



s part of the New Learnings committee, under the Vocational services of the Rotary Club of Madras, event No.4 was the High Court heritage walk on February 2, 2025.

18 of us Rotarians, anns and annettes, attended this heritage tour of the 132-year-old Madras High Court, led by Senior Advocate N.L. Rajah.

The tour began at the museum and proceeded through the building, highlighting key locations like Court Hall number 1, the Bar Council's room, the former lighthouse and the dome overlooking the campus. Rajah's narrative brought the history of the building and the Indian legal system to life, covering architectural details, landmark judgments and important legal figures.

His insights on the differences between Eastern and Western approaches to uniformity and diversity, as illustrated by the court's design and traditions, were well appreciated. He also explained the

historical significance of the area surrounding the High Court, considered the birthplace of modern India and the court's retention of the name "Madras."



An important milestone towards more value-added services.


