K.C. Vijayan ஆகிய நான்...

1941 October born, K.C.Vijayan is a B.Sc, B.L graduate Madras University and he enrolled himself with the Bar Council of Madras in 1962 as a youngest lawyer. Strange but true, that later he qualified himself as a Welding Technologist at the renowned Kingston College of Technology, UK and had extensive training in the manufacture of Welding Electrodes with the Rockweld – Arcos group in their Surrey, UK Plant in 1964-1965. He became a member of the Indian Institute of Welding and also the Welding Institute of London. Subsequently as an Industrialist engaged in the manufacture of special types of Welding Electrodes for over 35 years in the Ambattur Industrial Estate, he later became a Consultant to Cement Industries on Welding and Hard Surfacing Applications. Now, as a qualified lawyer, he specializes in "Law-Conveyancing".



K.C.Vijayan was instrumental in the formation of the New Club "The Rotary Club of Madras Northwest" sponsored by the Anna Nagar Club and became its Charter President in the year 1989 where he continues to be a member. He personally met and handpicked 27 leaders, who were not Rotarians earlier, as Charter Members of the New Club. K.C.Vijayan was the advisor and played the key role in sponsoring Rotary Club of Aarch City Madras by the Rotary Club of Madras Northwest. Rotary Club of Madras Northwest Educational and Charitable Trust awards educational scholarships, support medicare programs and many other community service activities.

Polio Eradication Initiatives

Convalescing after a devastating road accident, still on crutches, K.C.Vijayan accepted the challenge of leading the PolioPlus team of RI Dist. 3230 from 1995. Due to Rotary's advocacy, Government of India gifted the Pulse Polio Immunisation Programme (NID) to the Nation. From then on, it was a march for Vijayan against this crippling disease. He literally masterminded the PPI and other related programmes in this part of the world. Initially there was a lot of resistance from medical profession for the Pulse the Polio Immunisation Programme because of the dependence an the routine immunization. He overcame all the obstacles with his sincere dedicated work and was aptly conferred the "Doctors Day Award" by the Indian Medical Association.

For his untiring Polio eradication efforts, and for continuously helping the Corporation of Chennai, K.C.Vijayan was honoured by the then Mayor of Chennai (Madras) during official ceremonial parades held to commemorate the Republic Day, 26th January every year for four consecutive years.

Service Above Self Award is Rotary's highest award was conferred upon Rtn.PP.K.C.Vijayan for the selfless service being continuously rendered by him. Rtn.PP.K.C.Vijayan with the natives in Zimbabwe. Blessed with one daughter Aparna, a music student who is also a Paul Harris Fellow and is married to SUDHARSHAN, a computer engineer from Canada and they are blessed with a son and a daughter, Rajnarayan and Rajshri, both students.

DIGITAL LEARNING PROGRAMME - TATA CLASSEDGE

We inaugurated a Digital Learning Programme, named Tata Class Edge at the Govt High & Middle School in Pandeshwaram on 1st July. Under this programme, each school is provided a desktop computer, projector, speaker, mounting kit, network accessories and digital content. The students benefit immensely from the programme, which brings a holistic approach to learning by combining content that is aligned to CBSE, ICSE & all State Boards; practical learning through 2D & 3D virtual interactive labs; inside industry insights through real life videos shot in labs and factories across the Tata Group; and other features such as Diagram maker and interactive timelines. Besides, there is a 'School Connect' feature which is a single platform to manage parent-teacher communications, monitor usage of the tool, syllabus coverage, and progress reports. The Project cost of Rs 1.26 lakhs was funded by the Wheels Global Foundation (WGF), a pan IIT outfit, Thanks to Rtn Yadav Murti as he is the Southern Regional Chair in WGF.





KALVI SHAKTI - RURAL INTERACTION CENTER

In association with Pravartak, an IIT incubation Center of Indian Institute of Technology, Madras, located in the IITM Research Park, We inaugurated a Rural Interaction center at Pandeswaram Govt School. Pravartak conducts online training classes between 6 - 8 pm for students in classes 8 to 12 in English, Mathematics and Science. This is called as "Kalvi Shakti Programme" which means Power of Learning. These centers are essentially only in rural areas for government schools. Thanks to Rtn Yadav Murti as he connected Pravaratak, and arranged funding by them on behalf of our Club, for 2 smart TVs, router, modem and internet connection as a special case. The total cost is Rs.1.5 Lakhs. They also conducted high quality education classes in IT in Asha Vidya Shakti Rural Technology Centres. There are 6 such centres covering about 6000 students.

THE WISH TO BE USEFUL AFTER DEATH

There are many Dhanam's (Donations) in this World.... Eye donation, Blood donation, Food donation, Organ donation etc... Donation in any form is a great, humbling, noble gesture as it helps those in need. Body donation is the act of giving a deceased person's body to a licensed anatomical facility or body donor program. The donor can provide written consent before death, or a next of kin can provide consent after death. People who want their death to be meaningful can give their willingness to donate their full body after their death for medical research.

Our Secretary Rtn Ramma Suresh shares her personal experience about Full Body Donation. This is to create awareness and promote the noble gesture of Full Body Donation. One has to make prior arrangements with the local medical college (eg. MMC) before death. The individual has to fill a consent form with two witness to sign the form and a photograph. Once the form is submitted, the Anatomical Department of MMC will register and send home a Donor card with the details.

My Father, Mr. S. Ramamurti, an Officer in Northern Railways always wanted to donate his full body for the study of medical students. His decision took many in my family by surprise and shock as it was not done by anyone else in my family. My Father, being an Atheist wanted even his body to be of use to others than to be cremated or buried.

Years back the Government of India was not allowing full body donation after death and a person could donate only some organs like eyes heart etc. My father waited and just a few years before his death in 2012, Our Indian Government allowed "Full Body Donation" after death and my father registered with MMC. Honouring his last wish, after my Father's demise, without doing any final rituals, his body was given to the Anatomical Department of MMC. Such a noble donation motivated my Mom, my Aunt and me, to also register with MMC for Full Body Donation. So we have said No to doing any religious rituals and to give back what God gave us... Our Body, to help the medical students learn and practice their skills. We are born empty handed and its fitting to go back empty handed and to do a good deed when we finally bid adieu to this Life!
