

#### **District Governor Official Visit and 39th Weekly Meeting**

held on 01-04-2025 at Hotel Hyatt Regency, Teynampet, Chennai

#### Call to Order:

President Rtn. G. Chella Krishna called the meeting to order and requested all members to rise for a silent invocation.

#### **Confirmation of Minutes:**

The President sought confirmation for the 38th weekly meeting minutes, which were passed and adopted by the members.

#### Welcome Address:

President Rtn. G. Chella Krishna welcomed District Governor Rtn. N.S. Saravanan, District Secretary Rtn. Vidya Raghu, Past District Governors, Past Presidents, Rotarians from other clubs, distinguished guests, spouses and friends. He also welcomed his father Rtn. PDG C.N. Gangadharan and his mother Mrs. Geetha Gangadharan.

#### **President's Address:**

Rtn. G. Chella Krishna highlighted the club's accomplishments in its 96th year, including:

- Construction of WASH infrastructure
- Homes for the homeless project
- Launch of a new vocational centre
- Interact programs across 28 schools.
- · A flagship cervical cancer initiative
- International projects, including partnerships with Uganda to conduct Paediatric Heart Surgeries.
- Successful fundraising efforts and leadership development
- Special appreciation was extended to various directors and teams for their contributions.

#### **Felicitation of Padma Bhushan Awardee:**

Padma Bhushan Rtn. Dr. Nalli Kuppuswami Chetti was felicitated by DG Rtn. N.S. Saravanan and President Rtn. G. Chella Krishna for his outstanding contributions and for being conferred the Padma Bhushan by the Government of India. Rtn. Dr. Nalli Kuppuswami Chetti addressed the gathering, expressed his gratitude and shared valuable insights.

#### **Project Inaugurations:**

High-impact projects were virtually inaugurated by DG Rtn. N.S. Saravanan and President Rtn. G. Chella Krishna:

- Balwadi at Kanathur: Sponsored by Aptus Value Housing Finance India Ltd. to support preschool children's nutrition, education and health.
- Touching Tiny Hearts in Uganda: A global grant project providing life-saving heart surgeries for 25 children in partnership with Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences.
- Mammogram Installation at Viluppuram Regional



Screening Center: Rs. 1 crore project funded by AXS Healthcare to enhance cancer screening services.

- Laparoscopic Equipment for RSRM Hospital: Equipment worth Rs. 94 lakhs, sponsored by SBI Mutual Funds, to improve women's healthcare services.
- RCM VHS Paediatric Palliative Home Care Program: A project supporting home-based care for children with critical illnesses in partnership with Voluntary Health Services.

#### **Secretary's Report:**

Honorary Secretary Rtn. Rajesh Mani provided an overview of the agenda. He reflected on the club's theme for the year, "Bond, Build, and Bring Cheer," explaining how it guided the club's initiatives and projects.

#### **Key Highlights of the Report:**

#### **Club Service Activities:**

- Eight fellowships were organized, including Hawaiian Night, Deepavali celebrations, Oktoberfest, Christmas, Pongal and International Peace Night.
- Conducted 20+ fireside meetings, engaging over 300 Rotarians and spouses.
- Hosted 37 curated sessions with renowned speakers like Arvind P. Datar, Manoj Kumar (Naandi Foundation) and Rajdeep Sardesai.
- Organized unique activities, including the Pulicat Flamingo Ride, St. Thomas Mount trek and Pickleball sessions.
- Held the RCM Royal Quiz at Amir Mahal with 125+ participants.
- Arranged a Mumbai getaway featuring a visit to Nita Mukesh Ambani Cultural Centre (NMACC) and an exclusive meeting with Anand Mahindra.

#### **Community Service Initiatives:**

 Upgraded school infrastructure through large-scale WASH projects, improving hygiene and facilities.



- Built classrooms, toilet complexes and kitchens in government schools and Sri Ramakrishna Math National School.
- Restored lakes at Old Perungalathur and Kadaperi, benefiting 4.5 lakh residents.
- Completed 60 homes under the "Homes for the Homeless" initiative, aiming for 100.
- Promoted green initiatives with tree plantations and recycling programs.

#### **Health Initiatives:**

- Conducted an HPV vaccination drive with Adyar Cancer Institute, benefiting 1,000+ young girls.
- Donated mammogram machines to Tiruvannamalai and Villupuram for breast cancer screening.
- Sponsored nearly 100 paediatric heart surgeries in partnership with top hospitals.

#### **Vocational Services:**

- Conducted skill development programs, including Al training and certified courses.
- Provided financial aid for tuition and scholarships, benefiting 70-100 children.
- Trained 350+ graduates in computers, apparel and English with NIT and the Apparel Council.
- Opened a new vocational training center at Rotary Nagar.

#### **Youth Services:**

- Partnered with 25 schools to promote leadership and collaboration.
- Launched the "Streetscape Project" to create greener learning spaces.
- Organized an International Youth Exchange Program in Malaysia.
- Held a RYLA camp in Kumbakonam.
- Conducted peace essay competitions and industrial visits.

#### **International Services:**

- Strengthened global ties through sister clubs and international events.
- Supported an eye surgery project in Ghana and donated an ambulance to Burundi.
- Promoted peace through sensitization programs, essay competitions and art for peace campaigns.
   Publicity and Public Relations:
- Published "Lighthouse" magazine on time, showcasing RCM's activities and achievements.
- Featured nostalgic reflections on the club's milestones.

#### **Closing Remarks:**


The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Rtn Nikhil Raj.

## **A Year of Purpose - Driven Progress**

he Rotary Club of Madras gathered for the Official District Governor's visit. It wasn't just another evening; it was a moment to reflect on a year of relentless service and the impact of a community bound by purpose. As the President took the stage, the theme of the year—Bond. Build. Bring Cheer resonated through every word. It was more than a slogan; it was a commitment that shaped every initiative, project and life touched by RCM.

Building strong relationships within the club has always been a cornerstone of its success. This year, the bonds of fellowship were strengthened through vibrant gatherings that blended culture and camaraderie. From the Hawaiian Fellowship to a Deepavali celebration infused with Chettinad traditions and the high-energy "Let's Get Rocked" musical night, every event helped build connections that went beyond formalities.

More than 20 fireside meetings engaged over 300 Rotarians and their families, turning casual conversations into friendships and collaborations. The Mumbai getaway, featuring an exclusive meeting with Mr. Anand Mahindra and a mesmerizing show at NMACC, exemplified how meaningful interactions can enrich lives.

Rotary is about action and this year's initiatives have been nothing short of transformative. Community Service projects led by RCM have made the landscape of education, sanitation and water conservation. Classroom construction, improved sanitation facilities and the introduction of a noon meal kitchen at Sri Ramakrishna Math National School have ensured better learning environments for children. The club's ongoing lake restoration projects have revived important water bodies and provided clean water to hundreds of thousands of people.

Projects were also virtually launched during the Governor's visit, marking another milestone in RCM's commitment to service. Initiatives such as the inauguration of the Balwadi at Kanathur, the installation of a mammogram unit at the Cancer Institute's Rural Screening Center in Villupuram and the launch of Paediatric Palliative Home Care are extending RCM's reach to those in critical need.

Perhaps the most heartwarming endeavour has been Homes for the Homeless, giving marginalized families the security of a permanent roof. With nearly 60 homes completed, this initiative is changing lives one foundation at a time.





Vocational training, skill development programs and scholarships continue to empower individuals with education and employment opportunities. From Al training to supporting women in becoming auto drivers and nurse aides, the club is building a future of self-sufficiency and dignity.

What's service without joy? The club's healthcare initiatives have given families hope and healing. The HP Vax campaign, in collaboration with Adyar Cancer Institute, has provided HPV vaccinations to over 1,000 young girls, taking a crucial step toward cervical cancer prevention.

Two donated mammogram machines are ensuring early breast cancer detection in underserved areas, while nearly 100 pediatric heart surgeries have given children a new lease on life. These initiatives are proof of RCM's commitment to public health.



Through youth programs, international service initiatives and sustainability drives, RCM has continued to spread joy—not just within the club but across communities and even beyond borders.

None of these accomplishments would have been possible without the dedication of countless individuals. The evening was dedicated to acknowledging the relentless efforts of committee leaders, project directors and members who gave their time, energy and passion despite their busy lives to make a difference.

The CSR and Fundraising team played a pivotal role in securing nearly ₹17 crores, ensuring that every initiative had the financial backing it needed. Their ability to rally support, coupled with fundraising events like RCM PL, Jaya – the Lillete Dubey play, and the RCM Golf















Tournament, has set new benchmarks for philanthropy. Behind the scenes, the Finance team ensured smooth operations, streamlined processes and impeccable compliance, proving that every successful mission needs a strong backbone.

As the evening drew to a close, the message was clear: This is only the beginning. ## Inauguration of the New Rotary Centre

n the 31st of March, the Rotary Club of Madras (RCM) celebrated a significant milestone in its decades-long journey of service with the inauguration of a brand-new centre at the Rotary Nagar. The newly constructed 3,000-square-foot building, spread across three floors, is designed to serve the diverse needs of the Rotary Nagar community. The first-floor features two tuition rooms for schoolchildren, while the second floor hosts a digital literacy lab and a multi-purpose vocational training room.




