


A Board of Directors Meeting was scheduled in order to discuss the upcoming projects.

7. MEGA HEALTH CHECKUP CAMP

Rotary Club of Jamshedpur Steel City organized a Mega Health Checkup Camp "Arogya Mela" in association with the Jamshedpur branch of Shrimad Rajchandra Atma Tatva Research Center on 19 January 2025 in the premises of Narbheram Hansraj English Medium School.. Aarogyam Hospital organized the entire team of pathologists and Doctors. The blood samples were collected from 7:30 am on an empty stomach. About 370 patients registered themselves for this blood test which took care of some 44 parameters. Fresh, hot breakfast was given free of cost. From 10am, we had a team of about 25 doctors examining the health of over 470 people under various heads like Physician, ENT, Orthopedic, Gynaec, Cardiac, Dermatologist, pediatrician, Ayurveda, etc.
