## Rotary International News

Project Hope, an initiative of RC Chennai Industrial City, RID 3232, has undertaken the renovation of Block 15 in the Institute of Mental Health (IMH) in Kilpauk, Chennai. Block 15 serves as a refuge for nearly 100 mentally challenged patients with severe mental illnesses such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and personality disorder.

The renovation project, carried out in the first phase, focused on Ward 6 and involved various improvements. Damaged floors and walls were repaired, outdated furniture and equipment were replaced, and a toilet block was constructed. Additionally, a wide platform and a ramp were built in the garden area. These additions will facilitate therapeutic interventions like yoga and exercise, group therapy sessions, and individual counseling. The renovation also aimed to improve lighting and ventilation, which would contribute to the overall health and well-being of the patients.

The total budget for the project was \$112,000 (₹93.5 lakh), and the cost of renovating Ward 6 amounted to \$12,050 (₹10.24 lakh). The refurbished block was inaugurated by RIPE Gordon McInally in the presence of RID A S Venkatesh and DG N Nandakumar. McInally emphasized the significance of addressing mental health issues and reducing the associated stigma.

and unity.













































































































- The first service project of the first Rotary Club was the installation of public toilets in Chicago in 1917. This project made Rotary the World's First Service Club.
- There's a secondary motto: "One profits most who serves best."
- The first women joined Rotary in 1987. Today, more than 196,000 women are members of Rotary International.
- There are more than 1.2 million Rotarians all over the world in more than 35,000 Rotary Clubs in more than 200 countries in all geographic areas.
- Rotary became bilingual in 1916, when it organized a non-English-speaking Club in Cuba.
- In 1929, The Rotary Foundation made its first gift, \$500, to the International Society for Crippled Children.
- In 1968, the first Rotary Club banner to orbit the moon was carried by astronaut Frank Borman, a member of the Houston Space Center Rotary Club.
- The largest Rotary Club is the Oklahoma City Downtown Club with over 600 members.
