96.Kitchen Garden Setting-up Project



On 04.11.2024, as part of District Project UYARE, the Satellite Club of RC Trivandrum Suburban initiated a Kitchen Garden Setting-up Project at Salvation Army Higher Secondary School, Kowdiar, empowering students with hands-on experience in eco-friendly kitchen gardening and self-sufficiency. The project commenced with a welcome

address by Headmistress Smt. Pushpalatha, followed by a presidential address from President Rtn. Dr. Saritha Baiju. Rtn. Lekha C S (Rtd Asst Director, Agriculture Dept), Coordinator and Sponsor of the Project formally introduced the initiative. She also introduced the Resource Person, Smt. Geethakumari V S, Rtd Deputy Director, Agriculture Department. Smt. Geethakumari provided an informative training session on establishing a kitchen garden, after which a model garden was set up on the school premises. The club supplied necessary materials, including grow bags, potting mixture, saplings, seeds, manure, and tools. Students actively participated by filling grow bags and planting saplings and seeds. Despite torrential rain, the children's enthusiasm remained unwavering. In closing remarks, Rtn. Renuka Kartha informed that two to three Satellite Club Members would regularly visit the school on frequent intervals to evaluate progress and motivate students, and also to ensure the project's continuity. K G Nair, Rtn. Vinod Narayanan, Rtn. Dr. Baiju Ramachandran, Rtn. Dr. Ciniraj Raveendran, Rtn. R Ramesh, Rtn. Albert Alex, Rtn. Dhananjayan, Rtn. Venugopal K, and Rtn. Baiju Balakrishnan. The discussion concluded that Donald Trump's return to the White House was expected to strengthen the US-India strategic partnership, particularly in defense and counter-terrorism, given their shared interest in countering China.



However, Trump's protectionist approach may lead to trade frictions and impact India's economy, especially in manufacturing and technology sectors. Despite potential challenges, analysts view Trump's presidency as more favorable for India than Kamala Harris', citing benefits from supply chain shifts and domestic demand-driven growth.

113. Free Medical Camp at Naruvamood

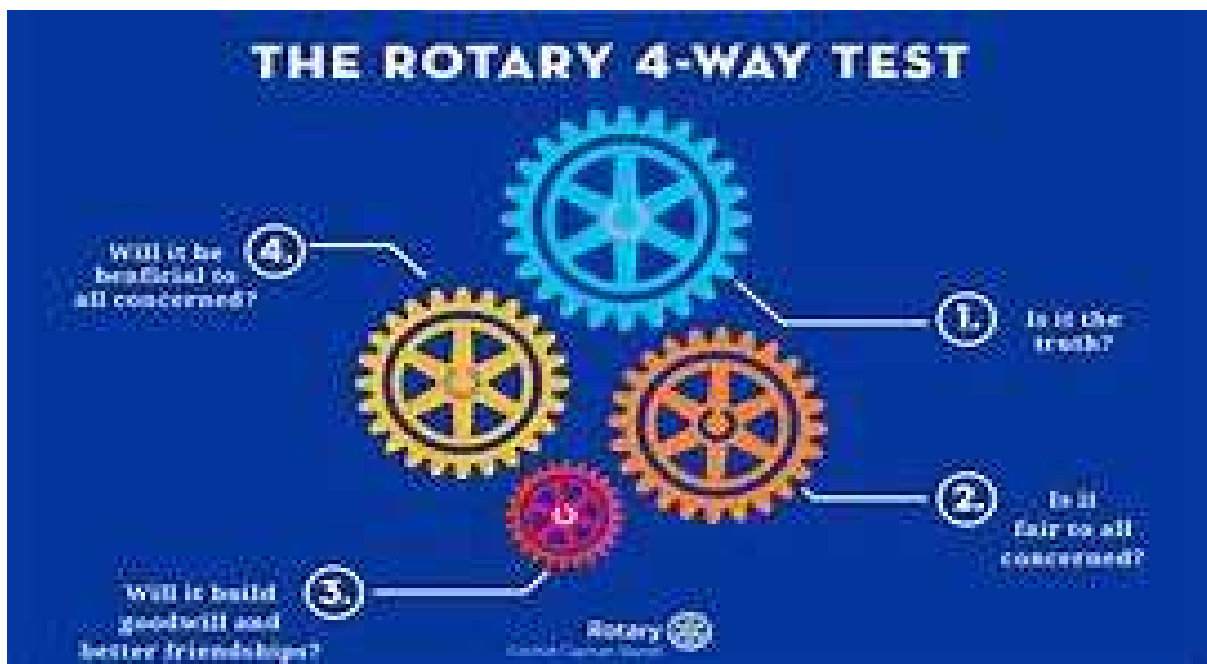
