





#### A Vocational Services Learning Initiative:

A few of us from the Rotary Club of Madras had the privilege of experiencing the extraordinary journey of The Plastic Odyssey. This pioneering vessel has been sailing since setting sail from France two years ago. With a diverse crew of 20, comprising 10 seamen and 10 experts in raising awareness against plastic, they've travelled via North Africa, crossed the Atlantic, stopped in Brazil and traversed the Pacific, making a stop in Chennai before heading to South Africa on their way back to France. Their mission is ambitious: to reduce plastic waste by recycling ocean plastic and, more crucially inspiring individuals & entrepreneurs to adopt sustainable practices and avoid single-use plastic. Onboard, the vessel is cleverly designed, featuring prototype recycling machines, a display area showcasing innovative recycled plastic furniture, and even a full plastic-free kitchen. During our visit, our host, Thibault, enthusiastically shared their vision and we were impressed by their dedication. Kudos to Rtn. Mong the many community service activities our club has undertaken over the years, one notable initiative from 1974 was our family planning programme. As part of this, 2,006 men underwent vasectomy at Stanley Hospital in alignment with the Government's scheme.

**1972:** Two Ambulance Vans (Rs.35,600 each) were presented, one to Government Royapettah Hospital through Hon. K. Anbazhagan, Minister of Health and the other to the Defence Service through Major General M.R.R. Rajwade, Goa, TN, M & K Area.

**1973:** Tailoring classes started at Rotary Nagar on 13-11-1973, inaugurated by Rtn. Dist Governor C.V. George.

**1974:** Family planning in North Madras 2,006 people underwent vasectomy operation at Govt Stanley Hospital. The Commissioner of Madras Corporation, Shri T.V. Antony, IAS gave his full cooperation for the success of the Family Planning programs of our club.

**1975-76:** Donations were made to visually impaired individuals through the National Federation of the Blind, including 50 folding sticks. Additionally, a television set was donated to the School for the Deaf in Santhome and another to the Andhra Mahila Sabha Orthopedic Center.
