peaceful beach-side experience amended with luxury. Each and every room here is overlooking the turquoise blue waters and is beyond imagination.

From here I was able to explore a small remote island which took us a 1 hr boat ride across 3 lakes, walking past a local village and an hour of trekking over the mountainous terrain to reach the magnificent clearest waters I've ever experienced and dipped in.

Here in the remotest part of the island we were hosted by a special lunch prepared by the gracious locals from a village close-by.

Beyond its natural wonders, Madagascar is enriched by its diverse cultures and warm-hearted people. My time here, I had the privilege of meeting a lot of Malagasy people whose hospitality and genuine curiosity left a lasting impression.

In the highlands of Antananarivo - the capital city, I immersed myself in the vibrant markets where artisans sell intricately woven textiles and handmade crafts. Each piece is a testament to the craftsmanship passed down through generations.

Before my trip, like many travellers, I encountered concerns about safety in Madagascar. Media reports often highlight challenges, especially of the crime rate being high. But, my personal experience painted a different picture.

Throughout my stay and internal travel, I felt welcomed and safe, surrounded by warm locals who were eager to share their heritage.

On my return flight, I spoke with fellow travellers who echoed similar sentiments of having enjoyed a trouble-free and enriching experience in Madagascar. While it's of course important to stay cautious regardless of where one travels, my firsthand encounter reassured me that Madagascar is a destination where the rewards far outweigh any





perceived risks.

Madagascar is more than just a travel destination; it is evidence to the wonders of our natural world and the resilience of its people. From the allure of its pristine beaches to the awe-inspiring biodiversity that defines its landscapes, every moment spent on this island is a revelation.

Being an avid travel promoter myself, I am committed to showcasing Madagascar's splendour to the world, inviting discerning travellers to embark on their own life changing journey of discovery.

Let go of the misconceptions! Embrace adventure, and uncover the magic of Madagascar - a destination that promises memories to treasure for a lifetime.

BUSINESS CORNER

The love story of Dattaraj Salgaocar, Mukesh Ambani's childhood friend, and Ambani's youngest sister Deepti, began in Mumbai's first Skyscraper, Usha Kiran.

Located on Carmichael Road, one of the city's most exclusive residential areas, this building housed both families. Deepti lived on the 22nd floor while Dattaraj resided on the 14th.

After the untimely passing of Dattaraj's father, Vasudev Salgaocar, founder and chairman of the V M Salgaocar Group of Companies, Dhirubhai Ambani, the patriarch of the Ambani family and founder of Reliance, became a mentor to the young Salgaocar. Dhirubhai and Vasudev were young Salgaocar.

Dhirubhai and Vasudev were great friends, often bonding over plates of hot onion bhajis and Camparis. Dattaraj's frequent visits to the Ambani home led to a close friendship with Mukesh and Anil Ambani, and eventually, he fell in love with their sister Deepti. "I met Deepti, we fell in love and told our families, who agreed [with the relationship] immediately... It was the first wedding in her family, but the last wedding in mine, because I am the youngest of seven children," Dattaraj recalled in an interview with DNA.

A Grand Wedding and Move to Goa

The couple got married in 1983 and moved to Goa in January 1984. They settled into Dattaraj's sprawling ancestral home in Chicalim, close to Dabolim Airport. Designed by architect Rallino Souza, the mansion features exquisitely landscaped gardens.

Luxurious Properties in Goa

Apart from their Chicalim mansion, Dattaraj and Deepti own several other luxurious properties. They have a beachfacing house in Candolim and another home in Dona Paula, near Panjim. Perched on a cliff, the Dona Paula home offers a mesmerizing 360-degree view of the Arabian Sea. While the exact prices of these properties have not been disclosed, their prime locations suggest they are worth multiple crores.

Sports Ventures

In 1974, the Salgaocars formed the Salgaocar Cricket Club

under the V M Salgaocar Corporation banner. Over the years, the club's team won major tournaments like the GCA



Premier Division, the Bandodkar Trophy, and the Dhargalkar Trophy. Dattaraj served as the President of the Goa Cricket Association (GCA) from 1994 to 1997.

Beyond cricket, Dattaraj capitalized on his passion for football by co-founding FC Goa in the Indian Super League alongside Virat Kohli, Venugopal Dhoot (Chairman of Videocon Industries Limited), and Shrinivas Dempo



(Chairman of the Dempo group). However, he stepped down from ownership in 2016.

Patron of the Arts

In 2009, Dattaraj established the Sunaparanta Goa Centre for the Arts, a non-profit initiative promoting local artists. The Centre is located in Altinho hills of Panjim and features exhibition galleries, a library, a multi-functional space for workshops and lectures, an open-air amphitheater, and a cafe. Deepti serves as the vice-chairperson and advisory board member.

Other Roles and Achievements

Dattaraj Salgaocar, also a photographer and wildlife conservation activist, holds various prominent positions: Chairman of the V.M. Salgaocar Institute of International Hospitality Education.

President of V.M. Salgaocar College of Law Vice President of the Goa International Centre Founder Member of the Brookings India Initiative

Private Life

Dattaraj and Deepti, along with their children Vikram and Isheta, maintain a low profile despite their extensive involvement in various industries and cultural activities. Their wealth and influence continue to grow, cementing their status as prominent figures in Goa and beyond.

What is the purpose of financial markets?






