An Evening of Aces and Anecdotes:

A Federer Cousin's Court-Side Commentary on Som & Praj's Power-Packed Chat By M. Federer (Roger's lesser-known, pretty & witty cousin)

As someone who once graced the hallowed lawn of Wimbledon—not Centre Court, mind you, but the gift shop near Gate 4, I've always felt a deep kinship with tennis greats. So, when I heard that two of India's finest racketeers - Somdev and Prajnesh were stepping into the spotlight not to serve aces but serve stories, I cleared my diary faster than Novak Djokovic clears match points.

And what an afternoon that was!

Picture this: A room brimming with tennis fans, laughter ricocheting like a forehand down the line, and in the middle of it all, two athletesturned-sages casually unearthing the unfiltered, uncut drama of their careers. Think less "match highlights" and more "behind-thescenes Netflix docuseries, but better."

Som opened the session with the kind of poise you expect from a man who's played Andy Murray and a concert for his college mates (the guitar was involved, but that's a tale for another issue). He began by declaring that his and Prajnesh's careers didn't overlap much.

"In Chennai," he said, "I was 16, he was 12. And at that age, you don't hit together. You steal each other's Gatorade."

From there, he plunged into a storybook-style recounting of Prajnesh's comeback from

injury; four years of rehab, zero ranking, and "more problems than a math book." (Roger, if you're reading this, we've got a new line for your next press conference.)

Som wove his words like a seasoned storyteller, lacing praise with punchlines. "He really doesn't like German food," he quipped, narrating Praj's time in Europe. "Which is probably why he kept winning. He was running away from schnitzel."

Prajnesh "The Warrior Monk" Gunneswaran

Now if Som was the philosopher, Praj was the monk who traded his robe for a Yonex. Calm, modest, and sneakily hilarious, he shared what it was like to be unranked, injured, and undeterred. He confessed, "My body wasn't allowing me to do what my mind wanted. So, I changed trainers, changed programs, and told myself that if it hurts, I'll go till I can't walk."

Spoiler alert: He walked. Then, ran. Then, flew past the Futures, demolished the Challenger circuit, and found himself in the top 100 faster than you can say "Hawkeye Challenge."

And just when we thought it couldn't get more cinematic—the Asian Games bronze match story dropped like a Federer backhand slice.

Cramps. Collapse. The umpire screaming. Rain. Rolling under a chair because he couldn't walk.

A real-time Bollywood screenplay, complete with divine intervention and a last-minute resurrection. Even my aunt Renuka Federer (who thinks tennis is soup) sat up during this bit.

Then came the ATP Grand Slam tales. "I played Roger at No.1, Rafa at No.1, Novak at No.1. Andy at No.2." Praj said. "Did you beat them?" someone asked. "No. But I played them," he deadpanned. That, my friends, is peak athlete humour. You can't teach that. He also reflected on how awe-inspiring it was to stand across from the greats—not in posters, but real life. "Medvedev was eye-opening," he said. "I realized just how much higher the level gets." Which is funny, because most members in the audience were realizing how rare humility like his, gets.

Flashbacks, Friendships, and Federer

Som even reminisced about the 2016 Chennai pre-season camp, where four Indian talents (Som, Praj, Sumit Nagal, and Dakshin) trained in anonymity and sweat. "Eight years later," Som said, "one is an NCAA champ, two broke the top 100, and one's me—writing LinkedIn articles."

Laughter erupted and applause echoed as

these two homegrown legends continued to serve life lessons disguised as tennis banter.

They spoke about courts, cramps, comebacks, and courage. But beneath the surface, what all members really witnessed was a rare double act; two warriors, bonded by bruises and belief, giving everyone frontrow seats to their inner journeys.





M. Federer's Final Thoughts

As the lights dimmed and the members left with phones full of videos and hearts full of admiration, I took a quiet moment to reflect. It's easy to admire tennis players when they lift trophies. But what Som and Praj shared wasn't about trophies. It was about the dark rooms of doubt, the pain no cameras catch, and the

choice to keep fighting anyway. Roger, you've won 20 Slams. But yesterday, your cousin witnessed two champions who've mastered something even tougher: resilience without spotlight. And that, my friend, is the real Grand Slam.

His warmth, wit, and insistence on closeness were ever-present. Even at 95, he stunned us with his vigor. During our last visit, Paddhu and I witnessed him navigate his home with ease—recalling Club

Without a moment's hesitation, he declared, "I want to be a Rotarian." That is the depth of the impact Periappa had on all of us.


His legacy isn't just in the accolades or the medicine he practiced. It lives in the lives he




