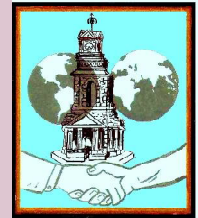

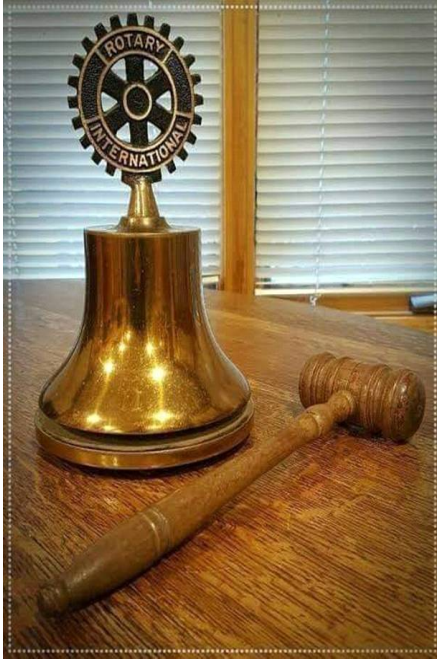

Significant Amendments proposed and adopted in 2024 Council of Legislations: -

- To request the RI Board to consider recommending that presidents-elect complete the Club President Basics learning plan prior to attending PETS.
- To request the RI Board to consider creating a status of 'club in formation' during the period preceding a new club's charter.
- To request the RI Board to consider recommending that each district establish a District Council on Legislation committee.
- To request the RI Board to consider implementing enhancements to the training for assistant governors.
- To request the RI Board and the TRF Trustees to consider amending the Codes of Policies to state that officers will refrain from making public statements in support of or against conflicts around the world when acting in their official capacity.
- To request the RI Board to consider maintaining a firm position on the prohibition of political subjects by RI.
- To request the RI Board to consider adding Hindi as one of the officially recognized languages of RI.
- To request the RI Board to consider undertaking a detailed review of the cost-to-value proposition associated with the Rotary magazines.
- To request the RI Board to consider establishing guidelines for Rotary clubs and Rotarians when providing support during large-scale disasters.
- To request the RI Board to consider respecting all religions prior to deciding matters of place, date, and time for meetings.
- To request the RI Board to consider allowing Rotaractors to serve as sergeants-at-arms at RI events.
- To request the Trustees to consider increasing the percentage of funds distributed to districts.
- To request the Trustees to consider modifying the (DDF) SHARE allocation ratio for district grants from 50:50 to 60:40.
- To request the Trustees to consider allowing unused district grant funds to be used in funding the district grant of the subsequent year.
- To request the Trustees to consider allowing district grants to support activities for up to three years instead of one.
- To request the Trustees to consider reinstating the 100 percent match formerly offered by the World Fund for District Designated Funds used in global grants.
- To request the Trustees to consider allocating recognition points for donations made to TRF's Endowment Fund.
- To request the Trustees to consider establishing a Polio Plus Society.



History of the Rotary Bell

In 1922, U.S. Rotarians organised an attendance contest; the challenge was that the losing clubs would join in giving the winning club a prize.

The Rotary Club of New York City was declared the winner and to them was awarded as a prize a bell from a popular patrol boat, which was placed on wood that came from HMS "Victory", Admiral Nelson's vessel at the battle of Trafalgar.

Since then, the bell used in Rotary meetings started to represent, as on the ships, order, discipline and the time to guide us through the weekly hour and a half meetings. The bell informs us with its sound the beginning of the Rotary meeting, other club rituals and of course the closure of the regular club meeting.
